

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The current ridge of high pressure will gradually intensify over the next 5 days maintaining the very warm, dry and stable conditions. The typical wind pattern will remain consistent...thus the day to day sway of smoke from east to west will also continue while remaining moderate, and heavy at times. Daytime and nighttime RH values will improve slightly beginning Thursday night.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY (THURSDAY):

WEATHER: Sunny, but smoky. Moderate to heavy smoke below 2000 ft.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 82-89 degrees upper slopes and ridges. **24 HR Trend:** minimal change.
92-99 degrees lower slopes and drainages. **24 HR Trend:** minimal change.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 21-25% upper slopes and ridges. **24 HR Trend** down 1-2 %.
17-23% lower slopes and drainages. **24 HR Trend** minimal change.

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - Very light east wind early...becoming west or upslope 5-7 mph with gusts to 12 mph around 1200 PDT.

RIDGETOP- Very light south and southeast wind early...becoming west to northwest 3-5 mph increasing to 5-7 mph with gusts to 12 mph around 1200 PDT.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Moderate inversion around 3000 feet eroding by 1300-1400 hours.

SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND: South-southeast 15 mph.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TONIGHT (THURSDAY NIGHT):

WEATHER: Smoky.

MINIMUM TEMPERATURES: 57-62 thermal belts above 3500 ft. 55-60 lower slopes. **24 HR Trend:** minimal change.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 45-55% mid and upper slopes. 65-75% lower slopes and along the river. **24 HR Trend:** minimal change.

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - West-northwest winds 7-10 mph along the ridges, diminishing to southeast 2-5 mph after 2200.

RIDGETOP - Northwest 5-10 mph with gusts up to 15 mph through 0200, diminishing to east 3-6 mph late.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Smoke settling over the perimeters and ICP with a moderate nighttime inversion around 3000 ft.

EXTENDED FORECAST FRIDAY - SUNDAY: Minimal change in the forecast as the high pressure ridge remains nearly stationary over the fire area through late Friday. Subtle improvement in relative humidity may be seen on Friday and into the weekend while winds remain quite light. The smoke will continue to be the main driver of weather through the remainder of the period.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Very active to extreme fire behavior will continue with the static weather conditions. Most of the activity will occur in the eastern side of the fire above Trinity Village. Spotting and rollout will continue to be a problem. Expect spotting out to ¼ mile. The potential exists for very active to extreme fire behavior if the inversion breaks.

The fires are burning in areas with no recent fire history and significant dead and down, resulting in abundant surface fuels. The fires are situated near the confluence of the main stem Trinity River and the S. Fork of the Trinity River, which will influence wind channeling and subsequently fire behavior – watch for erratic and eddying winds near the confluence and large bends in the river canyons.

Ignition Receptiveness: Probability of Ignition 56% shaded 90% sunshine Night 13% Spotting 3/4 mile

Dryness: Dead and down fuel moistures :1 hour – 3-6%, 10 hour– 9%, and 1000 hour– 11%.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I - Divisions A, D, G, J, N and R.

Creeping and smoldering in Division A and D control lines have sufficient depth to make interior activity unlikely to compromise control lines. In Div. J, fire will continue to move downslope and upslope closing the donut hole below Lone Pine Ridge. Division N the spot in Hawkins Creek will continue to grow to the south and east. Spotting to the east is likely. Division R rollouts will be a problem. Division G fire will continue to fill in the gap between the burnouts. Spotting to the north and west in the morning.

Branch X– Divisions U, W

Fire in Div. W and U No perimeter growth is expected. The possibility of spotting outside of the line continues. Creeping and smoldering otherwise.

Night Shift: Spots to the east will be likely, with the fuel conditions they should exhibit active to moderate activity. Rollouts along Division R. Fire behavior should moderate around 0400 hours. Moderate to active fire behavior is expected.






SAFETY

Major Hazard and Risk:

- **Hazardous Roads:** Narrow roads, steep drop offs, erratic drivers, and operator fatigue are all prevalent on this and other assignments. Watch out!
- **Heavy Equipment Operations:** Keep a safe distance. Watch out for heavy equipment while driving. Remember that it can be challenging for the operator to see you and hear you, so be patient.
- **Extended Extraction Times:** Be familiar with the medical plan. Develop a plan on how you would get an injured firefighter out timely. Factor in how smoke inversions will reduce the likelihood of utilizing helicopters for a medevac.
- **Hazard Tree Safety:** Hazard trees, both dead snags and live green trees, are one of the most common risks encountered on the fireline. All firefighters should frequently survey their work area for potential hazards trees. **This includes your sleeping areas in camp!**

Wildland Urban Interface (WUI) Firefighting- Structure protection is inherently dangerous because it involves indirect firefighting. Do not commit to stay and protect a structure unless a safety zone for firefighters and equipment has been identified at the structure during size-up and triage. Move to the nearest safety zone, let the fire front pass, and return as soon as conditions allow.

