Leaders Intent Provide the highest level of customer service to all involved with or impacted by the McKinney Fire. Ensure transparent, timely and accurate communication at all levels of the incident and strengthen relationships with cooperators. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding: Personal safety and the safety of others, including driving slowly and defensively. Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work/rest cycles. Minimize risk and limit exposure to infectious disease by implementing Center of Disease Control, California Department of Public Health, and agency guidelines. Professional behavior, conduct, and timely/effective communication. **Management Objectives** Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process. Coordinate all public information with CAL FIRE and CIIMT 10 to provide timely and continuous information to affected agency partners, cooperators, and to the public. Coordinate suppression activities with assigned incident resource advisors to minimize impacts on natural and cultural resources. Implement fire suppression activities in accordance with the suppression repair plan and Incident Resource Advisors. Provide initial attack capability for the Klamath National Forest on the Oak Knoll and Scott River Ranger Districts. **Control Objectives** Keep the McKinney Fire: East of the Scott River Road to prevent further fire spread into the communities of Horse Creek, Steelhead and Scott Bar. South of the current fire perimeter along Hwy 96 and within the Beaver Creek Fire scar. West of Klamath River Road and Humbug Creek Road to prevent further fire spread into Yreka and the surrounding communities. North of Russel Peak and Schoolhouse Gap to prevent further fire spread into privately owned timberlands and the community of Fort Jones. Keep the George Fire: East of McCarthy Creek. **DISCUSSION:** Conditions will be similar to yesterday but a degree or two warmer. Otherwise, mostly sunny, dry, low RH, and unstable in the afternoon.

#### SATURDAY: DRY, WARM, LOW RH, WEST TO NORTHWEST AFTERNOON WINDS GUSTING TO 18 MPH

- WEATHER: Mostly sunny, warm and dry. Max temperatures a degree or two warmer than Friday. We remain unstable.
- WIND (EYE LEVEL): Sheltered and smoked in areas: Downslope/down valley 1-3 mph through 1400 then upslope 3-6 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: East to northeast 3-6 mph through 1100 then west to northwest 5 to 10 mph with gusts up to 18 mph.
- CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN: 0%.
- RAIN AMOUNTS: none.
- MAX TEMPERATURES: 92-96 bottom and clear areas, 78-83 highest ridgetops and smoked in areas.
- MIN RH: 13-20% bottom and clear areas, 20-30% top and smoked in areas.
- INVERSION: Weak mid-slope inversion and secondary inversion at 5,000 feet mixes out by 1200. Smoke inversion unlikely to
  mix out across smoked in areas.

#### SATURDAY NIGHT: DRY, MOSTLY CLEAR, LIGHT EAST WINDS.

- WEATHER: Dry and mostly clear.
- WIND (20 FT): Sheltered areas: Downslope/down valley 2-4 mph. Ridges, unsheltered areas, wind-aligned drainages: West to northwest 4-8 mph gusts to 15 mph through 2200, then becoming easterly 3 to 6 mph after midnight.
- CHANCE OF WETTING RAIN: 0%.

#### **OUTPUTS**

#### **FIRE BEHAVIOR**

#### GENERAL:

Winds similar to yesterday, but a few miles per hour stronger today. Fuels are still very dry, and the terrain is very steep. Winds will be out of the west to northwest. Interior islands will still burn but should not threaten most control lines. Divisions along the south and east sides will need to be very aware of the change in wind direction as it could push interior heat towards their lines. Make sure lookouts have a good view of the fire, especially since the residual smoke early in the day may limit visibility.

Should an interior green island or dirty burn area challenge the line, or a new start occurs, with these dry fuels, spotting will be problematic and should be short range (100-300 ft) rollout is possible. Spots from several torching trees on a ridgetop can spot 0.4 miles. The Probability of Ignition is 89%.

Expect single and group tree torching and sustained short duration crown runs where slope and winds align especially outside our current perimeter or new starts.

At night: Expect the fire to remain active until about midnight when the RH begins to recover.

#### SPECIFIC:

**Branch V:** No forward fire progression is expected. Portions Div Y and Z have had small areas of near the line recently. Expect islands near the line to burn out and there is a potential for reburn; either of which will challenge existing lines.

**Branch X:** No forward fire progression expected. Rollout will continue to be problematic and challenge any established lines.

**Branch XX:** No forward fire progression expected. North of the river there is a combination of grass fuels and heavy dead and down component from the 2014 Beaver Fire that will make any escape fire more resistant to control. Watch for slope and wind alignment on the Div P.

**IA:** With the state of the fuels, expect any new start to be resistant to control. For fire aligned with slope and wind, expect rapid rates of spread with a high potential for crown runs where dense canopies are present.

AIR OPERATIONS: Smoke may limit air operations in the early morning but will clear out by 0900.

#### SAFETY

Keep lookouts posted in places where they can see fuels and fire below crews, even in smoky conditions.

