

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The high pressure that brought warm temperatures yesterday will weaken as an upper trough and associated marine push approaches the fire area. Expect temperatures to lower by a few degrees, and humidity to rise slightly. Very dense smoke is expected this morning and will likely persist through midday which will limit air operations. A weak cold front will approach from the Pacific tonight causing winds to become westerly with elevated recoveries, especially below the inversion layer. Above the inversion, humidity will not rebound nearly as much but will be much higher than last night. Breezier westerly winds and gusts will be slightly stronger along the highest ridges and peaks during the evening and overnight hours.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR FRIDAY:

WEATHER: Dense smoke in the morning under the inversion, clearing after 1400 PDT with the westerly wind transition.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 82-88 degrees upper slopes and ridges. **24 HR Trend:** down 2-5°.
88-92 degrees lower slopes and drainages. **24 HR Trend:** down 2-5°.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 30-38% upper slopes and ridges **24 HR Trend** up 5-8%.
25-32% lower slopes and drainages. **24 HR Trend** up 3-5%.

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downcanyon / downslope 1-5 mph through the early afternoon becoming upslope 3-7 mph with gusts up to 15 mph in the early evening.

RIDGETOP- Northeast 2-5 mph through the late morning becoming west to northwest 5-10 mph gusts to 15 mph during the afternoon hours. Peaks above 4000 ft may see gusts to 20 mph after 1800.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Weak to moderate morning inversion around 3000 feet eroding by 1400-1500 hours.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR FRIDAY NIGHT:

WEATHER: Smoke and haze through sunset then smoke settling across the fire overnight and ICP toward morning.

MINIMUM TEMPERATURES: 58-64 thermal belts above 3500 ft. 55-58 lower slopes. **24 HR Trend:** minimal change.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 55-62% mid and upper slopes. 76-81% lower slopes and along the river. **24 HR Trend:** 2-4% higher.

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - Upcanyon / Upslope 3-7 mph with gusts to 12 mph in the evening becoming Downcanyon / downslope 2 to 5 mph after 0000.

RIDGETOP - Northwest 5-10 mph with gusts up to 15 mph through 0200, becoming north to northeast 3-6 mph late.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Smoke settling over the fire and ICP with a moderate nighttime inversion around 3000 ft.

EXTENDED FORECAST SATURDAY-MONDAY: A weak cold front will bring a marine influence to the fire area. While not overly strong this trough will promote a steady increase in humidity on Saturday and Sunday before slowly decreasing Sunday afternoon. Temperatures will drop from Friday's highs with Saturday being the coolest day of the next week. Not expecting any precipitation or severe weather with this cold front.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Fuels will be dry enough to support active fire behavior after the inversion lifts. Expect low to moderate fire behavior under the inversion. Once the inversion lifts fire behavior will increase too moderate to active. Nighttime recovery will influence fire behavior in lower slope positions, with dry air above the inversion producing potential for moderate overnight fire behavior in upper slopes. These concerns are strongest in Branch X.

The fires are burning in areas with no recent fire history and significant dead and down, resulting in abundant surface fuels. The fires are situated near the confluence of the main stem Trinity River and the S. Fork of the Trinity River, which will influence wind channeling and subsequently fire behavior – watch for erratic and eddying winds near the confluence and large bends in the river canyons.

Ignition Receptiveness: Probability of Ignition 30% shaded 58% sunshine Night 13% Spotting ¼ - ½ mile

Dryness: Dead and down fuel moistures :1 hour – 6-10%, 10 hour– 12%, and 1000 hour– 11%.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I - Divisions G, N and R.

Interior fine fuels will continue to burn. In Division R, G and D control lines have sufficient depth to make interior activity unlikely to compromise control lines. In Div. N, fire will continue to move upslope towards Lone Pine Ridge. Spotting can be expected on top of the lone Pine Ridge. The head will keep moving southeast into Groves Prairie.

Branch X – Divisions U, W

Fire in Div. W and U will continue to consume fuel between current perimeter and planned control lines. If portions are above the inversion or if the inversion weakens, increases in activity are possible and could challenge control lines. The high portions of these divisions are most likely to be impacted by NW winds and the dry air above the nighttime inversion. Afternoon winds from the NW will be favorable for the west side.

Night: Early on in the shift expect to see active fire behavior especially in the interior and in Division N area. Watch for any spotting that may have occurred throughout the day but went unnoticed in the Horse Range drainage. Activity should moderate around 2400 hours.

AIR OPERATIONS:

The inversion will limit morning air operations, during the afternoon hours air operations should not be limited.

SAFETY

To reduce the risk: Post lookouts, check communications, back off if you have doubts about your escape routes or safety zones or if the situation becomes too complex.

- **Heat Related Injuries:** Stay hydrated, eat properly, drink fluids in a 3:1 ratio of water to sports drink, take frequent breaks, and pay attention to your body.

- ✓ Adhere to posted speed limits and reduce speeds based on road conditions
- ✓ Stay alert, avoid distractions, ensure all passengers are buckled in

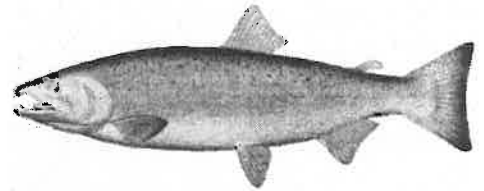

Fish Screens: Coho Salmon Critical Habitat

The Trinity River and tributaries are considered critical habitat for threatened Coho salmon, an anadromous fish (fish born in freshwater who spend most of their lives in saltwater and return to freshwater to spawn). Please ensure that any Mark 3 and Engine/Tender suction hoses have a fish screen attached when drafting. Fish screens are designed to minimize stress, injury or even death during the drawing and application process. Talk to a READ if you need a screen.



Port Orford Cedar Root Disease: NO DRAFTING East Fork and Boise Creek CGs!!!

Some local drainages are infected with POC Root disease, which is a root rotting disease that spreads via water and mud. Infested waters within the fire perimeter include: the main stem of Willow Creek and small creeks to the north up to Hoopa, south side of Willow Creek (includes area in **Boise Creek Campground**) in East Fork of Willow Creek (includes area in **East Fork Campground**) and in most of the tributaries. **DO NOT DRAFT from East Fork Campground OR Boise Creek Campground.**

IMPORTANT: Yellow/Black Striped flagging indicates resource AVOIDANCE areas.

- **Invasive Plant Species – PLEASE USE WEED WASH**



The area in and around the Lightning Complex, are home to many sensitive species. Infestations of highly invasive plant species, like yellow star thistle, are one of the largest threats to sensitive species populations here. Spread via vehicles and foot traffic as well as re-activation via fire is of high concern. To help protect these sensitive places, do not park in and try to avoid flagged areas. **Make sure to visit the WEED WASH at check-in to the incident and demob, located at ground support.**

Cultural Resources:

There is a potential that undocumented cultural resources will be encountered while fighting fire. It is important when a potential cultural resource is encountered that they are not disturbed in any manner. GPS its location and take a photo, but do not remove or collect anything. Findings of cultural resources should not be reported over the radio. Work with your division to notify a resource advisor for recommendations on how to proceed.
