...HEAT ADVISORY FOR TODAY...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The intense heat will continue today and through the rest of the week. Light easterly winds in the morning will become westerly then northwesterly by mid to late afternoon, gusting to 12-16 mph on the higher slopes and ridges. RH values will drop into the mid teens to mid 20's. There is a slight chance for a thunderstorm in the afternoon, with the best chances near the eastern perimeter in Divisions J and N, and points eastward into Trinity County. Any storm that forms can generate dry lightning and gusty and erratic wind gusts to 35 mph. Poor RH recoveries expected again overnight with readings around 30% on average, especially for the higher slopes and ridges as a thermal belt will continue.

WEATHER: Sunny, but areas of smoke early, mixing out after 1400.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 87-93 degrees upper slopes and ridges.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 22-32% mid and upper slopes. 40-60% lower slopes and along the river. 24 HR Trend: Up 3-5%.

SLOPE/VALLEY - NW to N or upslope winds 5-8 mph, diminishing to NE to E or downslope 3-6 mph after 2200.

RIDGETOP - NW to N 6-8 mph with gusts up to 15 mph through 2200, diminishing to southeast 3-6 mph late.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Smoke settling over the fire and ICP with a moderate nighttime inversion around 1500 ft.

EXTENDED FORECAST THURSDAY - SATURDAY: The heatwave continues through the week with low RH values both during the day and at night with poor recoveries expected. Highs in the 90s higher terrain with upper 90s to 100s lower terrain and valleys. Cooler temperatures and higher humidities make a return for late in the weekend to early next week.

FUELS SUMMARY:

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory Issued for Geographic Area

The Campbell and Ammon fires resulted from a lightning event that occurred in the early morning hours of August 5th. The area has seen 50-75% of normal precipitation in the current rain year and the relatively mild spring and early summer conditions had the fuel and fire danger indices near historical averages during the initial stages of the fire. Current conditions are reflective of an additional month of drying with fuels and fire danger indices at or above the 97th percentile. The primary carrier of fire at lower elevations is timber litter with a substantial hardwood dead and down component resulting from an ice/snow event this past winter.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The very hot, dry, and breezy conditions caused fire activity to pick-up yesterday afternoon. Expect this to happen again for the next several days as critical weather conditions remain over the fire area. Increase tactical patrols each afternoon and post lookouts who can monitor fire and smoke conditions and order aircraft if needed.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I: Expect similar conditions along the eastern perimeter of the Campbell fire. Several days of drying will cause fire activity to increase in the interior unburned islands in Div. J. Continue the strong work keeping the fire within the control lines.

Branch X: There is still plenty vegetation to burn within the interior of the Ammon fire. Keep posting lookouts who can assess any new smokes. When working with heavy equipment, spin weather and evaluate Probability of Ignition. You may need to shut down operations during the hottest and driest parts of the day.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Sunrise 0649, Sunset 1938 (Daylength: losing 2 min, 36 sec)

Smoke will continue to impact the lower elevations early in the day with clearing beginning by 1400.

SAFETY:

Take your time and pay attention to the details. There should be no reason to rush, especially when driving on mountain roads.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

September 2nd, 2022



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically elevated fire danger indices, low live and dead fuel moistures, and very hot and dry conditions across much of northern California.

Discussion: An extended period of hot, dry weather with embedded periods of enhanced winds will impact Northern California. The elevated fire weather concerns with fuels reaching their yearly minimum moisture values will create conditions conducive to long range spotting, rapid fire growth, and high resistance to control.

Difference from normal conditions: The current values for Energy Release Component (ERC) are at or above the 90th percentile for the majority of Northern California, with live fuel moistures dropping to critical levels as herbaceous and woody fuels cure. These conditions will be exacerbated by a predicted heat wave, resulting in anomalous daytime highs with little relief in temperature or humidity recovery overnight. Some PSA's, may reach daily record ERC values, with all covered PSA's predicted to reach or exceed the 97th percentile for an extended period. The combination of extreme ERC's with high temperatures and poor overnight humidity recovery is highly correlated with extreme fire behavior in Northern California.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- The advisory coincides with the Labor Day holiday weekend that is likely to result in increased outdoor recreation and visitor use to public lands across Northern California. The increase in public use carries an increased risk of fire starts as well as potential for evacuations of visitors/ recreational users in the event of a fire starting.
- Energy Release Component (ERC) in areas covered by this advisory are at or above the 90th percentile and are expected to approach or exceed the 97th percentile. **Anticipate increased spread rates, long range spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought, a building heat wave, and a very dry atmosphere will continue to decrease already low fuel moisture values:
 - o 1000-hour fuel moistures are below average and approaching the 90th percentile.
 - Live woody fuel moisture in brush is near or slightly below average, making them readily available and will likely reach critical levels because of the forecasted hot, dry weather.
 - The above average herbaceous fuel load at low and mid elevations (below 5,000 ft.) is fully cured, with high elevation herbaceous fuels rapidly curing during the hot, dry forecast.
 - o Higher than average surface fuel loading is present in areas that experienced winter snow and ice storms in the Coast Range and northern Sierra Nevada.

Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.