## Safety Message

#### Driving remains an extremely high hazard with a high risk outcome!

- Highway 96 still has a pilot car through the Klamath River community. Wait for the pilot car except in emergencies.
- o Assure there is sufficient room to safely turn your vehicle around within the solid road base.
- Use a backer when available otherwise walk the area that you plan to back-up in.
- Keep tires off soft edges of roadways.
- Drive with your lights. This makes your vehicle more visible to on coming traffic.
- Use a pilot vehicle when transporting with a lowboy and far enough ahead for others to react.
- o For narrow bridges wait for oncoming traffic to clear the bridge, be patient and wait your turn.
- Drive times to get around the incident are excessive. If you are feeling tired or sleepy, please pull over and take a SAFETY BREAK!

Rest your drivers prior to travel, especially at the end of shift ... Your Life Depends On It!

#### Heavy equipment usage is evolving as our mission shifts from suppression to repair!

- We are now using different machinery on the incident, requiring different safety actions near them. Know the safe
  distances to maintain, know the operators visual and hearing limits for that equipment and know how to safely
  approach and communicate with the operator.
- . There will be an increase in the need to transport heavy equipment on lowboys to new work sites.
- We are seeing an increase in loaded transports traveling through our travel routes to and from neighboring incidents as well as for Initial Attack.
- There are still chipping operations and falling operations on the incident. Use road guards as appropriate.

# COVID-19 PREVENTION INFORMATION MAINTAINING A HEALTHY WORKFORCE

from the COVID Advisor Team

All fire personnel are susceptible to contracting COVID-19. The health and well-being of all personnel must be a priority throughout the fire season. Mask use, social distancing, and good hygiene will support the health of fire personnel and are important ways to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and maintain the health of all fire personnel.

### Self-Awareness/ Daily Health Screening

Separate yourself from others and notify your supervisor if you experience COVID-19 related symptoms (fever or chills, cough – more than expected, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, muscle or body aches, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion or runny nose, nausea or vomiting, diarrhea). Supervisors will use COVID precautions and facilitate COVID testing at the identified COVID testing locations.

### COVID-19 Testing availability - (2) locations

McKinney Base Camp (430 E. Prather St.) - Adventure Medics

Klamath River Spike Camp (28017 Hwy 96) - Mountain Medics.

Priorities for testing will be for those with COVID-related symptoms and potential exposures to COVID-positive individuals.

Federal employees enrolled in the Screening Testing Program can also access the identified testing location to meet their testing requirements. Screening Testing is required weekly for federal employees in the program when the Community Levels are Medium or High.

## Sanitary and Personal Hygiene Practices

Rigorous sanitary practices are important for reducing the transmission of infectious diseases. All personnel should cover their coughs and sneezes. Perform proper hand hygiene including handwashing or hand sanitizer use after touching potentially contaminated surfaces, removing face coverings, after using the restroom, and before eating or putting anything in their mouth.

## Social Distancing and Mask Wearing

Individuals should practice and remind others of social distancing of at least six feet apart. When social distancing is not possible, masks use is recommended. **Modules should limit close contact with other resources to insulate their module from potential exposures**.

Current Community Level for Siskiyou County is Medium so mask wearing is optional unless social distancing cannot be maintained. Community Levels are updated weekly by CDC.

## The Five-D System for Effective Fireline Waterbars

To make effective waterbars, use the 5-D System: Distance, Diagonal, Divert, Discharge, and Dissipate.

**Distance**: Waterbars must be placed the proper distance apart, based on slope. This keeps the area that accumulates runoff small enough to prevent damage. The table below gives the maximum distance between waterbars, or between a waterbar and the next upslope drainage break.

**Diagonal**: Don't bully the flow, lead it. Waterbars built directly across a fireline tend to fail. Waterbars built diagonal to the fireline lead the water off and work better. A simple rule is to build them at 30 degrees off perpendicular (see the illustration below).


**Divert**: A good waterbar will divert the water off the fireline. To do this the waterbar must be deep enough to handle all the flow for as long as it's needed. Excavation is much better than fill in making a durable and effective waterbar (a ditch or a dip beats a dike).

**Discharge**: Another feature of a good waterbar is that it will discharge the flow. A good waterbar is not a dam, it must have an open outlet.

**Dissipate**: Finally, a good waterbar should dissipate the flow just below the outlet to exhaust its eroding power and cause it to filter into the soil. This may require placing slash, rock, or debris below the outlet.

