WEATHER DISCUSSION: Marine layer influence will increase today and tonight with better RH recovery during the night and morning hours. This influence will also contribute to lower daytime temperatures along with subtle increases in daytime RH values through Tuesday. On Wednesday high pressure will begin to build again over the eastern Pacific leading to another warming and drying trend. This pattern will also promote a period of light easterly flow during the night and early morning hours...with typical westerly winds during the day.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR MONDAY:

WEATHER: Smoke in the morning, clearing Branch I by 1400 as west winds develop.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 77 - 82 degrees upper slopes and ridges. 24 HR Trend down 3-5 degrees.
87 - 92 degrees lower slopes and drainages. 24 HR Trend down 3-5 degrees.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 35-40% upper slopes and ridges **24 HR Trend** up 5%.
23-28% lower slopes and drainages. **24 HR Trend** up 5%.

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downcanyon / downslope 1-4 mph in the morning becoming Upcanyon / Upslope or west 5-10 mph with gusts 14 - 18 mph, stronger along the Trinity River near the Campbell fire.

RIDGETOP- Northeast 2-5 mph in the morning becoming West and Northwest 5-10 mph gusts to 15 mph during the afternoon hours.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Weak to moderate morning inversion around 2000 feet eroding by 1300-1400 hours.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR MONDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Much more moist in terms of recovery. Smoke and haze through sunset then smoke settling across the fire overnight and ICP toward morning.

MINIMUM TEMPERATURES: 58-64 thermal belts above 2000 ft. 52-56 lower slopes. **24 HR Trend:** down 3-5 degrees.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 55-60% mid and upper slopes. 75-85% lower slopes and along the river. **24 HR Trend:** 5-10% wetter

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upcanyon / Upslope 3-7 mph with gusts to 12 mph in the evening...becoming Downcanyon / downslope 1 to 4 mph after 2200.

RIDGETOP - Northwest 5-10 mph, becoming North and northeast 5 mph or less overnight.

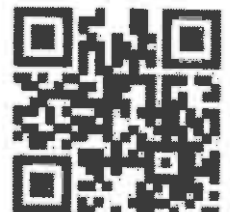
INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Smoke settling over the fire with a moderate nighttime inversion.

EXTENDED FORECAST Tuesday - Thursday: A cooling trend with increasing surface moisture is expected Tuesday and Wednesday with continued west winds. Less active burning and smoke will result in more sunshine in the afternoon hours. A ridge rebuilds Thursday through Friday with a warming and drying trend as 90s return with humidity to around 25% and poor nighttime recovery. No rain or thunderstorms in the forecast at this time. Long range outlook through the end of the month calls for above normal temperatures with little or no rain.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The inversion will continue to be a major player on influencing the fire behavior and movement of the fire. Any fire under the inversion will remain in the low to moderate category while any fire outside of the inversion will exhibit moderate to active fire behavior. Areas that remain outside of the inversion throughout the day will preheat enough and dry to support very active fire behavior with torching and spotting. Nighttime marine influence will limit fire behavior in lower slope positions, with dry air above the inversion/marine influence producing potential for active overnight fire behavior and spotting in upper slopes. These concerns are strongest in Branch III.

The fires are burning in areas with no recent fire history and significant dead and down, resulting in abundant surface fuels. The fires are situated near the confluence of the main stem Trinity River and the S. Fork of the Trinity River, which will influence wind channeling and subsequently fire behavior – watch for erratic and eddying winds near the confluence and large bends in the river canyons.

Ignition Receptiveness: Probability of Ignition 29% shaded 48% sunshine Night 16% Spotting ¼ mile

Dryness: Dead and down fuel moistures :1 hour – 7-10%, 10 hour– 10%, and 1000 hour– 11%.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I - Divisions K, L and M.

Interior fine fuels will continue to burn. In Division M and K control lines have sufficient depth to make interior activity unlikely to compromise control lines. In Div. L, expect southeast ward movement up to Horse Range ridge and the headwaters of Cedar Creek. Spotting across the ridge is a possibility today.

Branch III – Divisions U, W

Fire in Div. W and U will continue to consume fuel between current perimeter and planned control lines. The largest areas of remaining heat are from recent ignition operations. If portions of recent ignitions are above the inversion or if the inversion weakens, increases in activity are possible and could challenge control lines. Spotting distances of up to ¼ mile are possible. The high portions of these divisions are most likely to be impacted by NW winds and the dry air above the nighttime inversion. Afternoon winds from the NW will be favorable for the west side.

Night: Early on in the shift expect to see active fire behavior especially in the interior and in Division L area. Watch for any spotting that may have occurred throughout the day but went unnoticed in the Horse Range drainage. Activity should moderate around 0300 hours.

AIR OPERATIONS:

The inversion will limit air morning operations, during the afternoon hours air operations should not be limited.

