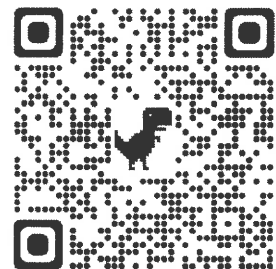

3. Objective(s):

Strategic Framework

- Implement a full suppression strategy on the Mosquito Fire. Values at risk include human safety, private timberlands, communities, critical infrastructure, and associated improvements. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of firefighter safety and success.

Leaders Intent

Provide the highest level of customer service to all involved with or impacted by the Mosquito Fire. Ensure transparent, timely, and accurate communication at all levels of the incident; and strengthen relationships with stakeholders and cooperators. All assigned personnel shall be prepared to take appropriate action regarding:

- Personnel safety and the safety of others; including driving slowly and defensively.
- Fatigue management by maintaining work/rest cycles, taking breaks, and being fit for duty.
- Minimization of risk and exposure to infectious disease through implementation of Center of Disease Control, California Department of Public Health, and agency guidelines.
- Professional behavior, conduct, and timely/effective communication.

Management Objectives

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.
- Coordinate suppression activities, suppression repair, and hazard tree abatement with assigned incident resource advisors to minimize impacts on natural and cultural resources.
- Provide initial attack assistance to both the Eldorado and Tahoe National Forests.

Control Objectives

- Keep the Mosquito Fire within the current perimeter.



WEATHER DISCUSSION: Warm and dry weather continues today, with some light northeast winds in the early morning over ridges, becoming light southwest by late morning. Poor humidity recovery is expected in the morning, with afternoon humidity dropping to 10-15%. Humidity recovery tonight into Friday will be a little better. Temperatures begin to trend down, with much cooler temperatures and potential wetting rain Saturday.

Thursday Weather: Sunny. Low humidity.

TEMPERATURES: 80-83 below 3000 feet and 73-80 3000-5000 feet...down 3 degrees.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 12-15%...little change.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - East northeast 5 to 9 mph with gusts to 15 mph through 0900, becoming west to southwest 4 to 7 mph with gusts to 10 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Down canyon 4 to 9 mph through 1100, then switching to up canyon 4 to 7 mph.

INVERSION: Morning inversion lifting around 11 am. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 5800 feet **LAL:** 1

Thursday Night: Partly cloudy. Better RH recovery.

TEMPERATURES: 53-58...5 degrees cooler.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 35-50%...up 6 percent.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP – West to southwest 4 to 7 mph through 2000, then east-northeast 4 to 7 mph with gusts to 10 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Up canyon 3 to 6 mph early, becoming light and variable, then becoming down canyon 4 to 7 mph at 2200.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate inversion setting up overnight. **LAL** 1

OUTLOOK FOR FRIDAY: Partly cloudy becoming mostly cloudy in the afternoon. Temperatures will remain warm, though a little cooler than Thursday. Humidity levels will trend higher, with afternoon minimums rising to 20-25%. Recovery Friday night into Saturday morning is also expected to be higher, around 55-65%.

EXTENDED FORECAST: A pattern change is forecast for the weekend with much cooler temperatures and higher humidity. There is a chance for wetting rain Saturday as a cold front moves through, along with gusty southwest ridge winds. Rain amounts around a quarter to a third of an inch are forecast. Dry weather returns Sunday and Monday, but temperatures will remain cool, with highs in the 50s and good humidity recovery. Some gusty northwest winds are possible Sunday afternoon.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: Clear, dry weather will continue to dominate. The past few days have been cooler with better humidity recovery, particularly at low elevations on the western edge of the fire. A warming and drying trend returns today, with poor to very poor RH recoveries at mid and upper elevation overnight. Enhanced evening/overnight easterly/downcanyon winds are possible through the forecast period.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Even with cooler temperatures & increasing RH over the last 2-3 days, active interior heat and burning continued. Expect this to enhance as the warming and drying trend develops and overnight RH recovery returns to very poor values. The poor overnight humidity will most impact the eastern flanks of the fire where the largest areas of remaining heat and open line coincide with thermal belts. These areas may experience their lowest humidity values overnight.

Like previous forecasts, the overall fuel complex is readily available and ERC values remain above the 90th percentile. The exceptions are fine fuels in areas of good overnight humidity recovery and areas benefitting from recent green-up.

In the event fire crosses a containment line, interior re-burn in needle cast/leaves, green island consumption or during IA support, expect the potential for problematic fire behavior. This could include isolated torching and flame lengths that challenge direct control efforts without water or air support. Max spotting distances between ¼ & ½ of a mile are likely and may increase if unpredicted winds or terrain channeling are present. Greatest concern for enhanced winds is E to NE winds at ridgetops overnight, though a similar pattern last week did not produce significant wind impacts.

SPECIFIC:

Branch 10 (Div. J): Existing containment lines expected to hold. Remaining Interior heat will result in slow to moderate spread in areas of unburned fuel or re-burn in areas with significant needle cast.

Branch 25 (Div. U): Overall low flame lengths with low to moderate spread in areas without containment. Isolated torching of brush and small trees is likely as fuels remain dry and available for consumption

AIR OPERATIONS:

Air operations may be needed if fire escapes containment or during initial attack support. Inversions will impact air operations until late morning or early afternoon.

SAFETY

Strong thermal belts and poor overnight recovery can lead to lingering or even increasing fire activity overnight when resources expect less active burning. Be vigilant for fire in new places in the morning!





Communication Responsibilities

All Firefighters have five communication responsibilities

- ***Briefings** – All resources require briefings. Use briefing checklist in pocket guide.
- ***Debrief Actions** – as necessary. Use pocket guide After Action Review to stimulate discussion and provide guidance.
- ***Communicate Hazards to Others** –
- ***Acknowledge messages** –
- ***Ask if you do not know** –Ask questions in unfamiliar situations. The only dumb question is the one you did not ask.

