



CRITICALLY HOT AND DRY CONDITIONS EXPECTED THIS AFTERNOON

WEATHER DISCUSSION: An area of weak high pressure will build over the region bringing temperatures to just above normal values. Expecting a slight increase in temperatures in comparison to Wednesday with lowlands near 100°, and mid and high elevations around 85-90°. A drying trend will also take place with afternoon humidity around 25% in the lowlands and near 30% above 3500 ft. At night will see some recovery with humidity bouncing back in the mid and upper slopes with a larger recovery in the valleys. The easterly wind should hold on into the late morning making smoke problematic at helibase through early afternoon until the northwesterly wind reversal.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR THURSDAY:

WEATHER: Smoke in the morning, clearing after 1400 with the westerly wind transition.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 88-96 degrees upper slopes and ridges. **24 HR Trend:** up 2-5°. 93-100 degrees lower slopes and drainages. **24 HR Trend:** up 4-6°.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 20-27% upper slopes and ridges **24 HR Trend** down 10%. 18-24% lower slopes and drainages. **24 HR Trend** down 3-5%.

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downcanyon / downslope 1-5 mph in the morning becoming west to northwest in the afternoon. Winds around 5- 7 mph, with gusts up to 15 mph in the late afternoon – especially along NW-SE drainages.

RIDGETOP- Northeast 2-5 mph in the morning becoming west to northwest 5-10 mph gusts to 15 mph during the afternoon hours. Could see northeasterly winds persist into the mid to late morning.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Weak to moderate morning inversion around 3000 feet eroding by 1400 hours.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR THURSDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Smoke and haze through sunset then smoke settling across the fire overnight and ICP toward morning.

MINIMUM TEMPERATURES: 58-64 thermal belts above 3500 ft. 55-58 lower slopes. **24 HR Trend:** minimal change.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 55-62% mid and upper slopes. 71-78% lower slopes and along the river. **24 HR Trend:** 2-4% drier

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upcanyon / Upslope 3-7 mph with gusts to 12 mph in the evening...becoming Downcanyon / downslope 1 to 4 mph after 0000.

RIDGETOP - Northwest 5-10 mph, becoming north to northeast less than 5 mph overnight.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Smoke settling over the fire and ICP with a moderate nighttime inversion.

EXTENDED FORECAST FRIDAY - SUNDAY: Recent forecast is trending slightly cooler on Friday than previously thought, but still some uncertainty. Saturday will bring a weak disturbance which will increase onshore flow and a return of a marine layer through Sunday. Will see an increase in humidity by 10% or more on Saturday and Sunday when compared to Friday.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Warming and drying will once again become a problem as the fuels dry increasing fire behavior after the inversion breaks. Watch for solar radiation to preheat the fuels and help dry them causing an increase in fire behavior. Expect low to moderate fire behavior under the inversion. Once the inversion lifts fire behavior will increase to very active to extreme. Nighttime recovery will influence fire behavior in lower slope positions, with dry air above the inversion producing potential for moderate overnight fire behavior in upper slopes. These concerns are strongest in Branch III. The fires are burning in areas with no recent fire history and significant dead and down, resulting in abundant surface fuels. The fires are situated near the confluence of the main stem Trinity River and the S. Fork of the Trinity River, which will influence wind channeling and subsequently fire behavior – watch for erratic and eddying winds near the confluence and large bends in the river canyons.

Ignition Receptiveness: Probability of Ignition 42% shaded 79% sunshine Night 13% Spotting ¼ - ½ mile

Dryness: Dead and down fuel moistures :1 hour – 5-8%, 10 hour– 12%, and 1000 hour– 11%.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I - Divisions K, L and M.

Interior fine fuels will continue to burn. In Division M and K control lines have sufficient depth to make interior activity unlikely to compromise control lines. In Div. L, fire will continue to move upslope towards Lone Pine Ridge. Spotting can be expected on top of the lone Pine Ridge. The head will keep moving southeast into Prairie Creek and setup for a slope reversal in Cedar Creek.

Branch III – Divisions U, W

Fire in Div. W and U will continue to consume fuel between current perimeter and planned control lines. If portions are above the inversion or if the inversion weakens, increases in activity are possible and could challenge control lines. The high portions of these divisions are most likely to be impacted by NW winds and the dry air above the nighttime inversion. Afternoon winds from the NW will be favorable for the west side.