SAFETY

To reduce the risk: Post lookouts, check communications, back off if you have doubts about your escape routes or safety zones or if the situation becomes too complex.





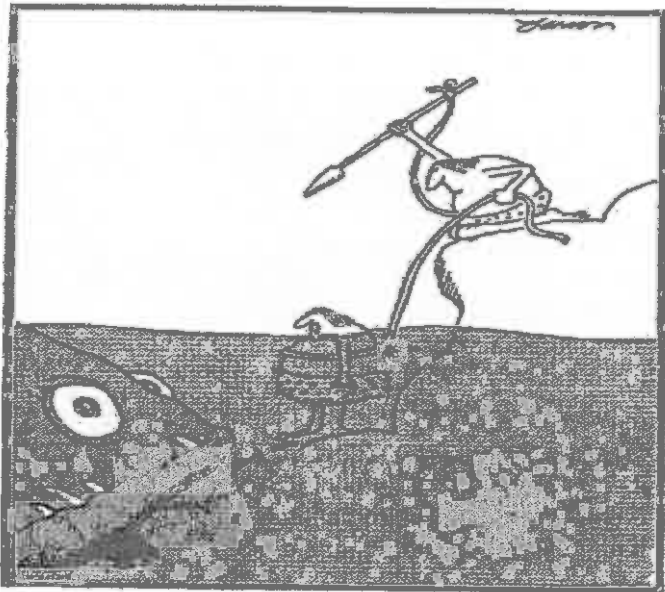

Major Hazard and Risk:

- **Hazard Tree Safety:** Hazard trees, both dead snags and live green trees, are one of the most common risks encountered on the fireline. All firefighters should frequently survey their work area for potential hazards trees. **This includes your sleeping areas in camp! IRPG pg. 20**
- **Extended Extraction Times:** Be familiar with the medical plan. Develop a plan on how you would get an injured firefighter out timely. Factor in how smoke inversions will reduce the likelihood of utilizing helicopters for a medevac.
- **Hazardous Roads:** Narrow roads, steep drop offs, erratic drivers, and operator fatigue are all prevalent on this and other assignments. Watch out!
- **Heat Related Injuries:** Stay hydrated, eat properly, drink fluids in a 3:1 ratio of water to sports drink, take frequent breaks, and pay attention to your body.

Unplanned Public Interaction--Hunting season

Even though the forest is closed be aware that hunters may be in your area. Be prepared to positively interact with them and explain the dangers of being in the area. Ask them to leave the area for their own safety.

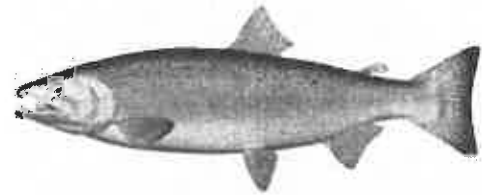

SRF Lightning Complex Incident: Resource Advisor Message

Fish Screens: Coho Salmon Critical Habitat

The Trinity River and tributaries are considered critical habitat for threatened Coho salmon, an anadromous fish (fish born in freshwater who spend most of their lives in saltwater and return to freshwater to spawn). Please ensure that any Mark 3 and Engine/Tender suction hoses have a fish screen attached when drafting. Fish screens are designed to minimize stress, injury or even death during the drawing and application process. Talk to a READ if you need a screen.



Port Orford Cedar Root Disease: NO DRAFTING East Fork and Boise Creek CGs!!!

Some local drainages are infected with POC Root disease, which is a root rotting disease that spreads via water and mud. Infested waters within the fire perimeter include: the main stem of Willow Creek and small creeks to the north up to Hoopa, south side of Willow Creek (includes area in **Boise Creek Campground**) in East Fork of Willow Creek (includes area in **East Fork Campground**) and in most of the tributaries. **DO NOT DRAFT from East Fork Campground OR Boise Creek Campground.**

IMPORTANT: Yellow/Black Striped flagging indicates resource AVOIDANCE areas.

- **Invasive Plant Species – PLEASE USE WEED WASH**



The area in and around the Lightning Complex, are home to many sensitive species. Infestations of highly invasive plant species, like yellow star thistle, are one of the largest threats to sensitive species populations here. Spread via vehicles and foot traffic as well as re-activation via fire is of high concern. To help protect these sensitive places, do not park in and try to avoid flagged areas. **Make sure to visit the WEED WASH at Check-In to the incident and demob.** Located on Hwy 96 just past the Ranger Station.

- **Cultural Resources:**

There is a potential that undocumented cultural resources will be encountered while fighting fire. It is important when a potential cultural resource is encountered that they are not disturbed in any manner.

GPS its location and take a photo, but do not remove or collect anything. Findings of cultural resources should not be reported over the radio. Work with your division to notify a resource advisor for recommendations on how to proceed.
