Effectively manage and track costs for all incidents identified within the SRF Lightning Complex. ...EXCESSIVE HEAT WARNING TODAY...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The intense and dangerous heat will peak today, with slightly improved conditions Saturday, then much cooler and higher humidities next week as a Pacific air mass replaces the record hot high pressure area. Very hot temperatures into the 100's are expected in the lower and middle elevations, with only slightly cooler in the 90s above 4,000 ft. Very low RH values in the 10-20% range this afternoon. Light easterly to southeasterly flow in the morning will become northwesterly after 1400, though light in the 4-7 mph range, with gusts 10-14 mph on the higher ridges and slopes. Poor RH recoveries expected once again with readings only 20-30% in the higher terrain, and 30-70% in the lower slopes below 3,500 ft.

WEATHER FORECAST FOR TODAY (FRIDAY):

WEATHER: Sunny, but areas of smoke early, partially mixing out after 1400.

MAX TEMPERATURES: 91 - 97 degrees upper slopes and ridges.

24 HR Trend: Up 3-5 degrees.

101 - 106 degrees lower slopes and drainages.

24 HR Trend: Up 3-5 degrees.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 12 - 18% upper slopes and ridges.

24 HR Trend Down 3-5%.

10 - 17% lower slopes and drainages. 24 HR Trend Down 4-6%.

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light east/downslope breeze, becoming NW or upslope 3-5 mph, gusts to 9 mph after 1500 PDT.

RIDGETOP - Light southeast breeze, becoming NW 4-6 mph with gusts 8 to 13 mph after 1500 PDT.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Moderate inversion around 1500 feet partially mixing out around 1400 hours.

SMOKE TRANSPORT WIND: South around 5 mph.

<u>WEATHER FORECAST FOR TONIGHT (FRIDAY NIGHT):</u>

WEATHER: Haze through sunset then smoke settling across the fire overnight and ICP toward morning.

MINIMUM TEMPERATURES: 70-75 thermal belts above 3500 ft. 63-68 lower slopes.

24 HR Trend: No significant change.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 20-40% mid and upper slopes. 30-70% lower slopes.

24 HR Trend: No significant change.

20-FOOT WIND:

SLOPE/VALLEY - NW to N or upslope winds 3-5 mph, diminishing to E or downslope 2-4 mph after 2200.

RIDGETOP - NW 4-6 mph with gusts up to 10 mph through 2100, becoming southeast 4-6 mph late.

INVERSIONS/STABILITY: Smoke settling over the fire and ICP with a moderate nighttime inversion around 2000 ft.

EXTENDED FORECAST SATURDAY - MONDAY: One last day of hot and dry weather Saturday, though somewhat cooler than Friday as increasing clouds are expected by afternoon. Southeast to south winds may gust up to 15 to 20 mph on ridgetops on Saturday, before diminishing later in the afternoon. Cooler conditions expected on Sunday, and then cooler still Monday through much of next week as a Pacific air mass moves in with much higher humidities.

FUELS SUMMARY:

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory Issued for Geographic Area

The Campbell and Ammon fires resulted from a lightning event that occurred in the early morning hours of August 5th. The area has seen 50-75% of normal precipitation in the current rain year and the relatively mild spring and early summer conditions had the fuel and fire danger indices near historical averages during the initial stages of the fire. Current conditions are reflective of an additional month of drying with fuels and fire danger indices at or above the 97th percentile. The primary carrier of fire at lower elevations is timber litter with a substantial hardwood dead and down component resulting from an ice/snow event this past winter.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The peak of the heat wave should be over the fire area today, with temperatures reaching similar conditions as experienced on Tuesday. Most of the Ammon and Campbell fire burned at a low to moderate intensity. This means there will continue to be potential for a timber stringer to catch fire inside the control lines. Continue to patrol the lines and post lookouts who can assess the threat of the smokes that are sure to pop-up this afternoon during the hot and dry conditions.

SPECIFIC:

Branch I: The main threat to the control lines will be from roll-out on the mid-slope control lines. The forecast calls for a breezy southeasterly wind to be over the fire on Saturday. This is a wind direction not yet experienced on the fire. Continue the seek and destroy missions as every piece of heat extinguished now, is one less that can cause a problem down the line.

Branch X: Keep posting lookouts who can assess smokes. When working with heavy equipment, spin weather and evaluate the probability of ignition. You may need to shut down operations during the hottest and driest parts of the day.

Initial Attack: The fire weather conditions will cause any new fires to burn actively. If you are requested to support a new fire, the PDF maps for the SHF and SRF can be accessed with the QR code and opened in Avenza.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Sunrise 0651, Sunset 1935 (Daylength: losing 2 min, 36 sec)

The air will continue to improve through the week with conditions favorable for air support each afternoon.

SAFETY:

Push hydration with your crews each day as dehydration is cumulative. Take breaks in strategic locations during the heat of the day.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

September 2nd, 2022



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically elevated fire danger indices, low live and dead fuel moistures, and very hot and dry conditions across much of northern California.

Discussion: An extended period of hot, dry weather with embedded periods of enhanced winds will impact Northern California. The elevated fire weather concerns with fuels reaching their yearly minimum moisture values will create conditions conducive to long range spotting, rapid fire growth, and high resistance to control.