### Specifications for Piling Slash

#### **Hand Pile Construction:**

- All activity generated and pre-existing fuels with a diameter between 1" and 8" shall be bucked to 4' or less and included in the hand piles. Exceptions include single logs that exhibit at least 50% decomposition.
- Hand piles shall be symmetrical, constructed neatly and compactly.
- Hand pile base shall **not** be constructed with material over 4", 4"< material will be stacked in the upper half of the pile.
- Slash that causes large air spaces in piles shall be cut to a minimum of 8"x 8" air spaces greater than 8"x8" are unacceptable.
- Material in piles shall be cut <4' per individual piece.
- Maximum piles size 6' in diameter and 6' in height and minimum pile size shall be 4' in diameter and 4' in height.
- Piles shall be distinct and separate from each other allowing at least 6' between each pile
- Piles shall be placed to limit scorch potential to leave trees, not in contact with leave trees and built up slope from leave trees when possible
- At least 50% of material in the lower third of the piles shall be composed of small diameter material and attached fines to create a kindling core.
- All piles shall be covered with Kraft type wax paper (wax side up).
- Pile covering sheet shall be placed to cover the bottom 2/3 of the pile and cover 50% of the surface area of the pile at this level. The remaining 1/3 of the pile shall be placed over the cover sheeting anchoring all four corners and the middle of the cover sheeting securely.
- No piles shall be built on, or in contact with any tree stumps >10" diameter.
- Piles created on downed logs, the log in contact with any pile shall be bucked to create a 4' separation in the log (to break the continuity and limit fire spread if the log should be ignited).
- logs over 8" diameter generated from thinning shall be limbed with limb wood added to piles, cut to 4' lengths and dispersed a minimum of 6' separation from downed logs, leave trees and stumps.
- In some units specific pile placement will be required to avoid damage to sensitive plant colonies, maps with exclusion areas will be included, the exclusion areas will be clearly marked and defined by the COR before work takes place.
   Any piles constructed in exlusion areas will be moved by the contractor.



## **Human Resource Message**

The following are some tips for a slow, safe withdrawal from fire line life.

- Your first evening at home, start a roaring fire in the fireplace, turn off all the lights, and read a comic book by flashlight. Partially shut the flue damper and have a little smoke back up into the house, enough that it stings your eyes a little bit.
- When it's time for bed, turn on all the lights in your room. Leave them on all night. Sprinkle some dirt and pine needles on your sheets. Put some rocks and your dirty socks beneath your pillow. When you get into bed, be sure you've still got your boots or shoes on. Wear the same clothes you've had on all day. If your bed is too comfortable, sleep in an old, dirty sleeping bag near the fireplace and/or as close to the kitchen a possible.
- Have a friend come over, have him use a bullhorn outside your bedroom all night, using
  phrases such as "Will the crew boss from San Carlos #6 report to plans?", "Ground
  Support report to the Logistics Chief immediately", and the perfunctory "Ops Chief to
  Communications ASAP!" Have him blow into the bullhorn at least two times before
  making each announcement.
- Have a couple of people who don't know you and have not been in your house before, wander in between 2 and 3 a.m. with huge red packs, pull out their sleeping bags, and sleep on the floor. Have them leave a radio on, switched on to one of the incident's tac channels all night.
- Lock the bathroom door. Arrange to have a porta-potty placed in your driveway. Have it
  delivered full, after being used by at least a couple of hundred people. Make sure the
  latch on the door doesn't work. Have someone open the door a couple times while you
  are using it. Make sure the porta-potty is placed somewhere very dark, and forget to
  bring your flashlight when you use it.
- Ask the person who delivers your paper to honk the car horn for you as early as possible

   preferably around 4 a.m.
- Acquire a taste for half melted 'energy bars', made mostly from sawdust.
- Wear a stuffed backpack all day at work; if it is too comfortable, put some rocks in it.
- At lunch time, take your sandwich outside and drop it in a flower bed. Retrieve it and stand beside a full garbage can while you eat it. Wash it down with a drink that's been in the car trunk all morning.
- Several times during the day, hit yourself in the shins with a hammer.
- During the day take a break by lying down in the dirt outside; if it is too comfortable, lay
  on a few rocks. Use your hard hat as a pillow by putting it in the crook of your neck,
  below the back of your head. It is preferable if you find a steep slope in the sun to lie
  down, steep enough that you have to plant your feet on some downhill boulders to
  keep from slipping down the slope.

#### FIRE SUPPRESSION REPAIR MESSAGE

Berms and push-piles should be spread to the extent feasible by back-blading with a tractor or with an excavator. Debris piled against standing timber should be pulled back while taking care not to damage growing stock with the tractor blade or an excavator bucket and thumb. At helispots, staging areas, and safety zones remove and/or breach berms so that runoff can be dissipated. Cross-drain these areas to effectively dissipate water as necessary.

Waterbreaks should be constructed at an approximately 45° angle at a minimum depth of 10" from the bottom of the cut to the top of the berm. Where possible, the discharge from the waterbreaks should be directed into vegetated areas to minimize erosive forces. Where dozerline or handline has crossed a watercourse, the channel should be cleared of soil and debris to re-establish the channel. Waterbreaks on handlines should be installed every 50' or closer as needed.

Waterbreak maximum spacing:	Grade	0-10%	11-25%	26-50%	>50%
	Spacing	0-200'	150'	100'	75'

Roads used in fire suppression activities should be left in at least as good a condition as they were found. Gravel and soil surface roads should be watered to prevent excessive dust formation. Where suppression activities have damaged or rendered road drainage facilities non-functional, waterbreaks or drivable drainage dips should be installed for drainage. Inside ditches damaged from suppression activities should be cleaned and left unobstructed.

If any archaeological resources are located during suppression repair activities, work will stop in that location and the Suppression Repair Lead will be notified.
