

# Safety Message



- Before undertaking each specific task in each specific location, conduct a risk: benefit analysis.
- Benefits must be tied to incident objectives:
  - o ensure firefighter/public safety
  - o maintain containment
  - o facilitate suppression repair
- Each action (or inaction) on a fire is potentially risky. Risk changes as conditions change. Assess whether benefits still outweigh risks based on changing conditions.

#### Sanitary and Personal Hygiene Practices

Rigorous sanitary practices are important for reducing the transmission of infectious diseases. All personnel should cover their coughs and sneezes. Perform proper hand hygiene including handwashing or hand sanitizer use after touching potentially contaminated surfaces, removing face coverings, after using the restroom, and before eating or putting anything in their mouth.
