...Gusty Northeast Winds Early this Morning, Shifting Southwest in the Afternoon...

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Dry weather continues today, with breezy northeast ridge winds ending by mid morning, then shifting to the southwest in the afternoon. Humidity levels will trend down today, with poor to moderate humidity recovery in the morning then low afternoon humidity in the afternoon. The winds and low humidity will bring elevated fire concerns at times. Temperatures start the day very cool, in the mid-30s to lower 40s and then rise into the 50s to mid 60s. Tuesday trends cooler and cloudier, with humidity increasing. There is a slight chance of light rain Tuesday night into Wednesday and again over the weekend.

Monday Weather: Sunny. Lower humidity.

**TEMPERATURES**: 59-65 below 3000 feet and 52-59 3000-5000 feet...up 3 degrees.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 17-23%...down 3%.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Northeast 6 to 12 mph with gusts to 20 mph through 1000, then shifting to southwest 4

to 7 mph with gusts to 12 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Downslope 3 to 7 mph through 1200, becoming up canyon 4 to 8 mph in the

afternoon.

**WEATHER SUMMARY:** Weather will continue to be highly variable, alternating between low-pressure areas and weak high-pressure ridges moving through the fire area. Main initial concerns will be brief return of low RH values and poor overnight recoveries along with some breezy winds lingering this morning. Better RH recoveries, cloudy skies and slight chances for precipitation return Tuesday and Wednesday. On Thursday, expect a return of clear, dry weather with some enhanced winds. Wind direction generally SW-W through the forecast period, Monday early morning lingering N to NE winds being the exception.

### FIRE BEHAVIOR

### **GENERAL:**

Light precipitation and good overnight humidity recoveries over the first part of the past weekend have reduced the availability of the overall fuel complex compared to previous weeks under the warm and dry high pressure that dominated the weather. This is evidenced by the recent drop in ERC values to well below the 90th percentile, though still above average for the time of year. Last night's RH recovery was not great, but the preceding days will continue to impact overall fuels availability long enough to get into the next period of elevated RH and slight chances for precipitation on Tuesday.

On Monday, expect any areas of remaining heat to have sufficient drying to produce visible smoke, particularly when exposed to sunlight. However, the reduced availability of the overall fuel complex should keep any active spread to very slow rates of spread and minimal flame lengths. Direct actions and mop-up by hand will be effective for any heat detected close enough to control lines to require attention. The drying weather, uptick in winds on previous days, and clear skies may increase visibility of smoke for the public and thus increase calls for service, though no control issues are expected.

From Tuesday onward, the return of cloudy weather with elevated daytime RH values, reasonable overnight RH recovery and slight chances for precipitation will further mute fire behavior, resulting in minimal to no active fire spread. Dry and clearer weather returns briefly on Thursday, with little change expected in fire behavior.

### SPECIFIC:

Branch 10 (North): No control issues expected as fire has reached 100% containment. Branch 25 (South): No control issues expected as fire has reached 100% containment.

### **AIR OPERATIONS:**

Fire behavior is not expected to require the use of aerial resources. If air resources are needed for logistical support or medical extraction, diminishing winds should be conducive but periods of breeziness in afternoon/ evening are possible. No significant smoke inversions expected due to alternating low-pressure systems providing good dispersion. Cloud cover mid-week may hamper air operations and will need to be assessed for specific mission requirements.

### **SAFETY**

Mop-up and suppression repair are critical elements of overall successful fire suppression and fire management. Treat these missions with as much caution and thoughtfulness as an active fire suppression mission.

Be aware of stump holes, ash pits, snags and other areas that become more hazardous the longer fire burns and consumes organic material.

Currently, the ICP at Placerville will be the main location where resources will be released. A tentative release page will be in the IAP identifying resources that are timing out and/or excess to the incident.

The time identified for your release is the time to report to finance. You can pick up the 221-checkout sheet in the morning prior to that and gather the other required signatures.

If you have checked out any communication equipment, you will need to return it to the communication trailer located at the Placerville fairgrounds.


