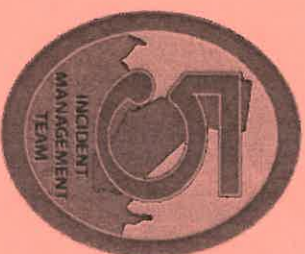

.DISCUSSION...

An unstable atmosphere continues this afternoon allowing for the fire to be plume dominated this afternoon. Conditions through early this evening may allow for isolated lightning to occur within this cloud. Instability decreases overnight, with weak instability again tomorrow afternoon which may allow for similar fire conditions in the afternoon.

Hot and extremely dry conditions continue for Friday with poor overnight recoveries continuing into Saturday. Winds are generally terrain driven on Friday, with increased onshore flow for Saturday. Cooler temperatures and increasing humidity this weekend.

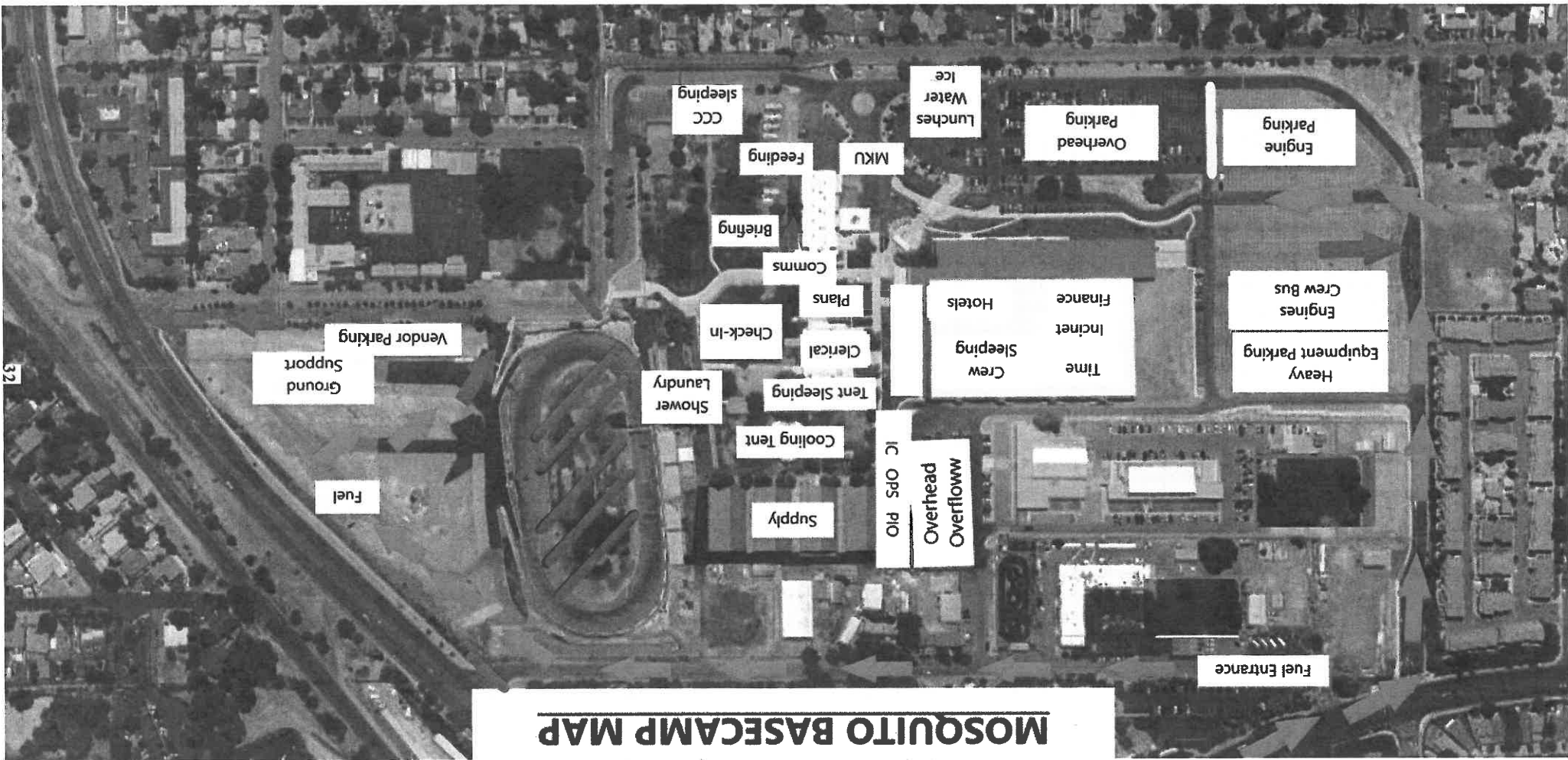