Night: Early on in the shift expect to see active fire behavior especially in the interior and in Division L area. Watch for any spotting that may have occurred throughout the day but went unnoticed in the Horse Range drainage. Activity should moderate around 2400 hours.

AIR OPERATIONS:

The inversion will limit air morning operations, during the afternoon hours air operations should not be limited.

SAFETY

LCES is a self-triggering mechanism. Lookouts assess, and reassess, the fire environment and Communicate threats of safety to firefighters. Firefighters use Escape routes to move to Safety zones.

- **Extended Extraction Times:** Be familiar with the medical plan. Develop a plan on how you would get an injured firefighter out timely. Factor in how smoke inversions will reduce the likelihood of utilizing helicopters for a medevac.
- **Hazardous Roads:** Narrow roads, steep drop offs, erratic drivers, and operator fatigue are all prevalent on this and other assignments. Watch out!

Heat Related Injuries

Stay hydrated, eat properly, drink fluids in a 3:1 ratio of water to sports drink, take frequent breaks, and pay attention to your body.

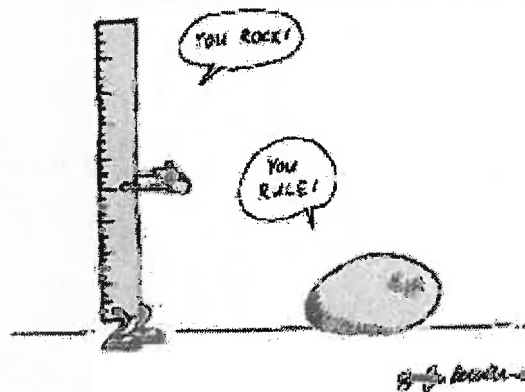

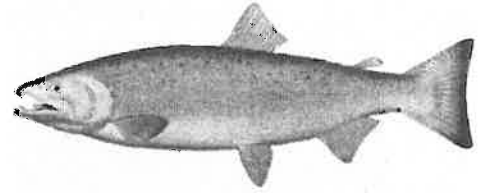

Fish Screens: Coho Salmon Critical Habitat

The Trinity River and tributaries are considered critical habitat for threatened Coho salmon, an anadromous fish (fish born in freshwater who spend most of their lives in saltwater and return to freshwater to spawn). Please ensure that any Mark 3 and Engine/Tender suction hoses have a fish screen attached when drafting. Fish screens are designed to minimize stress, injury or even death during the drawing and application process. Talk to a READ if you need a screen.

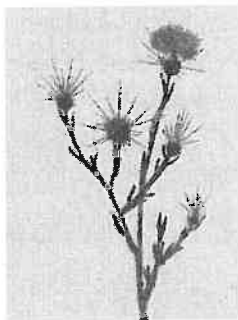


Port Orford Cedar Root Disease: NO DRAFTING East Fork and Boise Creek CGs!!!

Some local drainages are infected with POC Root disease, which is a root rotting disease that spreads via water and mud. Infested waters within the fire perimeter include: the main stem of Willow Creek and small creeks to the north up to Hoopa, south side of Willow Creek (includes area in **Boise Creek Campground**) in East Fork of Willow Creek (includes area in **East Fork Campground**) and in most of the tributaries. **DO NOT DRAFT from East Fork Campground OR Boise Creek Campground.**

IMPORTANT: Yellow/Black Striped flagging indicates resource **AVOIDANCE** areas.

- **Invasive Plant Species – PLEASE USE WEED WASH**



The area in and around the Lightning Complex, are home to many sensitive species. Infestations of highly invasive plant species, like yellow star thistle, are one of the largest threats to sensitive species populations here. Spread via vehicles and foot traffic as well as re-activation via fire is of high concern. To help protect these sensitive places, do not park in and try to avoid flagged areas. **Make sure to visit the WEED WASH at Check-In to the incident and demob.**

Cultural Resources:

There is a potential that undocumented cultural resources will be encountered while fighting fire. It is important when a potential cultural resource is encountered that they are not disturbed in any manner. GPS its location and take a photo, but do not remove or collect anything. Findings of cultural resources should not be reported over the radio. Work with your division to notify a resource advisor for recommendations on how to proceed.

7. CONTINGENCY: Considerations: *If primary options fail, what actions can be implemented in conjunction with primary evacuation method? Be thinking ahead.*

8. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: *Updates/Changes, etc.*

REMEMBER: Confirm ETA's of resources ordered. Act according to your level of training. Be Alert - Keep Calm - Think Clearly - Act Decisively
