...Critically Dry and Moderately Unstable Today and Tonight...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure remains over the fire area keeping conditions dry with a little more instability than yesterday. The dry airmass will continue to mix down to the surface thus limiting recoveries. Will continue to see a moderate inversion layer forming this morning and persisting until after 1300. Winds will remain southeast overnight, becoming northwest this afternoon. Smoke will persist and will remain moderate to heavy in the morning below the inversion...improving this afternoon into evening. Expecting critically low humidity with better mixing possible today...especially along the upper slopes and ridges.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY (TUESDAY):

WEATHER: Sunny, but smoky. Moderate to heavy smoke below 2000 ft.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 81-88 degrees upper slopes and ridges. **24 HR Trend:** Up 1-3.
88-98 degrees lower slopes and drainages. **24 HR Trend:** Up 1-3.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 20-25% upper slopes and ridges **24 HR Trend** down 2-4.
17 - 23% lower slopes and drainages. **24 HR Trend** minimal change.

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - Very light east wind early...becoming west or upslope 5-7 mph with gusts to 12 mph around 1200 PDT.

RIDGETOP- Very light south and southeast wind early...becoming west to northwest 3-5 mph increasing to 5-7 mph with gusts to 12 mph around 1200 PDT.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Moderate inversion around 3000 feet eroding by 1300-1400 hours.

SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND: South-southeast 15 mph.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TONIGHT (TUESDAY NIGHT):

WEATHER: Haze through sunset then smoke settling across the fire overnight and ICP toward morning.

MINIMUM TEMPERATURES: 57-62 thermal belts above 3500 ft. 55-60 lower slopes. **24 HR Trend:** minimal change.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 50-60% mid and upper slopes. 65-75% lower slopes and along the river. **24 HR Trend:** minimal change.

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - West-northwest winds 7-10 mph along the ridges, diminishing to southeast 2-5 mph after 2200.

RIDGETOP - Northwest 5-10 mph with gusts up to 15 mph through 0200, diminishing to east 3-6 mph late.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Smoke settling over the fire and ICP with a moderate nighttime inversion around 3000 ft.

EXTENDED FORECAST WEDNESDAY-FRIDAY: Minimal change in the forecast as the high pressure ridge remains nearly stationary over the fire area through Wednesday. Will continue to see low humidity during the day, and poor recoveries overnight through Thursday morning. The smoke inversion will be the main driver of weather on Wednesday. Cooler and slightly moister conditions expected through Friday with increased recoveries and more persistent northwest wind.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Fine dead fuel moistures are expected to drop to the lowest level that we have seen on the fire to date. The potential exists for very active to extreme fire behavior if the inversion breaks. Sunshine on the fuel bed will be the driving factor to the fire behavior today. Spotting is a very real possibility today with any torching near the lines. Rollouts will be a problem. The fires are burning in areas with no recent fire history and significant dead and down, resulting in abundant surface fuels. The fires are situated near the confluence of the main stem Trinity River and the S. Fork of the Trinity River, which will influence wind channeling and subsequently fire behavior – watch for erratic and eddying winds near the confluence and large bends in the river canyons.

Ignition Receptiveness: Probability of Ignition 46% shaded 86% sunshine Night 13% Spotting ¼ - ½ mile

Dryness: Dead and down fuel moistures :1 hour – 3-7%, 10 hour– 8%, and 1000 hour– 12%.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I - Divisions A, D, G, N and R.

Creeping and smoldering in Division A and D control lines have sufficient depth to make interior activity unlikely to compromise control lines. In Div. N, fire will continue to move upslope towards Lone Pine Ridge. Spotting can be expected on top of the Lone Pine Ridge. Division R the head will keep moving south spotting to the southeast. Division G fire will continue moving west and northwest, watch for morning spotting.

Branch X – Divisions U, W

Fire in Div. W and U No perimeter growth is expected. Spotting outside of the line continues to be viable but to a lesser extent with the predicated probability of ignition. Creeping and smoldering.

Night: Early on in the shift expect to see active fire behavior especially in the interior and in Division N area. Watch for any spotting that may have occurred throughout the day but went unnoticed in the Horse Range drainage. Activity should moderate around 2400 hours.

AIR OPERATIONS:

The inversion will limit air morning operations, during the afternoon hours air operations should not be limited.



Flame lengths of 8-11 feet: fires may present serious control problems-torching out, crowning, and spotting. Control efforts at the head of the fire will probably be ineffective.

Flame lengths greater than 11 feet: crowning, spotting, and major runs are common. Control efforts at the head of the fire are ineffective.




