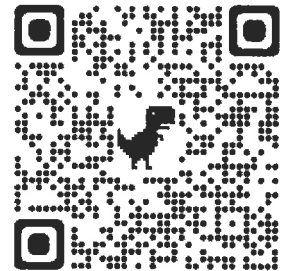

3. Objective(s):

Strategic Framework

- Implement a full suppression strategy on the Mosquito Fire. Values at risk include human safety, private timberlands, communities, critical infrastructure, and associated improvements. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of firefighter safety and success.

Leaders Intent

Provide the highest level of customer service to all involved with or impacted by the Mosquito Fire. Ensure transparent, timely, and accurate communication at all levels of the incident; and strengthen relationships with stakeholders and cooperators. All assigned personnel shall be prepared to take appropriate action regarding:

- Personnel safety and the safety of others; including driving slowly and defensively.
- Fatigue management by maintaining work/rest cycles, taking breaks, and being fit for duty.
- Minimization of risk and exposure to infectious disease through implementation of Center of Disease Control, California Department of Public Health, and agency guidelines.
- Professional behavior, conduct, and timely/effective communication.

Management Objectives

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.
- Coordinate suppression activities, suppression repair, and hazard tree abatement with assigned incident resource advisors to minimize impacts on natural and cultural resources.
- Provide initial attack assistance to both the Eldorado and Tahoe National Forests.

Control Objectives

- Keep the Mosquito Fire within the current perimeter.



WEATHER DISCUSSION: Partly cloudy in the morning becoming sunny and warm in the afternoon. Breezy northeast winds are expected over ridges this morning, becoming light southwest in the afternoon. Poor humidity recovery is expected in the morning, with afternoon humidity dropping to 10-15%. Humidity recovery tonight into Thursday will also be low, with poor conditions, especially at higher elevations. Gusty northeast winds will develop again tonight for ridges, but will not be as strong as last night.

Wednesday Weather: Partly cloudy becoming sunny in the afternoon. Low humidity.
TEMPERATURES: 80-84 below 3000 feet and 73-80 3000-5000 feet...up 3 degrees.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 10-15%...down 5 percent.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - East northeast 5 to 10 mph with gusts to 18 mph through 1100, becoming west to southwest 4 to 8 mph with gusts to 11 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Down canyon 4 to 9 mph through 1100, then switching to up canyon 4 to 7 mph.

INVERSION: Morning inversion lifting around 11 am. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 5000 feet **LAL:** 1

Wednesday Night: Partly cloudy. Poor RH recovery. Breezy northeast winds along the ridges.
TEMPERATURES: 50-56...little change.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 23-33%...down 18 percent.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP – West to southwest 5 to 7 mph through 2000, then northeast-east 6 to 11 mph with gusts to 17 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Up canyon 3 to 6 mph early, becoming light and variable, then becoming down canyon 5 to 9 mph at 2200.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate inversion setting up overnight. **LAL** 1


OUTLOOK FOR THURSDAY: Sunny. Temperatures will remain warm, though a little cooler than Wednesday. Humidity levels will continue to be low, with afternoon minimums dropping to 10-15%. Recovery Thursday night into Thursday is expected to be poor again, around 25-35%.

EXTENDED FORECAST: A pattern change is forecast for the weekend with cool temperatures and higher humidity. There is a chance for wetting rain late Friday into Saturday. Dry weather is expected Sunday and Monday, but temperatures will remain cool, with highs in the 50s. Gusty southwest ridge winds Saturday afternoon, becoming gusty northwest winds Sunday afternoon.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: Clear, dry weather will continue to dominate. The past few days have been cooler with better humidity recovery, particularly at low elevations on the western edge of the fire. A warming and drying trend returns today, with poor to very poor RH recoveries at mid and upper elevation overnight. Enhanced evening/overnight easterly/downcanyon winds are possible through the forecast period.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Even with cooler temperatures & increasing RH over the last 2-3 days, active interior heat and burning continued. Expect this to enhance as the warming and drying trend develops and overnight RH recovery returns to very poor values. The poor overnight humidity will most impact the eastern flanks of the fire where the largest areas of remaining heat and open line coincide with thermal belts. These areas may experience their lowest humidity values overnight.

Like previous forecasts, the overall fuel complex is readily available and ERC values remain above the 90th percentile. The exceptions are fine fuels in areas of good overnight humidity recovery and areas benefitting from recent green-up.

In the event fire crosses a containment line, interior re-burn in needle cast/leaves, green island consumption or during IA support, expect the potential for problematic fire behavior. This could include isolated torching and flame lengths that challenge direct control efforts without water or air support. Max spotting distances between ¼ & ½ of a mile are likely and may increase if unpredicted winds or terrain channeling are present. Greatest concern for enhanced winds is E to NE winds at ridgetops overnight, though a similar pattern last week did not produce significant wind impacts.

SPECIFIC:

Branch 10 (Div. J): Existing containment lines expected to hold. Remaining Interior heat will result in slow to moderate spread in areas of unburned fuel or re-burn in areas with significant needle cast.

