#### Slash:

- a.) Slash will be (in order of preference): chipped, lopped and scattered, or piled in a manner that will not impact man-made structures including but not limited to water tanks, water lines, irrigation ditches, roads, road borrow ditches, and water diversion structures.
- b.) Material extending three (3) feet or more outside the edge of a pile will be trimmed.
- c.) An eight (8) foot slash bay will be cleared of all but fine material around each machine pile and
- d.) When needed, an appropriate fire line will be cleared to mineral soil around the outer ring of the slash bay.
- e.) When lopped and scattered, all branches must be cut from main stem when main stem exceeds three (3) inches in diameter
- f.) Slash or chips must be spread to a height of not more than one (1) foot. Tree stems will be bucked, as necessary, to meet this height requirement and to avoid "jack-strawing" trees on top of one another.
- g.) All piles will be reasonably compact and free of soil to facilitate burning and will be constructed of such size and at such distance from trees so that burning will not result in unnecessary damage to residual timber.

#### Stump Height:

Stumps will be cut to a height of not more than 12 inches from the high side of the stump, unless approved in writing by the Agency Administrator Representative or their designee.



- Put more emphasis on eye-to-eye communication. Delivering messages or information orally is the best way to ensure a complete understanding of the material.
- What? Speak up! Most people need to speak louder.
- Question whether what you are saying is understandable or if it can it be made clearer.
   Many miscommunications are a result of vagueness or ambiguity.
- Listen to comments or questions co-workers may have.
- Giving correct answers to these questions often provides a greater sense of understanding and can increase productivity and dedication.

All fire personnel are susceptible to contracting COVID-19. ### Self-Awareness & Daily Health Screening

Separate yourself from others and notify your supervisor if you experience COVID-19 related symptoms (fever or chills, cough - more than expected, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea). Supervisors will use COVID precautions and facilitate COVID testing at the identified COVID testing locations.

#### Sanitary and Personal Hygiene Practices

Rigorous sanitary practices are important for reducing the transmission of infectious diseases. All personnel should cover their coughs and sneezes. Perform proper hand hygiene including handwashing or hand sanitizer use after touching potentially contaminated surfaces, removing face coverings, after using the restroom, and before eating or putting anything in their mouth.

# FIRELINE EMERGENCY 0800-1900 HRS (DURING OPERATIONAL HOURS)

- First person on scene is incident commander of the incident within an incident (IWI) until relieved by a more highly qualified person (HEQB, TFLD, DIVS, etc)
- IWI IC contacts Division Supervisor with nature of incident and location.
- IWI IC contacts:
  - 1. Dispatch ("Yreka") on Command (Black tone 1, 2 or 10)
  - 2. Closest incident medical resource (Line EMT/Medic/AMBU) on Command
- Dispatch notifies McKinney IC, who will notify:
  - 1. Medical Response
  - 2. Operations
  - 3. Safety
  - 4. Comps/Claims
  - 5. Agency Administrator
- Division Supervisor will support needs of the IWI.
- IWI IC will complete the Medical Incident Report (8 Line):
  - 1. Identify emergency: life threatening (red) or non-life threatening (yellow or green)
  - 2. Identify nature of emergency, # of patients, patient assessment
  - 3. Identify location, transport/evac possibilities
- Dispatch will mobilize ground and/or air ambulance as needed
  - 1. Contact incoming ground ambulance on CDF SKU Local tone 1 Channel 9
  - 2. Contact incoming air ambulance on CALCORD tone 6 Channel 15

# AFTER-HOURS EMERGENCY \_1900-0800 HRS

- Utilize 911 system to initiate medical response, **Identify yourself as a member** of the McKinney Fire.
- Contact your supervisor via phone with patient complaint/condition and location.
- The 911 dispatch will contact Cal-Fire Dispatch who will in turn contact McKinney IC.