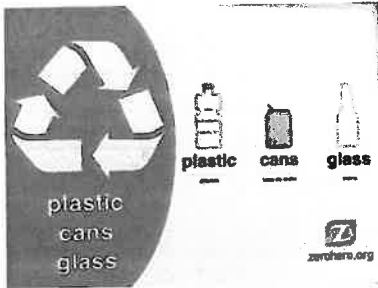

Things YOU Can Do To Support This Initiative

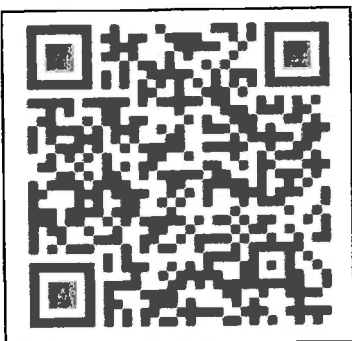
- The key is to separate the trash on your end to save time and waste on the recycle end.
- Utilize the Zero Hero recycle stations throughout camp.
- Sort as you eat your lunches, etc. (the plastic carry out bags are ideal, as are crew lunch boxes)
- Deposit the bags / boxes in the appropriate containers when you return to camp.
- Take separated crew waste directly to the Recyclers behind the VFW if possible.

PLEASE CAPTURE UNUSED SNACK ITEMS FOR COMMUNITY DISTRIBUTION

The local community center has been re-packaging these items for parents. For many this means their kids can have actual snacks in their school lunches this semester. Look for blue cans labeled "Non-Perishable Food Donations" in ICP or bring directly to the Zero Hero site behind the VFW.

So far, on just this incident, 34,216 lbs of recycle was diverted from the local landfill out of 129,607 lbs of waste overall.

STAGE 1 Fire Suppression Repair Cheat Sheet

Remember, if you have any doubts or questions about the ideal end state of these repairs, get in touch with a READ!

Overall Objective: Repair damage caused by suppression activities, and thus minimize short and long-term environmental impacts. Impacts caused by the direct effects of fire will be mitigated or corrected during this repair phase, only those impacts caused by the suppression of the fire.

General Guidelines for Stage 1 Repair (consult signed Suppression Repair Plan (SR Plan))

Dozer and Hand Lines:

- Construct water bars and/or rolling dips where access is no longer needed and erosion is a concern. Knock down berms into the fire line. (see SR Plan page 13)
- Firelines that cross draws/channels will be cleaned of debris and re-contoured (see SR Plan page 15)
- Remove suppression created fuels and logs from firelines via chipping, piling, lop & scatter, and decking, advised.
- Trench handlines should be pulled back and contoured.
- Obliterate hand lines where they intersect FS trails.
- Strategic firelines intended for future use should have suppression general debris chipped and little to no debris or brush scattered over them. Only pile after all other repair activities are complete.

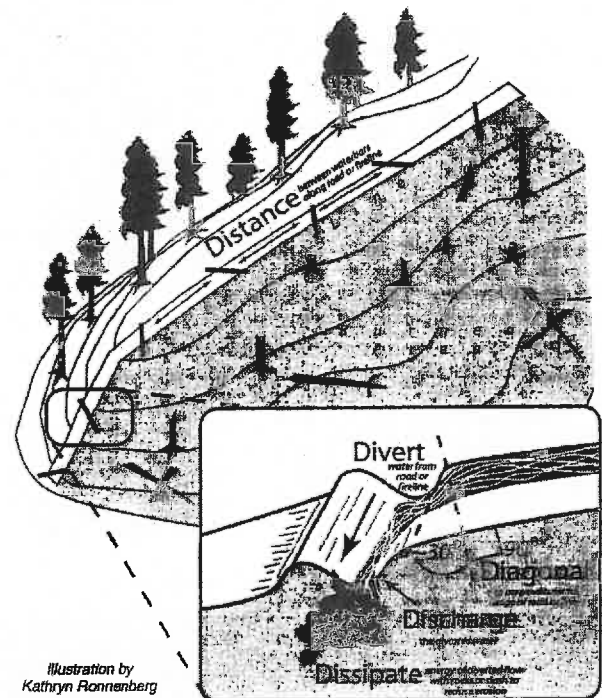

Safety Zones, Drop Points, Hellspots, Sling Sites, Staging Areas, etc:

- Restore to pre-existing condition.
- Knock down berms, de-compact soil, and restore natural drainage flows.
- Only pull enough slash across the area to reduce erosion and prevent further impacts.
- Chip and pile debris, as advised.