Branch 25 (Div. U): Overall low flame lengths with low to moderate spread in areas without containment. Isolated torching of brush and small trees is likely as fuels remain dry and available for consumption

AIR OPERATIONS:


Air operations may be needed if fire escapes containment or during initial attack support. Inversions will impact air operations until late morning or early afternoon.

SAFETY

Strong thermal belts and poor overnight recovery can lead to lingering or even increasing fire activity overnight when resources expect less active burning. Be vigilant for fire in new places in the morning!

Maintaining Relationships During Assignment

Relationships come in a variety of forms, but one consistent factor is the effort they require to maintain. Whether we are gone on endless fire assignments, or working long hours from our own home units, time spent focused on work takes away from fostering the important relationships in our lives. Be it a significant other, family members, kids, friends, or pets, we need to make time for them to cultivate longevity in the relationship. Some proactive steps taken before we hit PL3 or higher can help maintain long-term connection.

Talk about how you will stay connected. What does it look like when you come home from an assignment or have days off? Will that time be spent doing endless chores that are stacking up or will you allow yourself some grace from the to-do list and instead enjoy spending time with your loved ones? While the to-do list will always be there, make it a priority to engage in the activities that create and sustain connection.

How will you stay in touch? What is that communication plan and is it dependent on cell service? Cell service cannot always be guaranteed when on assignment so make sure your plan takes this into consideration. Even when there is cell coverage, you may be emotionally and physically drained and not have the capacity to engage in a conversation. Video calls may need to take priority over phone calls. Build a communication plan with loved ones based on understanding the realities of remote locations and long days.



Share pictures. Those at home can send a daily picture to keep you connected, it may not come through right away if you don't have cell coverage, but it will be a cherished surprise that awaits once you have service.



Make sure to engage in your spouse's and children's interests when home. Do you know what those are? If not, take some time to learn about their current interests and set aside time to make it all about them when you have time off at home.

Make plans. Make plans for when the season does ease up and we slow to PL2 or PL1. Some of us may be furloughed or reach the end of our seasonal employment. Who will you connect with during this time and what plans will you make with them? Plan a trip, go camping, take that hike you and your best friend talked about for the last two years. Making plans in the future keeps us engaged, it gives us something to look forward to and it keeps us connected with the important people in our lives.

Discussion: As a crew, talk about what ways you all cultivate to keep connections or the lessons you have learned from not keeping those connections. For those of you who have been around awhile, share with the new firefighters and learn about their ideas for maintaining relationships.

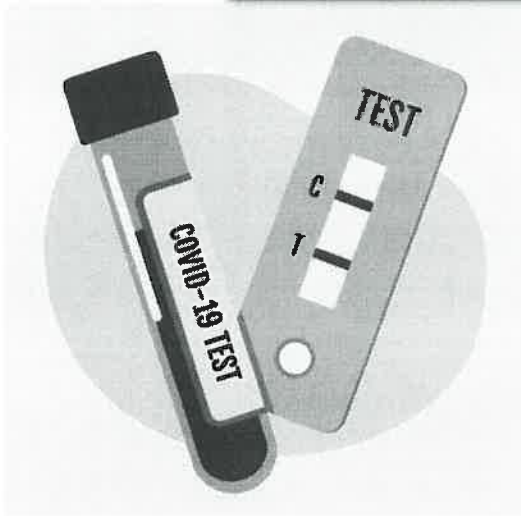
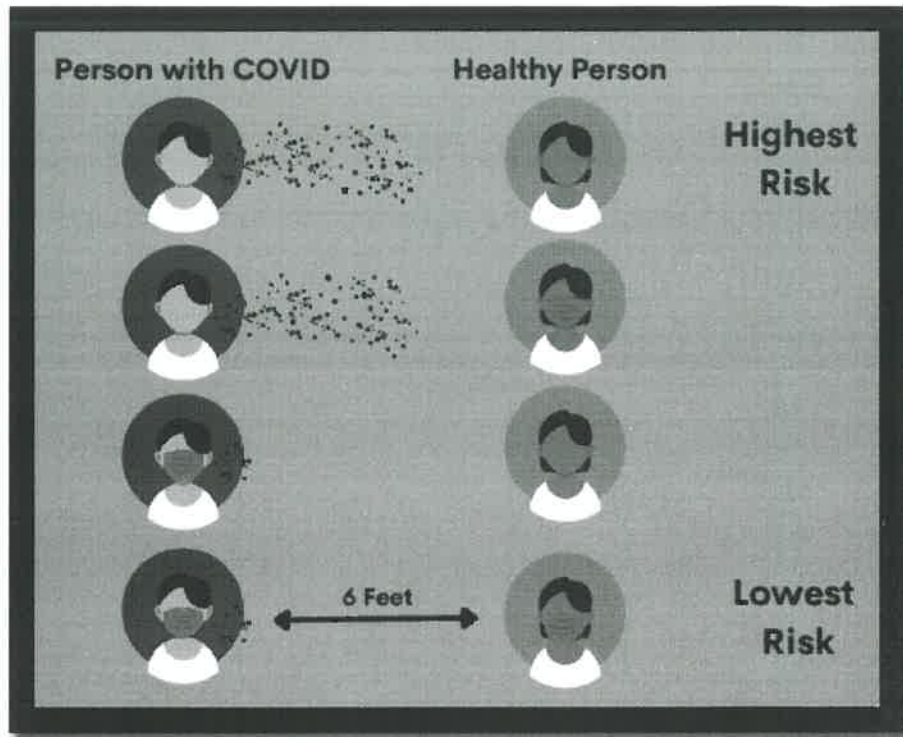