- **Extended Extraction Times:** Be familiar with the medical plan. Develop a plan on how you would get an injured firefighter out timely. Factor in how smoke inversions will reduce the likelihood of utilizing helicopters for a medevac.
- **Hazard Tree Safety:** Hazard trees, both dead snags and live green trees, are one of the most common risks encountered on the fireline. All firefighters should frequently survey their work area for potential hazards trees. **This includes your sleeping areas in camp!**

Review the 8 line, medical incident report, on the back of your IAP. Take the time to talk through scenarios from injury, 8 line, transport, hospital, and then back to health.

Maintain situational awareness, and don't be this guy

STAGE 1 Fire Suppression Repair Cheat Sheet

Remember, if you have any doubts or questions about the ideal end state of these repairs, get in touch with a READ!

Overall Objective: Repair damage caused by suppression activities, and thus minimize short and long-term environmental impacts. Impacts caused by the direct effects of fire will be mitigated or corrected during this repair phase, only those impacts caused by the suppression of the fire.

General Guidelines for Stage 1 Repair (consult signed Suppression Repair Plan (SR Plan))

Dozer and Hand Lines:

- Construct water bars and/or rolling dips where access is no longer needed and erosion is a concern. Knock down berms into the fire line. (see SR Plan page 13)
- Firelines that cross draws/channels will be cleaned of debris and re-contoured (see SR Plan page 15)
- Remove suppression created fuels and logs from firelines via chipping, piling, lop & scatter, and decking, advised.
- Trench handlines should be pulled back and contoured.
- Obliterate hand lines where they intersect FS trails.
- Strategic firelines intended for future use should have suppression general debris chipped and little to no debris or brush scattered over them. Only pile after all other repair activities are complete.

Fireline slope %	Maximum Distance Apart (feet)
1 – 5	200
6 – 20	125
21 – 40	60
41 – 60	40
>60	25

Safety Zones, Drop Points, Helispots, Sling Sites, Staging Areas, etc:

- Restore to pre-existing condition.
- Knock down berms, de-compact soil, and restore natural drainage flows.
- Only pull enough slash across the area to reduce erosion and prevent further impacts.
- Chip and pile debris, as advised.

Roads and Trails:

- Clean ditches, side drains, rolling dips, and other drainage features along roads damaged by suppression activities (see SR Plan page 14).
- Where needed, water and grade surfaces and remove berms along roads impacted by suppression activities.
- Chip side-cast slash on roads, construct slash piles, lop and scatter, or deck logs, as advised.
- Repair damaged earthen barriers for Maintenance Level 1, decommissioned, and non-system roads (see SR Plan page 16).

Miscellaneous Resources:

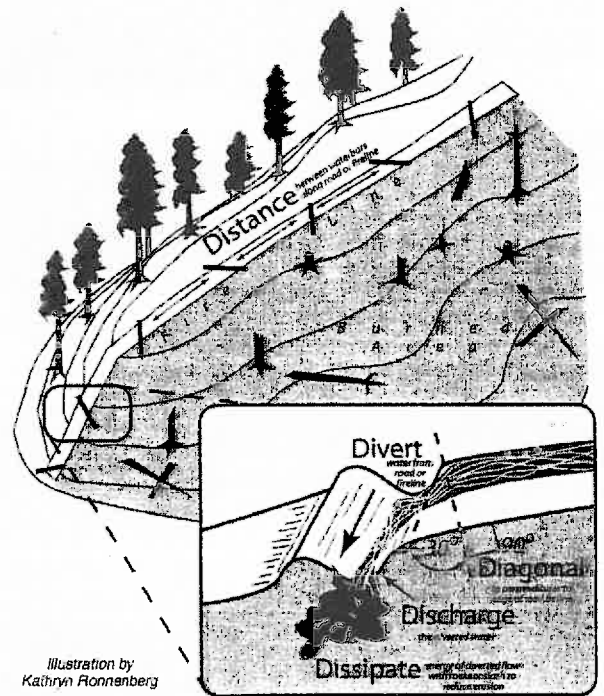
- Maintain the integrity of Wilderness, Inventoried Roadless Areas and Wild and Scenic River Corridor characteristics
- **SITES WITH YELLOW/BLACK FLAGGING:** *Sites: No repair work may commence without consultation with an assigned Archaeologist and the Hoopa Tribal Representative, and/or and the lead Resource Advisor to the fire.*
- Remove all equipment, gear, hose, flagging, and trash from firelines and dispersal sites following repair actions.

Fences and Gates:

- Repair any fences and gates damaged by suppression activities.

Water Sources:

- Remove dams, dikes, and other impoundments.
- Restore damaged stream banks to natural contours.
- Report fuel and oil spills.

Exposure to Wildland Fire Smoke – Health Risks

Wildland fire smoke contains a mixture of harmful particles and gases and are known to cause adverse health outcomes and can potentially impair your performance.

What is in Smoke? What can happen from short-term exposures?