The greatest problem with communication is the illusion that it has been achieved

Hazard Tree Felling

Felling a hazard tree requires accurate risk assessment and complexity analysis and demands the sawyer’s full situational awareness. In all cases, remember to establish and maintain a secure felling area.

Do not bypass hazard trees without taking some action such as felling or establishing a No-Work-Zone.

Degree of hazard varies with tree size, species, and type/location of defect:

- Stem defects resulting in tree failure
- Weakened sapwood resulting in loss of control when falling trees and limits solid wood for wedging.
- Overhead hazards, i.e., dead or hanging limbs falling on the faller.

Preventative Measures:

Social Distancing and Protective Equipment

- Initiate, practice, and remind others of social distancing.
- Conduct briefings and conversations outdoors and at least 6 feet apart.
 - Utilize face coverings as a tool when practical.
- Clean or replace dirty face coverings, equipment, and PPE.

Hygiene on the Fireline

- Properly wash or sanitize your hands often, especially before and after eating or entering a public place, and after coughing or sneezing.
 - Avoid handshakes and communal use items.

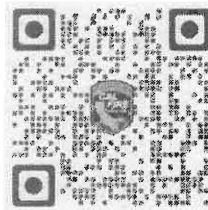

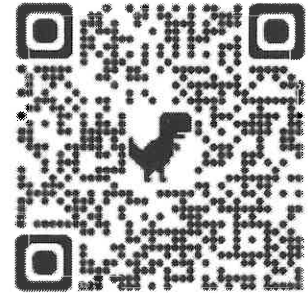

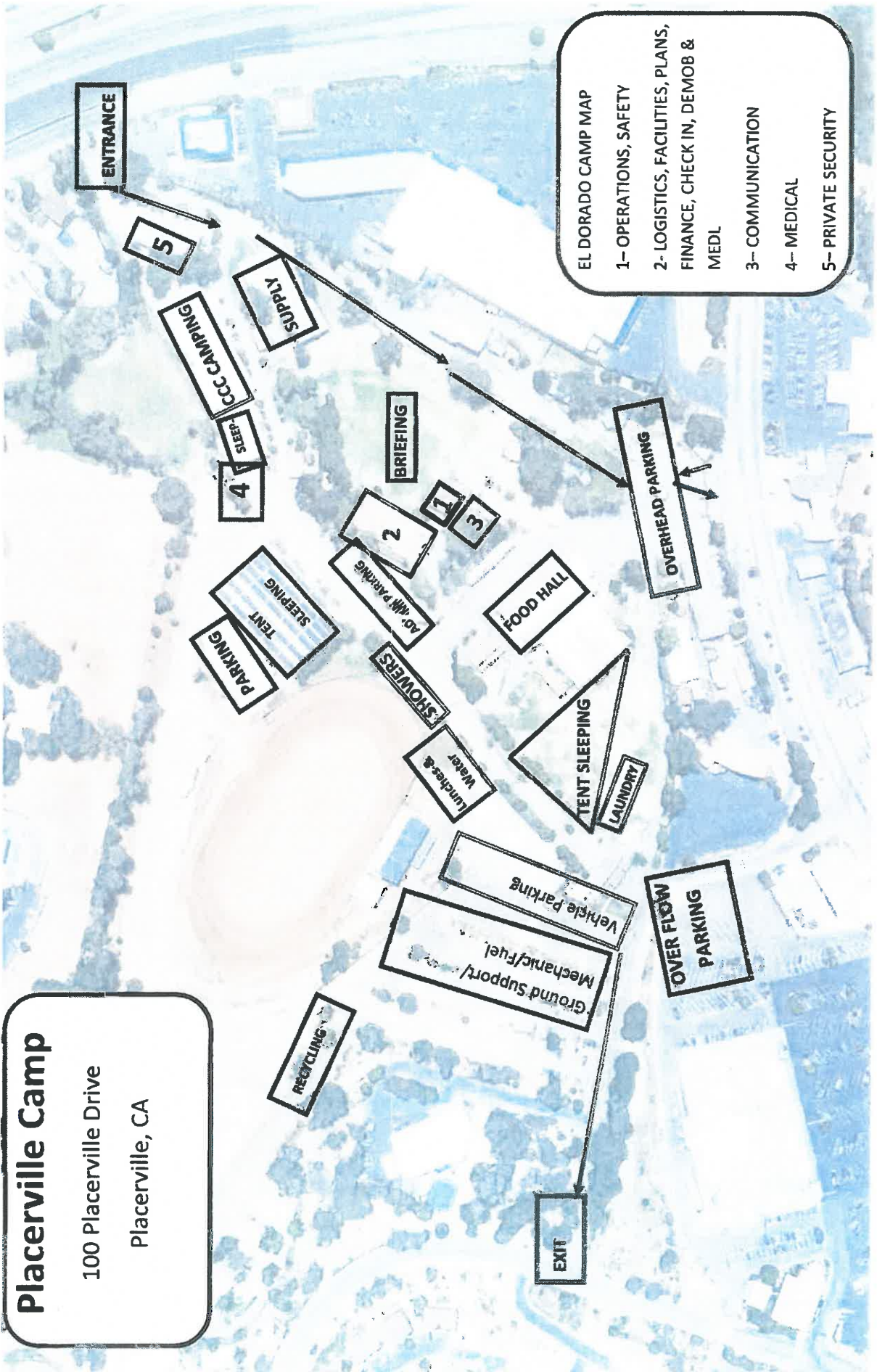
