...Gusty Southwest Winds Today with Gusty Northeast Winds Sunday into Early Monday...

<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> A storm system with a cold front moves through today bringing periods of rain, much cooler temperatures and southwest ridge winds gusting to 20 to 30 mph. Rainfall totals of 0.10" to 0.25" are expected. Drier weather returns Sunday, with breezy northeast winds and afternoon humidity levels dropping into the lower 20s. Northeast winds diminish early Monday, with low humidity in the afternoon. Temperatures remain cool this week, with overnight lows in the mid-30s to lower 40s.

<u>Saturday Weather:</u> Rain showers. Gusty southwest winds, especially in the morning. **TEMPERATURES:** 54-60 below 3000 feet and 50-57 3000-5000 feet...down 23 degrees.

**MINIMUM HUMIDITY:** 52-64%...up 40%.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - South southwest 10 to 20 mph with gusts to 30 mph through 0900, becoming west

southwest 6 to 10 mph with gusts to 18 mph in the afternoon.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – Southwest 4 to 8 mph.

**Saturday Night:** Partly cloudy becoming mostly clear and cool. Good RH recovery.

<u>OUTLOOK FOR SUNDAY:</u> Mostly sunny. Temperatures will remain cool. Humidity levels will drop, with afternoon minimums down to around 20%. Northeast winds 6 to 12 mph with gusts to 20 to 25 mph. Humidity recovery Sunday night into Monday morning is also expected to be lower, around 30-40%.

**EXTENDED FORECAST:** Dry weather continues Monday with temperatures remaining cool, with afternoon highs only in the 50s. Some gusty northeast winds expected in the morning, then shifting to the southwest in the afternoon. Humidity levels will be low in the afternoon, dropping into the teens. There is the potential for light rain to return Tuesday into Wednesday.

#### **OUTPUTS**

#### **FIRE BEHAVIOR**

#### **GENERAL:**

Fire activity and satellite heat detections have diminished in recent days because of consumption of most interior fuels. For Friday, potential for active fire spread remains in areas of isolated heat with unburned fuels or significant accumulations of needle fall. Increasing winds from the SW and W will be adverse to control lines on the eastern flanks of the fire, though limited residual heat, cooler temperatures, and increasing RH values reduce fire behavior concerns. Increasing overnight RH values will also reduce fine fuel availability and reduce fire behavior potential.

Saturday has the least potential for active fire behavior due to highest RH values, cloud cover and precipitation chances. There will be minimal fire spread and smoke production in these conditions, with low to non-existent flame lengths.

From Sunday onward, winds become more northerly with some periods of breeziness. Expect continued elevated overnight RH values but a drop in daytime humidity back to low 20's or upper teens. Residual moisture from Saturday precipitation should continue to limit fire behavior potential. However, if precipitation does not occur and winds impact areas of heat near control lines, moderate spread and low flame lengths are possible.

#### SPECIFIC:

**Branch 10 (North):** Increasing winds Friday and Saturday are across lines in Div. K&J, though no problematic fire behavior expected. Higher elevations have best chance for precipitation Saturday. **Branch 25 (South):** Increasing winds Friday and Saturday are adverse to lines in Div. M & R, though no significant movement expected due to elevated RH and reductions in overall remaining heat. Winds on subsequent days adverse to Div. Y & U, though no control issues anticipated. Best chances for precipitation at highest, eastern elevations on Saturday.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

Air operations may be challenging as breezy winds develop and change direction over the coming days. Precipitation and clouds may also inhibit aerial operations. Fire behavior not expected to necessitate air resources.

#### SAFETY

The fire area has not had a significant wind test for multiple weeks. Though problematic fire behavior is not expected, winds can still have impacts on patrol and repair operations. Be aware of fire weakened trees, hangers, and widow-makes as winds increase and change direction.