Roads and Trails:

- Clean ditches, side drains, rolling dips, and other drainage features along roads damaged by suppression activities (see SR Plan page 14).
- Where needed, water and grade surfaces and remove berms along roads impacted by suppression activities.
- Chip side-cast slash on roads, construct slash piles, lop and scatter, or deck logs, as advised.
- Repair damaged earthen barriers for Maintenance Level 1, decommissioned, and non-system roads (see SR Plan page 16).



Miscellaneous Resources:

- Maintain the integrity of Wilderness, Inventoried Roadless Areas and Wild and Scenic River Corridor characteristics
- **SITES WITH YELLOW/BLACK FLAGGING:** *Sites: No repair work may commence without consultation with an assigned Archaeologist and the Hoopa Tribal Representative, and/or and the lead Resource Advisor to the fire.*
- Remove all equipment, gear, hose, flagging, and trash from firelines and dispersal sites following repair actions.

Fences and Gates:

- Repair any fences and gates damaged by suppression activities.

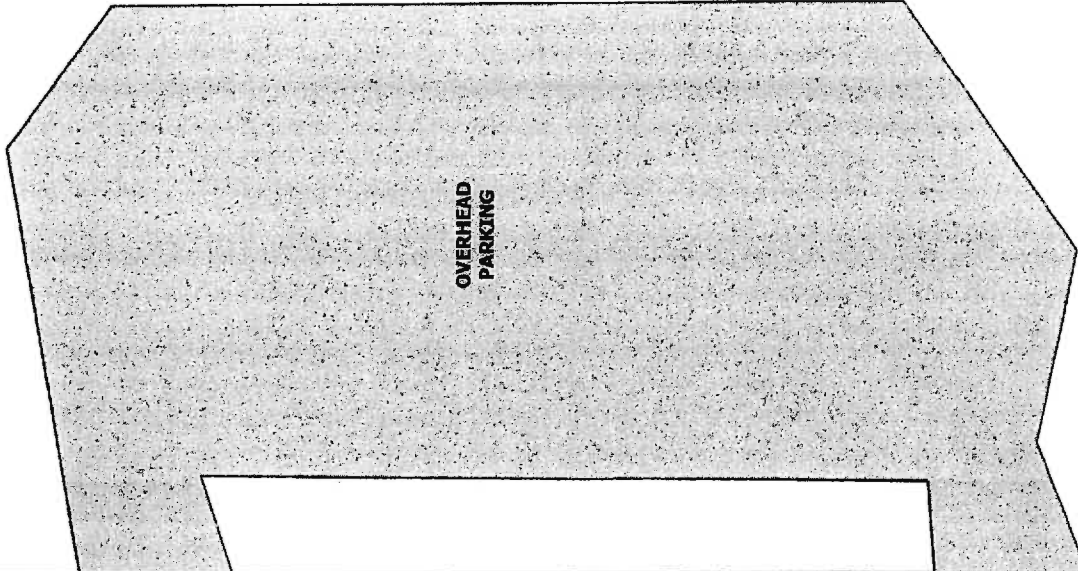

- Remove dams, dikes, and other impoundments.
- Restore damaged stream banks to natural contours.
- Report fuel and oil spills.