Carbon Monoxide (CO) –

- Higher concentration in closer proximities to the combustion source
- Moderate exposure can lead to shortness of breath and headaches
- High levels of CO can lead to headaches, confusion, and a person collapsing on exertion

Particulate Matter (PM) –

- Particles that are small and can be inhaled into the deeper parts of the lungs
- Can carry toxic gases into the lungs and bloodstream
- Short-term exposure can cause airway distress and irritation that can lead to shortness of breath, coughing and a sore throat

Health Risk - what can happen from long term exposure?

Research assessing smoke exposure and health risks suggests that wildland firefighters may:

- Have a higher risk for lung cancer and cardiovascular disease from career exposures
- Experience decreases lung function across single shifts and over fire seasons
- Have increased inflammation, which can be associated with cardiovascular and other chronic diseases, and possibly the development of cancer

Reducing Exposure to Smoke - Mitigation Strategies

- Mop-up – when conditions allow, mop-up enough to secure line
- Holding – in areas of high smoke and low visibility, use patrols rather than standing directly in smoke
- Firing - Use firing patterns that will produce more heat to result in more complete combustion and less PM

There is no easy way to reduce exposure to smoke, it is part of the wildland fire environment. However, we should continue to discuss strategies to reduce exposure. Small reductions in levels of smoke or the duration of exposure over a career may reduce health impacts.

Current Research

Join UC Berkeley and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (CDC/NIOSH) as we conduct a rigorous scientific study to assess worker wellbeing, risk perception on health and environmental exposures, and occupational hazards for Federal wildland firefighters. You will be asked to complete an initial survey and a short survey each day while on a fire assignment. The findings will be used to provide information and insight as programs are developed and mitigation strategies established for line-of-duty environmental hazards and firefighters' mental health required by the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.

