<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION:</u> A weak weather system will pass over the area today and bring subtle but potentially noteworthy changes to the fire environment. The system will bring slightly stronger southwest winds aloft that will help to break the inversion earlier and ventilate the fire after 1300 hours. For the first time in several days we expect less cloud cover that will increase solar radiation on the fuels. Temperatures will remain below normal for mid-September with moderate humidity values but these features will likely be offset by the increased sunshine, earlier inversion break and increased southwesterly ridgetop winds.

Tuesday Weather:

TEMPERATURES: 79-84 below 2000 feet and 73-78 2000-4000 feet. Coolest under thick smoke.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 25-30%...under full sunshine otherwise 35-40% smoky areas. Little overall change.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - South 5 mph early becoming Southwest 6-12 mph gusts 18 mph afternoon hours.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light through midday then upcanyon 3-7 mph gusts 10-15 mph afternoon.

INVERSION: Moderate morning inversion lifting between 1300-1400 hours. MIXING HEIGHT: 4500 feet

Tuesday Night: Smoke settling over the area with easing winds and good humidity recovery.

TEMPERATURES: 52-62 a trend of 2-4 degrees cooler.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 55-65% a trend of 4-8% wetter.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southwest 5-10 mph through sunset then turning Southeast 3-6 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Evening upcanyons 4-8 mph thru sunset then downcanyon 2-5 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate inversion setting up overnight below 4000 feet.

OUTLOOK FOR WEDNESDAY A dry cold front on Wednesday will bring breezy Southwest ridgetop winds with gusts 20-25 mph possible. The stronger winds and cooling aloft should allow the inversion to break early with a longer afternoon burn period. Temperatures will be seasonably cool in the 70s and lower 80s. Afternoon humidity 25-35% with moderate night time recovery to around 60%.

EXTENDED FORECAST: A West Coast trough will bring continued below normal temperatures with good nighttime humidity recovery. General winds will remain Southwest 6-12 mph with stronger ridgetop gusts. Highs mainly in the 70s to lower 80s. Lows 50s to around 60. This trend lasts at least into the weekend.

Expect group torching and upslope/ridgeline runs.

Weather transition with better ventilation continues. Fuels remain critically dry with record-breaking ERC, BI, 100-hr, & 1,000-hr values.

SPECIFIC:

Branch III / V / XXV: Minimal spread expected barring rollout or spotting from wind gusts.

Branch X: Heavier fuel loading outside of American Fire scar in Grouse Creek to Peavine Ridge, Mosquito Ridge, & Ralston Ridge. Look for wind alignment with ridgelines & wind gusts. Group torching expected, with possibility for short crown runs, especially during wind gusts.

Branch XV: King Fire scar should slow ROS, but still expect torching & spotting. Long Canyon & Ralston Ridge in alignment with wind for possible upslope fire run.

Branch XX: Fire spread in Branch XX will be flanking fire toward Ballard Ravine and Stumpy Meadows. Fire's primary direction of spread will be toward Branch XV (Pigeon & Big Grizzly Canyons).

AIR OPERATIONS:

Much better visibility as weather transitions. SW wind should ventilate fire.

Mixing height: 4,000 ft. AGL, Transport winds: SW 10-15 mph, Sunrise 0643, Sunset 1915.

SAFETY

Fire area with history of blowups, burnovers, and near misses: Ponderosa Fire (2001) and King Fire (2014). ERCs, 100-hr, & 1,000-hr fuels at record levels. Fuels can drive fire, especially as skies clear.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

September 2nd, 2022



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically elevated fire danger indices, low live and dead fuel moistures, and very hot and dry conditions across much of northern California.

Discussion: An extended period of hot, dry weather with embedded periods of enhanced winds will impact Northern California. The elevated fire weather concerns with fuels reaching their yearly minimum moisture values will create conditions conducive to long range spotting, rapid fire growth, and high resistance to control.

Difference from normal conditions: The current values for Energy Release Component (ERC) are at or above the 90th percentile for the majority of Northern California, with live fuel moistures dropping to critical levels as herbaceous and woody fuels cure. These conditions will be exacerbated by a predicted heat wave, resulting in anomalous daytime highs with little relief in temperature or humidity recovery overnight. Some PSA's, may reach daily record ERC values, with all covered PSA's predicted to reach or exceed the 97th percentile for an extended period. The combination of extreme ERC's with high temperatures and poor overnight humidity recovery is highly correlated with extreme fire behavior in Northern California.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- The advisory coincides with the Labor Day holiday weekend that is likely to result in increased outdoor recreation and visitor use to public lands across Northern California. The increase in public use carries an increased risk of fire starts as well as potential for evacuations of visitors/ recreational users in the event of a fire starting.
- Energy Release Component (ERC) in areas covered by this advisory are at or above the 90th percentile and are expected to approach or exceed the 97th percentile. **Anticipate increased spread rates, long range spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought, a building heat wave, and a very dry atmosphere will continue to decrease already low fuel moisture values:
 - o 1000-hour fuel moistures are below average and approaching the 90th percentile,
 - Live woody fuel moisture in brush is near or slightly below average, making them readily available and will likely reach critical levels because of the forecasted hot, dry weather.
 - The above average herbaceous fuel load at low and mid elevations (below 5,000 ft.) is fully cured, with high elevation herbaceous fuels rapidly curing during the hot, dry forecast.
 - Higher than average surface fuel loading is present in areas that experienced winter snow and ice storms in the Coast Range and northern Sierra Nevada.

Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.

- Periods of enhanced winds are expected during the hot and dry period. Given the current and anticipated fuels conditions, increases in winds will make direct attack of any new starts difficult and may hamper use of aerial resources.
- Review the current North Ops Outlooks and national fuels and fire behavior advisories.

Mitigation Measures:

- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates
- Fire managers should be aware of high use recreation and visitor sites in their area. The holiday weekend will bring increased visitor use, increasing risk of starts during critical fire weather.

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast, Bay Marine, and west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino.

Accountability

- Know where your crewmembers are at all times.
- Have crewmembers work in pairs.
- Do you have the buddy system set in place on the fireline?
- Inform Division or your Supervisor of changing locations.
- Do you know how to use your radio and is it cloned?
- Check IN with the Division Supervisor on site if not assigned there.
- Check OUT with your supervisor (Or Division) at the end of shift.

Watch Out Situation #12

Cannot see main fire; not in contact with someone who can.

- Ensure the correct communication channel and communications is effective.
- Ensure Lookout is communicating updates of weather and fire behavior on a continuing basis.
- Secure escape routes and safety zones before engaging.

Look Up, Look Down, Look Around

- Look Up: Check the sky for any weather changes such as building or approaching thunderstorms, wind shifts or increases in speed. Watch for air operations and water drops. Look for snags.
- Look Down: Watch your footing. Keep an eye out for snakes, poison oak, bee's nests and observe fine fuels on the ground.
- Look Around Check fuel loading in the area, general terrain, current fire behavior and ladder fuels. Keep an eye on fellow firefighters for signs of heat stress and smoke inhalation.



Human Resource Message

HARASSMENT FREE WORKPLACE POLICY

The Forest Service strives for a harassment-free work environment where people treat on another with respect. 