Difference from normal conditions: The current values for Energy Release Component (ERC) are at or above the 90th percentile for the majority of Northern California, with live fuel moistures dropping to critical levels as herbaceous and woody fuels cure. These conditions will be exacerbated by a predicted heat wave, resulting in anomalous daytime highs with little relief in temperature or humidity recovery overnight. Some PSA's, may reach daily record ERC values, with all covered PSA's predicted to reach or exceed the 97th percentile for an extended period. The combination of extreme ERC's with high temperatures and poor overnight humidity recovery is highly correlated with extreme fire behavior in Northern California.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- The advisory coincides with the Labor Day holiday weekend that is likely to result in increased outdoor recreation and visitor use to public lands across Northern California. The increase in public use carries an increased risk of fire starts as well as potential for evacuations of visitors/ recreational users in the event of a fire starting.
- Energy Release Component (ERC) in areas covered by this advisory are at or above the 90th percentile and are expected to approach or exceed the 97th percentile. **Anticipate increased spread rates, long range spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought, a building heat wave, and a very dry atmosphere will continue to decrease already low fuel moisture values:
 - o 1000-hour fuel moistures are below average and approaching the 90th percentile.
 - Live woody fuel moisture in brush is near or slightly below average, making them readily available and will likely reach critical levels because of the forecasted hot, dry weather.
 - o The above average herbaceous fuel load at low and mid elevations (below 5,000 ft.) is fully cured, with high elevation herbaceous fuels rapidly curing during the hot, dry forecast.
 - Higher than average surface fuel loading is present in areas that experienced winter snow and ice storms in the Coast Range and northern Sierra Nevada.

Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.

- Periods of enhanced winds are expected during the hot and dry period. Given the current and anticipated fuels conditions, increases in winds will make direct attack of any new starts difficult and may hamper use of aerial resources.
- Review the current North Ops Outlooks and national fuels and fire behavior advisories.

Mitigation Measures:

- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates
- Fire managers should be aware of high use recreation and visitor sites in their area. The holiday weekend will bring increased visitor use, increasing risk of starts during critical fire weather.

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast, Bay Marine, and west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino.



NARRATIVE:

ADAPTABILITY AND FLEXIBILITY:

As the 2022 fire season continues to ramp up, and conditions continue to worsen, it is important to spend some time to recognize that fire behavior conditions are changing. Annual trainings and readiness reviews can only do so much to bring us into a safety-oriented mindset. Often, our awareness of safety increases over the course of the season, but it is important to spend some time, as we move from the SRF Lightning Complex into our critical fire season, to facilitate the mental shift on how we are going to respond to fires safely now that conditions have worsened.

REMEMBER: Increasing personal adaptability and flexibility increases our margin of error and can lead to a safer environment.

COMPLACENCY:

It's up to each of us to control and eliminate complacency. Challenge yourself to focus on the task at hand, maintain a positive attitude, continue to work as a productive member of the "SRF Lightning Complex" toward the objectives, and encourage fellow workers to adhere to all the safety fundamentals.

STAGE 1 Fire Suppression Repair Cheat Sheet

Remember, if you have any doubts or questions about the ideal end state of these repairs, get in touch with a READ!

Overall Objective: Repair damage caused by suppression activities, and thus minimize short and long-term environmental impacts. Impacts caused by the direct effects of fire will be mitigated or corrected during this repair phase, only those impacts caused by the suppression of the fire.

General Guidelines for Stage 1 Repair (consult signed Suppression Repair Plan (SR Plan)) Dozer and Hand Lines:

Firelines that cross draws/channels will be cleaned of debris and re-contoured (see SR Plan page 15)

- Remove suppression created fuels and logs from firelines via chipping, piling, lop & scatter, and decking, advised.
- Trench handlines should be pulled back and contoured.
- Obliterate hand lines where they intersect FS trails.
- Strategic firelines intended for future use should have suppression general debris chipped and little to no debris or brush scattered over them. Only pile after all other repair activities are complete.

Safety Zones, Drop Points, Helispots, Sling Sites, Staging Areas, etc:

- Restore to pre-existing condition.
- Knock down berms, de-compact soil, and restore natural drainage flows.
- Only pull enough slash across the area to reduce erosion and prevent further impacts.
- Chip and pile debris, as advised.


Roads and Trails:


- Clean ditches, side drains, rolling dips, and other drainage features along roads damaged by suppression activities (see SR Plan page 14).
- Where needed, water and grade surfaces and remove berms along roads impacted by suppression activities.
- Chip side-cast slash on roads, construct slash piles, lop and scatter, or deck logs, as advised.
- Repair damaged earthen barriers for Maintenance Level 1, decommissioned, and non-system roads (see SR Plan page 16).

Miscellancous Resources:

- Maintain the integrity of Wilderness, Inventoried Roadless Areas and Wild and Scenic River Corridor characteristics
- SITES WITH YELLOW/BLACK FLAGGING: Sites: No repair work may commence without consultation with an assigned Archaeologist and the Hoopa Tribal Representative, and/or and the lead Resource Advisor to the fire.
- * Remove all equipment, gear, hose, flagging, and trash from firelines and dispersal sites following repair actions. Fences and Gates:
- Repair any fences and gates damaged by suppression activities. Water Sources:

- Remove dams, dikes, and other impoundments.
- Restore damaged stream banks to natural contours.
- Report fuel and oil spills.




