WEATHER DISCUSSION: There will be a change in the large scale weather pattern today as an incoming weather system will push any remnant moisture well to our east. The main impact will be slightly stronger southwest winds on the ridges and above the canopy. This will help with better ventilation for the first time ir several days as drier air aloft moves over the region. The weather system will keep temperatures running near or even slightly below normal. Winds will ease by nightfall with smoke settling over the drainages. Moderate to good humidity recovery with cooler overnight temperatures.

Monday Weather:

TEMPERATURES: 80-85 below 2000 feet and 75-80 2000-4000 feet. Coolest under thick smoke.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 25-30%...a trend of 2-5% wetter.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Light early then becoming Southwest 5-10 mph afternoon hours.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light through midday then upcanyon 3-7 mph gusts 10-12 mph afternoon.

INVERSION: Moderate morning inversion slowly lifting by 1300 hours. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 5000 feet

Monday Night: Smoke settling over the area with easing winds and good humidity recovery.

TEMPERATURES: 58-64 a trend of 2-4 degrees cooler.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 55-65% a trend of 5-10% wetter

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southwest 5-10 mph through sunset then turning Southeast 3-6 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Evening upcanyons 4-8 mph thru sunset then downcanyon 2-5 mph

STABILITY/INVERSION: Strong inversion setting up overnight below 2500 feet.

OUTLOOK FOR TUESDAY: No big changes as a persistent trough sets up on the West Coast keeping Southwest winds in place. Temperatures trending near to below normal (74-84) with moderate humidity values of 28-38% afternoons and good recovery at night 60-80%.

EXTENDED FORECAST: A dry cold front on Wednesday will bring breezy Southwest ridgetop winds with gusts 20-25 mph possible. Temperatures will be seasonably cool in the 70s and lower 80s. A gradual rebound in temperatures Thursday and Friday but continued Southwest winds will be the dominant weather feature of note through the end of the week.

SPECIFIC:

Branch III / V / XX / XXV: Areas of unburned fuels could present challenges to control lines. Watch for rollout. Potential exists for slope reversal and upslope runs, especially around Buckeye Point & Baltimore Mine Rd.

Branch X: Prominent ridgelines & large drainages in alignment with wind. Potential for larger growth in North Fork Middle Fork American River/Ralston Ridge/Mosquito Ridge & El Dorado Canyon/Deadwood Ridge/Chicken Hawk Ridge. American Fire area now 9-year-old Grass-Shrub.

Branch XV: Potential for fuels-driven fire. King Fire mix of 8-year-old Grass-Shrub and Timber Understory. If fire establishes in Rubicon River, watch for wind eddies driving fire in multiple directions & upslope run toward Big Grizzly Canyon. Long Canyon/Ralston Ridge in alignment with wind for possible upslope fire run.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Much better visibility as weather transitions. SW wind should ventilate fire.

Mixing height: 5,000 ft. AGL, Transport winds: SW 5-10 mph, Sunrise 0642, Sunset 1916.

SAFETY

Fire area with history of blowups, burnovers, and near misses: Ponderosa Fire (2001) and King Fire (2014). ERCs, 100-hr, & 1,000-hr fuels at record levels. Fuels can drive fire, especially as skies clear.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

September 2nd, 2022



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically elevated fire danger indices, low live and dead fuel moistures, and very hot and dry conditions across much of northern California.

Discussion: An extended period of hot, dry weather with embedded periods of enhanced winds will impact Northern California. The elevated fire weather concerns with fuels reaching their yearly minimum moisture values will create conditions conducive to long range spotting, rapid fire growth, and high resistance to control.

Difference from normal conditions: The current values for Energy Release Component (ERC) are at or above the 90th percentile for the majority of Northern California, with live fuel moistures dropping to critical levels as herbaceous and woody fuels cure. These conditions will be exacerbated by a predicted heat wave, resulting in anomalous daytime highs with little relief in temperature or humidity recovery overnight. Some PSA's, may reach daily record ERC values, with all covered PSA's predicted to reach or exceed the 97th percentile for an extended period. The combination of extreme ERC's with high temperatures and poor overnight humidity recovery is highly correlated with extreme fire behavior in Northern California.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- The advisory coincides with the Labor Day holiday weekend that is likely to result in increased outdoor recreation and visitor use to public lands across Northern California. The increase in public use carries an increased risk of fire starts as well as potential for evacuations of visitors/ recreational users in the event of a fire starting.
- Energy Release Component (ERC) in areas covered by this advisory are at or above the 90th percentile and are expected to approach or exceed the 97th percentile. **Anticipate increased spread rates, long range spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought, a building heat wave, and a very dry atmosphere will continue to decrease already low fuel moisture values:
 - o 1000-hour fuel moistures are below average and approaching the 90th percentile.
 - Live woody fuel moisture in brush is near or slightly below average, making them readily available and will likely reach critical levels because of the forecasted hot, dry weather.
 - The above average herbaceous fuel load at low and mid elevations (below 5,000 ft.) is fully cured, with high elevation herbaceous fuels rapidly curing during the hot, dry forecast.
 - Higher than average surface fuel loading is present in areas that experienced winter snow and ice storms in the Coast Range and northern Sierra Nevada.

Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.

- Periods of enhanced winds are expected during the hot and dry period. Given the current and anticipated fuels conditions, increases in winds will make direct attack of any new starts difficult and may hamper use of aerial resources.
- Review the current North Ops Outlooks and national fuels and fire behavior advisories.

Mitigation Measures:

- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates
- Fire managers should be aware of high use recreation and visitor sites in their area. The holiday weekend will bring increased visitor use, increasing risk of starts during critical fire weather.

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast, Bay Marine, and west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino.



- Critically elevated fire indices, low live and dead fuel moistures; do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels

Planning for Medical Emergencies (see IRPG Page 2)

Prior to each operational period, Incident Commanders, supervisors, and all wildland firefighters need to ask and be able to answer the following three questions:

- 1. What are we going to do if someone gets hurt?
 - Are there personnel on your crew/division/fire that can provide medical support?
 - What type of equipment is available to treat and transport injured personnel?
- 2. How will we get them out of here?
 - Could you get an injured firefighter to a road or to a helispot?
 - How many personnel and what kind of equipment would you need to get an injured firefighter out?
- 3. How long will it take to get them to a hospital?
 - Where is the closest hospital?
 - Will you use air or ground transportation?
 - Could conditions change and affect the transportation timeline?
- Smoke/clouds/nightfall
- Fire behavior
- Mechanical failures

Risk Management Process: Implement the risk management process for all aspects of this ongoing event. The steps of the risk management process are:

- 1. Situation Awareness
- 2. Hazard Assessment
- 3. Hazard Control
- 4. Decision Point
- 5. Evaluate

Date of Occurrence: Enter the date the property was broken, left on line or damaged.

Quantity: Enter the quantity for the line item.