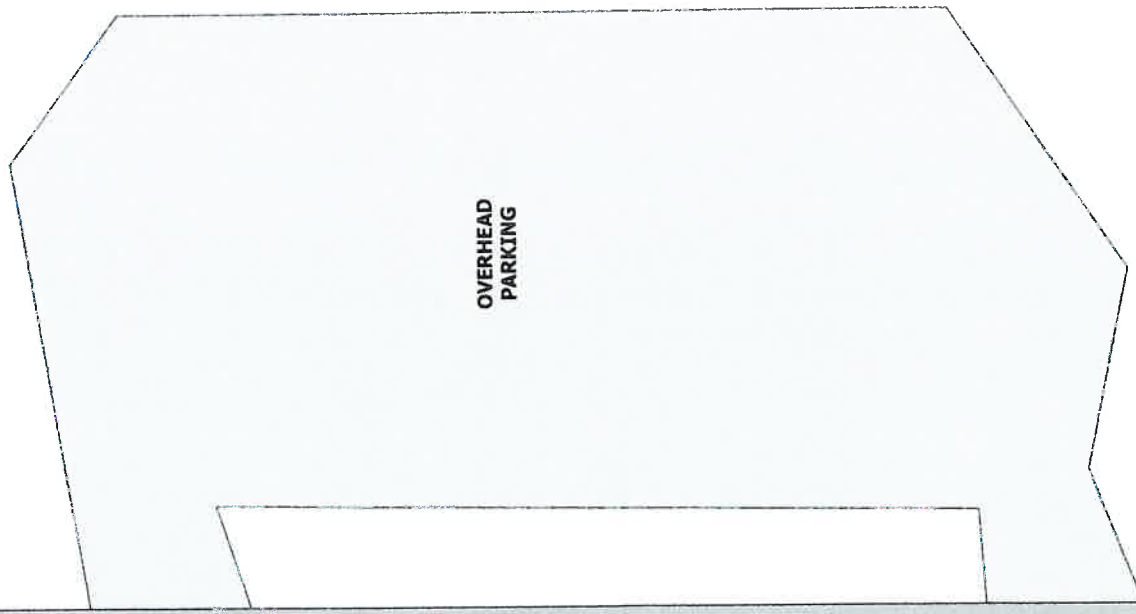

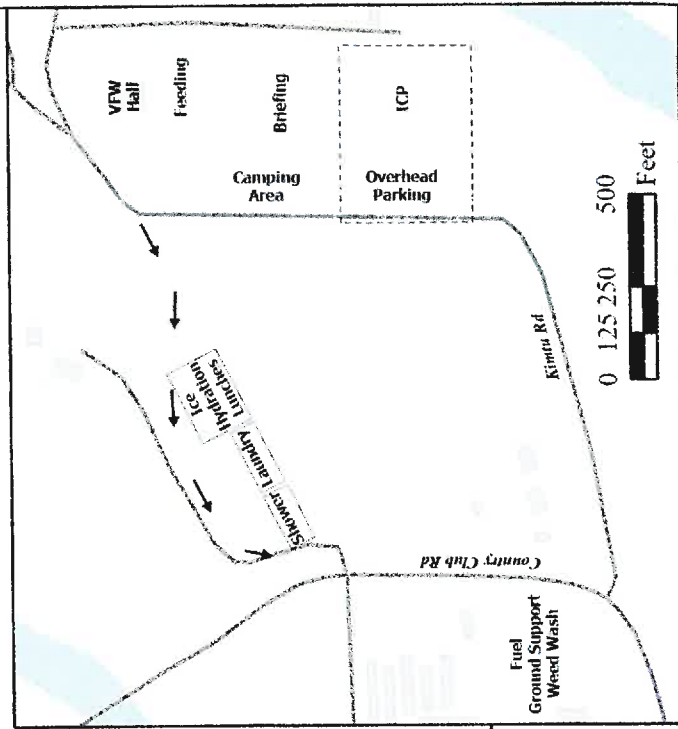

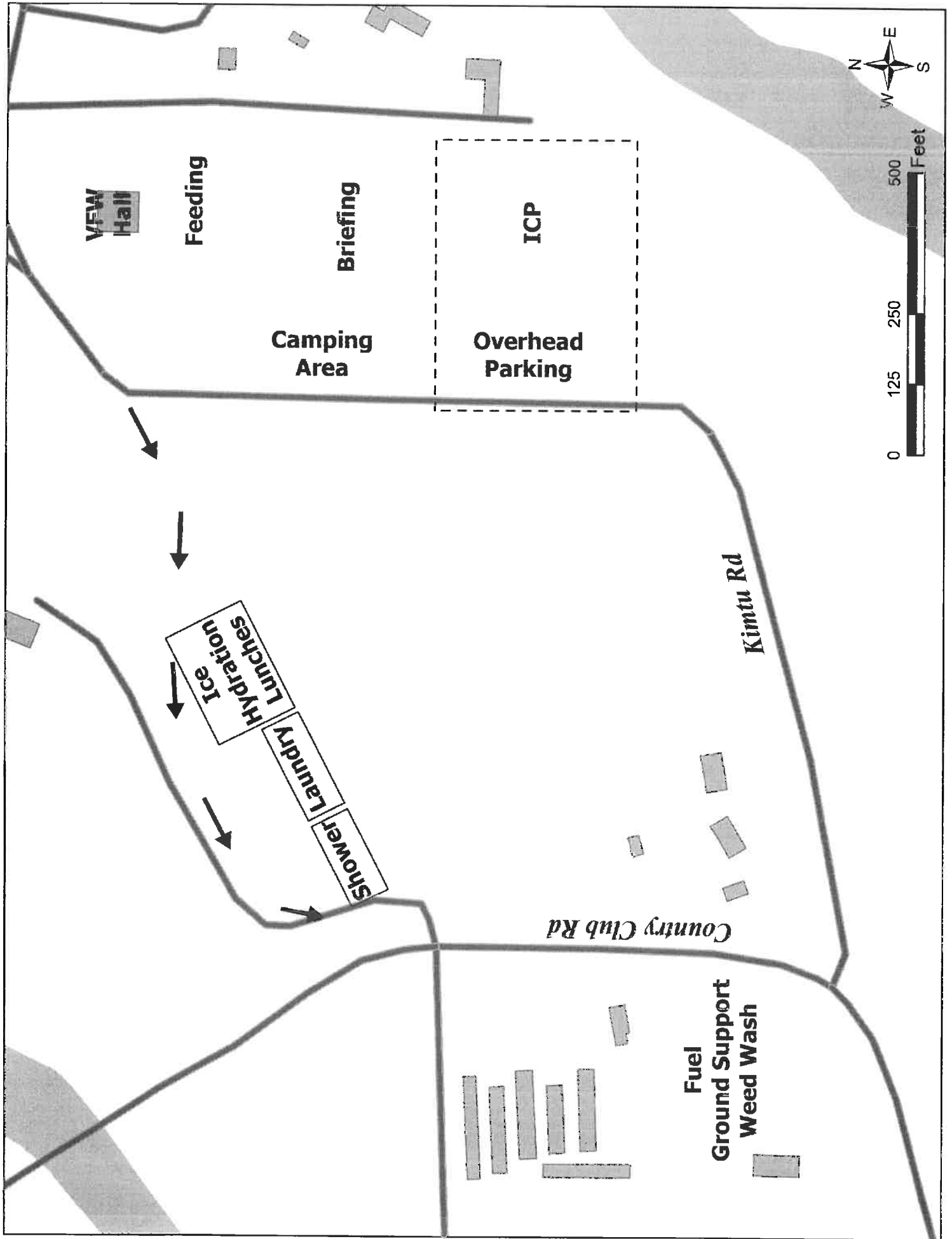
