**DISCUSSION**...Mild and dry conditions will persist through Monday. Temperature will trend down on Tuesday as a shortwave approaches. Humidity recoveries will generally be good except for exposed ridgetops through Tuesday morning, where light easterly offshore winds will be possible late Monday night. Otherwise, good recoveries are expected by mid week. Light and mostly terrain- driven through Tuesday, with light offshore flow winds late in the night.





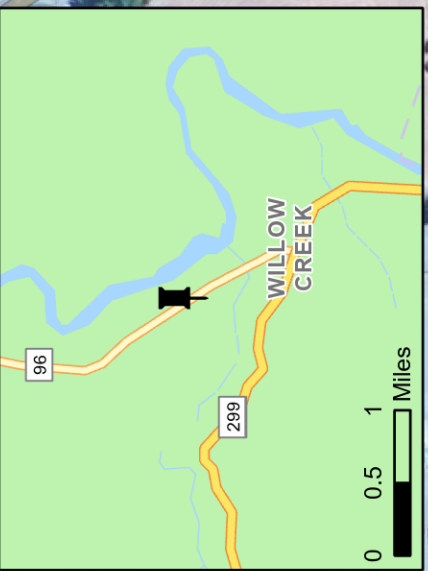

**To:** Six Rivers National Forest Employees

In accordance with FSH 6509.33 Federal Travel Regulation, 3f – Incident Travel, employees who are assigned to an incident within their local travel area may be eligible for meals and incidental expense (M&IE) reimbursements. Reimbursement for M&IE during an emergency in the local travel area is only authorized when warranted by emergency conditions connected with official activities for any official duty lasting more than 12 hours, regardless of actual miles from the official duty station or residence.

Examples of emergency conditions where this reimbursement may be warranted:

- Personnel are assigned to an active incident located on their district, working shifts 12 hours or greater and the incident is not providing meals.
- Dispatchers are assigned to support an incident(s) and are working shifts greater than 12 hours with no meals provided by the incident.

This reimbursement should only be applied for newly emerging, active, or ongoing incidents. Work related to BAER, preposition or extended staffing within the local travel area do not meet the definition of emergency conditions. This special authority does not apply to meetings, trainings, or other administrative activities and does not apply to individuals assigned virtually and teleworking from home.

Reimbursement is limited to established GSA M&IE rate. If meals are provided by the government, travelers will not be reimbursed for meals.

An open, interim, or trip-by-trip authorization must be approved in the Agency travel system prior to incurring any official travel expenses. For incident travel, a resource order may be used in combination with an open travel authorization. Travel authorizations issued after official travel has occurred may only be authorized if the travel expenses are related to incident business. A resource order must be uploaded to the travel authorization and travel voucher in the Agency travel system, when applicable. A resource order, GSA's Standard Form 261, Crew Time Report, or GSA's Form OF-288, Incident Time Report, must be uploaded to the travel voucher in the Agency travel system.