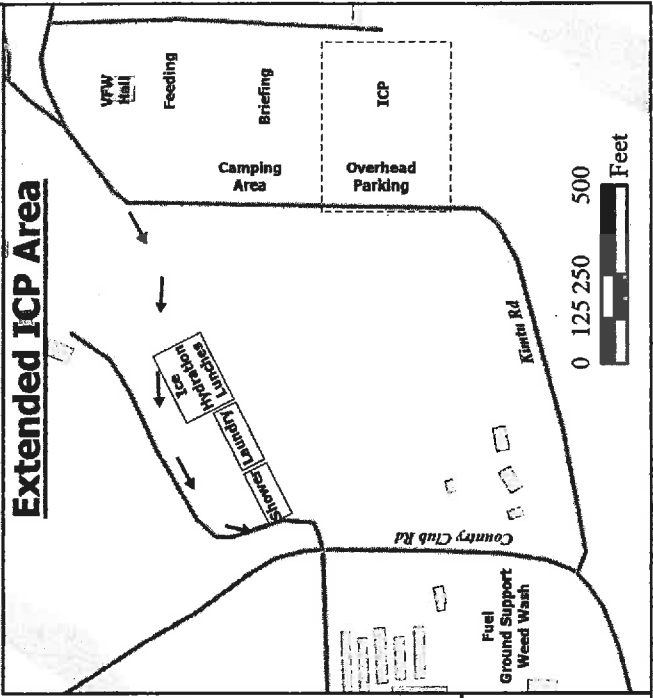

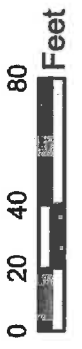

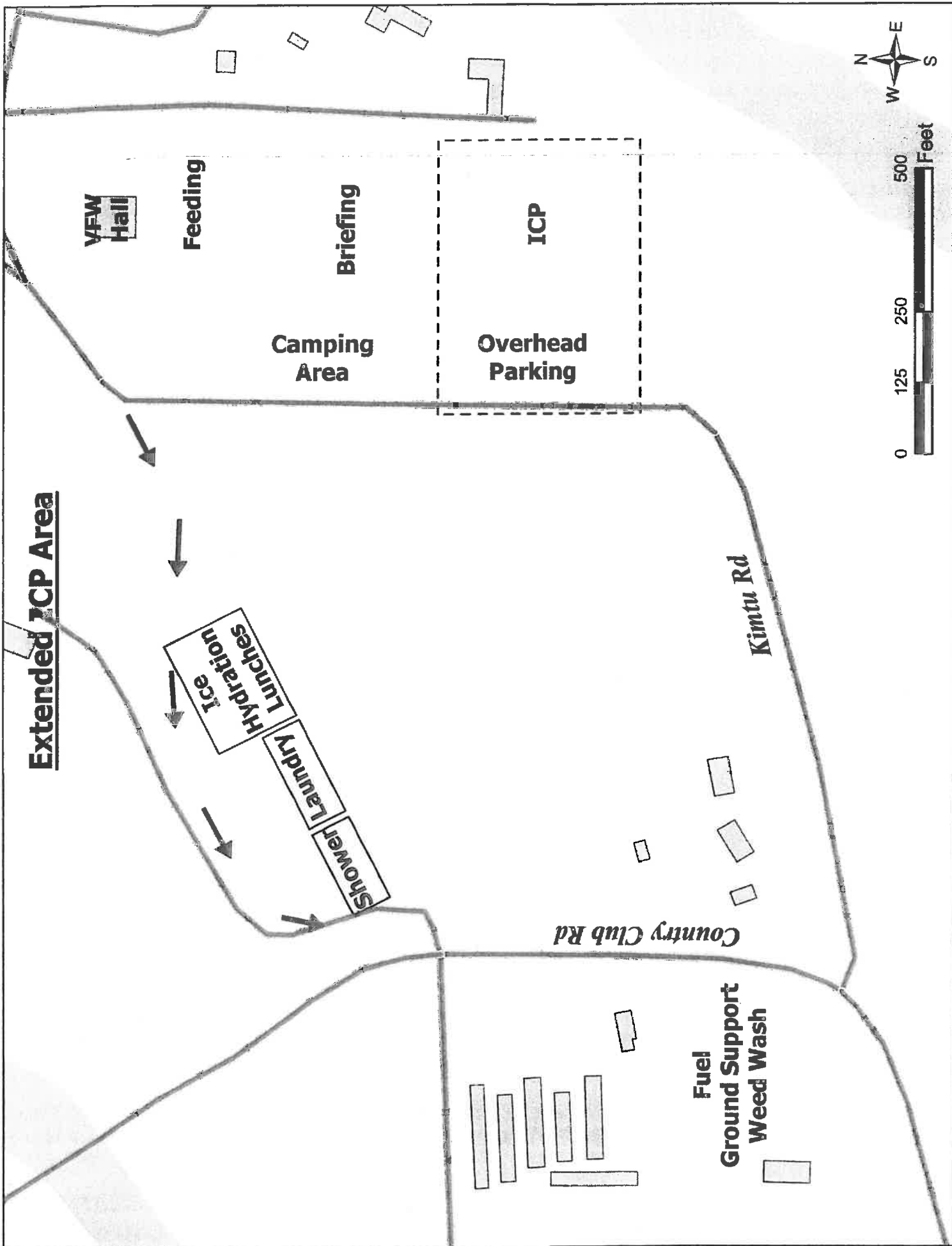