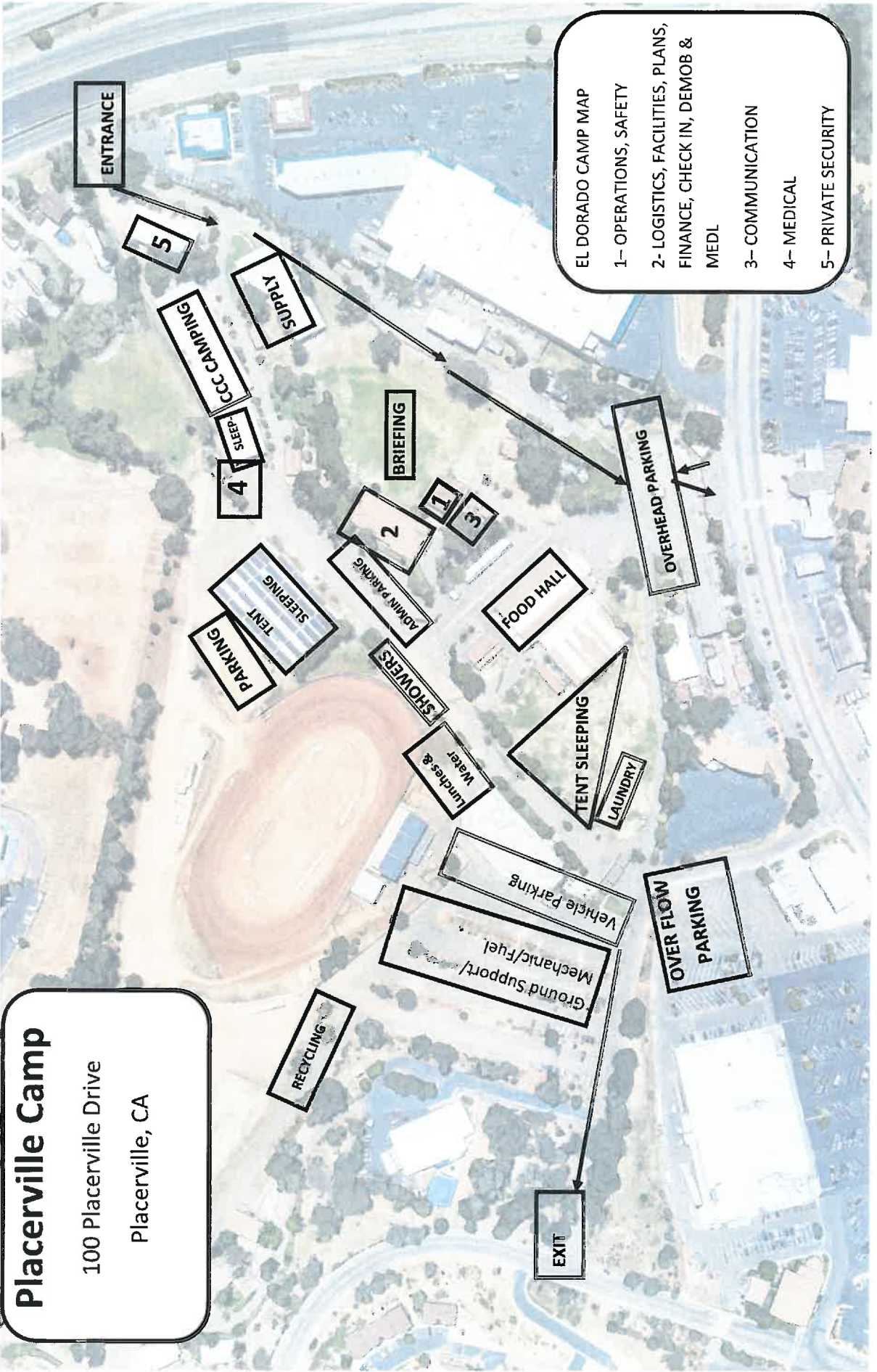

7. CONTINGENCY: Considerations: If primary options fail, what actions can be implemented in conjunction with primary evacuation method? Be thinking ahead.

8. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION: Updates/Changes, etc.

REMEMBER: Confirm ETA's of resources ordered. Act according to your level of training. Be Alert. Keep Calm. Think Clearly. Act Decisively.