- Periods of enhanced winds are expected during the hot and dry period. Given the current and anticipated fuels conditions, increases in winds will make direct attack of any new starts difficult and may hamper use of aerial resources.
- Review the current <u>North Ops Outlooks</u> and <u>national fuels and fire behavior advisories</u>.

Mitigation Measures:

- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones.
 Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates
- Fire managers should be aware of high use recreation and visitor sites in their area. The holiday weekend will bring increased visitor use, increasing risk of starts during critical fire weather.

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast, Bay Marine, and west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino.

For Day Operations: September 7, 2022

INCIDENT: SRF Lightning Complex

Day: Wednesday Shift: Day

Major Hazard and Risk:

Hazard Tree Safety: Hazard trees, both dead snags and live green trees, are one of the most common risks encountered on the fire line. All firefighters should frequently survey their work area for potential hazards trees. This includes your sleeping areas in camp!

- Extended Extraction Times: Be familiar with the medical plan. Develop a plan on how you would get an injured firefighter out timely. Factor in how smoke inversions will reduce the likelihood of utilizing helicopters for a medevac. ID helispots/hoist spots and mark the Lat/Longs and ensure everyone on the Division knows where they are. Update these locations as you move your work locations.
- ➤ Hazardous Roads: Narrow roads, steep drop-offs, erratic drivers, and operator fatigue are all prevalent on this and other assignments. If road condition is an issue, contact your Division Supervisor to report.
- Heat Related Injuries: Stay hydrated, eat properly, drink fluids in a 3:1 ratio of water to sports drink, take frequent breaks, and pay attention to your body. Review the Heat-Related Injury section in your IRPG for signs, symptoms and treatments.

<u>Narrative:</u> As more suppression and repair work is being done on the fire, there will be much more heavy equipment operating on the line. Be aware of equipment working in your area and review p. 85 of your IRPG that covers Working with heavy equipment.

Working Around Heavy Equipment

- Before approaching make sure the operator acknowledges you.
- Know what is on your division and the associated risks. Some equipment can pose unique risks.
- When working in timber make sure to stay 2.5 times the canopy height from equipment.
- Try to avoid working down hill from equipment as they can dislodge objects.
- Try to avoid working behind equipment, the operators do not typically have good field of vision.

Hazard Trees

- Review hazard tree safety in your IRPG
- Post lookouts, use a spotter working around hazard trees.
- Don't park vehicles or take breaks in high concentrations of hazard trees.
- Establish trigger points for disengagement during high winds.
- Establish your escape route when working around hazard trees.
- Utilize traffic control points when felling operations will impact roads.



STAGE 1 Fire Suppression Repair Cheat Sheet

Remember, if you have any doubts or questions about the ideal end state of these repairs, get in touch with a READ!

Overall Objective: Repair damage caused by <u>suppression activities</u>, and thus minimize short and long-term environmental impacts. Impacts caused by the direct effects of fire will be mitigated or corrected during this repair phase, <u>only those impacts caused by the suppression of the fire</u>.

General Guidelines for Stage 1 Repair (consult signed Suppression Repair Plan (SR Plan)) Dozer and Hand Lines:

Construct water bars and/or rolling dips where access is no longer needed and erosion is a concern. Knock

(see SR Plan page 13)

down berms into the fire line.

Firelines that cross draws/channels will be cleaned of debris and re-contoured (see SR Plan page 15)

- Remove suppression created fuels and logs from firelines via chipping, piling, lop & scatter, and decking, advised.
- Trench handlines should be pulled back and contoured.
- Obliterate hand lines where they intersect FS trails.
- Strategic firelines intended for future use should have suppression general debris chipped and little to no debris or brush scattered over them. Only pile after all other repair activities are complete.

Safety Zones, Drop Points, Helispots, Sling Sites, Staging Areas, etc:

- Restore to pre-existing condition.
- Knock down berms, de-compact soil, and restore natural drainage flows.
- Only pull enough slash across the area to reduce erosion and prevent further impacts.
- Chip and pile debris, as advised.

Roads and Trails:

- Clean ditches, side drains, rolling dips, and other drainage features along roads damaged by suppression activities (see SR Plan page 14).
- Where needed, water and grade surfaces and remove berms along roads impacted by suppression activities.
- Chip side-cast slash on roads, construct slash piles, lop and scatter, or deck logs, as advised.
- Repair damaged earthen barriers for Maintenance Level 1, decommissioned, and non-system roads (see SR Plan page 16).


Miscellaneous Resources:

- Maintain the integrity of Wilderness, Inventoried Roadless Areas and Wild and Scenic River Corridor characteristics
- SITES WITH YELLOW/BLACK FLAGGING: Sites: No repair work may commence without consultation with an assigned Archaeologist and the Hoopa Tribal Representative, and/or and the lead Resource Advisor to the fire.
- Remove all equipment, gear, hose, flagging, and trash from firelines and dispersal sites following repair actions. **Fences and Gates:**

Repair any fences and gates damaged by suppression activities. Water Sources:

- Remove dams, dikes, and other impoundments.
- Restore damaged stream banks to natural contours.
- Report fuel and oil spills.




