- Keep the fire South of Foresthill Road.
- Keep the fire East of Drivers Flat Road.
- Keep the fire West of Eleven Pines.



WEATHER DISCUSSION: A weak weather system will exit the area today bringing continued breezy southwest winds for the afternoon. This should break the inversion early and ventilate the fire after 1300 hours. Mostly sunny conditions and good ventilation will bring quite a lot of sun on the fuels. Temperatures will cool further today and will be below normal for mid-September. Humidity values will trend higher with continued onshore flow, but these features will likely be offset by the increased sunshine, early inversion break and increased southwesterly ridgetop winds.

Wednesday Weather:

TEMPERATURES: 75-79 below 2000 feet and 67-73 2000-5000 feet. Coolest under thick smoke.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 27-35% a trend of 5 to 10% higher

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southeast 2-5 mph early becoming Southwest 6-11 mph gusts 15-20 mph afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light upslope through midday then up canyon 3-7 mph gusts 10-15 mph afternoon.

INVERSION: Moderate morning inversion lifting around 1300 hours. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 4000 feet

Wednesday Night: Smoke settling into drainages with easing winds and good humidity recovery.

TEMPERATURES: 50-60 a trend of 2-4 degrees cooler.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 62-72% a trend of 5-8% wetter.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southwest 5-10 mph through sunset then turning Southeast 3-6 mph.


SLOPE/VALLEY - Evening up canyon 5-9 mph thru sunset then down canyon 4-6 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate inversion setting up overnight below 4000 feet.

OUTLOOK FOR THURSDAY A dry cold front on Wednesday will bring breezy Southwest ridgetop winds with gusts 20-25 mph possible. The stronger winds and cooling aloft should allow the inversion to break early with a longer afternoon burn period. Temperatures will be seasonably cool in the 70s and lower 80s. Afternoon humidity 25-35% with moderate night time recovery to around 60%.

EXTENDED FORECAST: A West Coast trough will bring continued below normal temperatures with good nighttime humidity recovery. General winds will remain Southwest 6-12 mph with stronger ridgetop gusts. Highs mainly in the 70s to lower 80s. Lows 50s to around 60. This trend lasts at least into the weekend.

SPECIFIC:

Branch III / V / XXV: Rollout, spotting, and wind gusts can cause additional control issues along Middle Fork.

Branch X: Heavier fuel loading outside of American Fire scar in Grouse Creek to Peavine Ridge, Mosquito Ridge, & Ralston Ridge. Look for wind alignment with ridgelines & wind gusts. Group torching expected, with possibility for short crown runs, especially during wind gusts.

Branch XV: King Fire scar should slow ROS, but still expect torching & spotting. Long Canyon & Ralston Ridge in alignment with wind for possible upslope fire run.

Branch XX: Fire spread in Branch XX will be flanking fire toward Ballard Ravine and Stumpy Meadows. Fire's primary direction of spread will be toward Branch XV (Pigeon & Big Grizzly Canyons).

AIR OPERATIONS:

Clear air.

Mixing height: 4,000 ft. AGL, Transport winds: SW 10-15 mph, Sunrise 0644, Sunset 1913.

SAFETY

Fire area with history of blowups, burnovers, and near misses: Ponderosa Fire (2001) and King Fire (2014). ERCs, 100-hr, & 1,000-hr fuels at record levels. Fuels can drive fire, especially under clear sky.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

September 2nd, 2022



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically elevated fire danger indices, low live and dead fuel moistures, and very hot and dry conditions across much of northern California.

Discussion: An extended period of hot, dry weather with embedded periods of enhanced winds will impact Northern California. The elevated fire weather concerns with fuels reaching their yearly minimum moisture values will create conditions conducive to long range spotting, rapid fire growth, and high resistance to control.

Difference from normal conditions: The current values for Energy Release Component (ERC) are at or above the 90th percentile for the majority of Northern California, with live fuel moistures dropping to critical levels as herbaceous and woody fuels cure. These conditions will be exacerbated by a predicted heat wave, resulting in anomalous daytime highs with little relief in temperature or humidity recovery overnight. Some PSA's, may reach daily record ERC values, with all covered PSA's predicted to reach or exceed the 97th percentile for an extended period. The combination of extreme ERC's with high temperatures and poor overnight humidity recovery is highly correlated with extreme fire behavior in Northern California.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- The advisory coincides with the Labor Day holiday weekend that is likely to result in increased outdoor recreation and visitor use to public lands across Northern California. The increase in public use carries an increased risk of fire starts as well as potential for evacuations of visitors/ recreational users in the event of a fire starting.
- Energy Release Component (ERC) in areas covered by this advisory are at or above the 90th percentile and are expected to approach or exceed the 97th percentile. **Anticipate increased spread rates, long range spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought, a building heat wave, and a very dry atmosphere will continue to decrease already low fuel moisture values:
 - 1000-hour fuel moistures are below average and approaching the 90th percentile,
 - Live woody fuel moisture in brush is near or slightly below average, making them readily available and will likely reach critical levels because of the forecasted hot, dry weather.
 - The above average herbaceous fuel load at low and mid elevations (below 5,000 ft.) is fully cured, with high elevation herbaceous fuels rapidly curing during the hot, dry forecast.
 - Higher than average surface fuel loading is present in areas that experienced winter snow and ice storms in the Coast Range and northern Sierra Nevada.

Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.

- Periods of enhanced winds are expected during the hot and dry period. Given the current and anticipated fuels conditions, increases in winds will make direct attack of any new starts difficult and may hamper use of aerial resources.

Mitigation Measures:

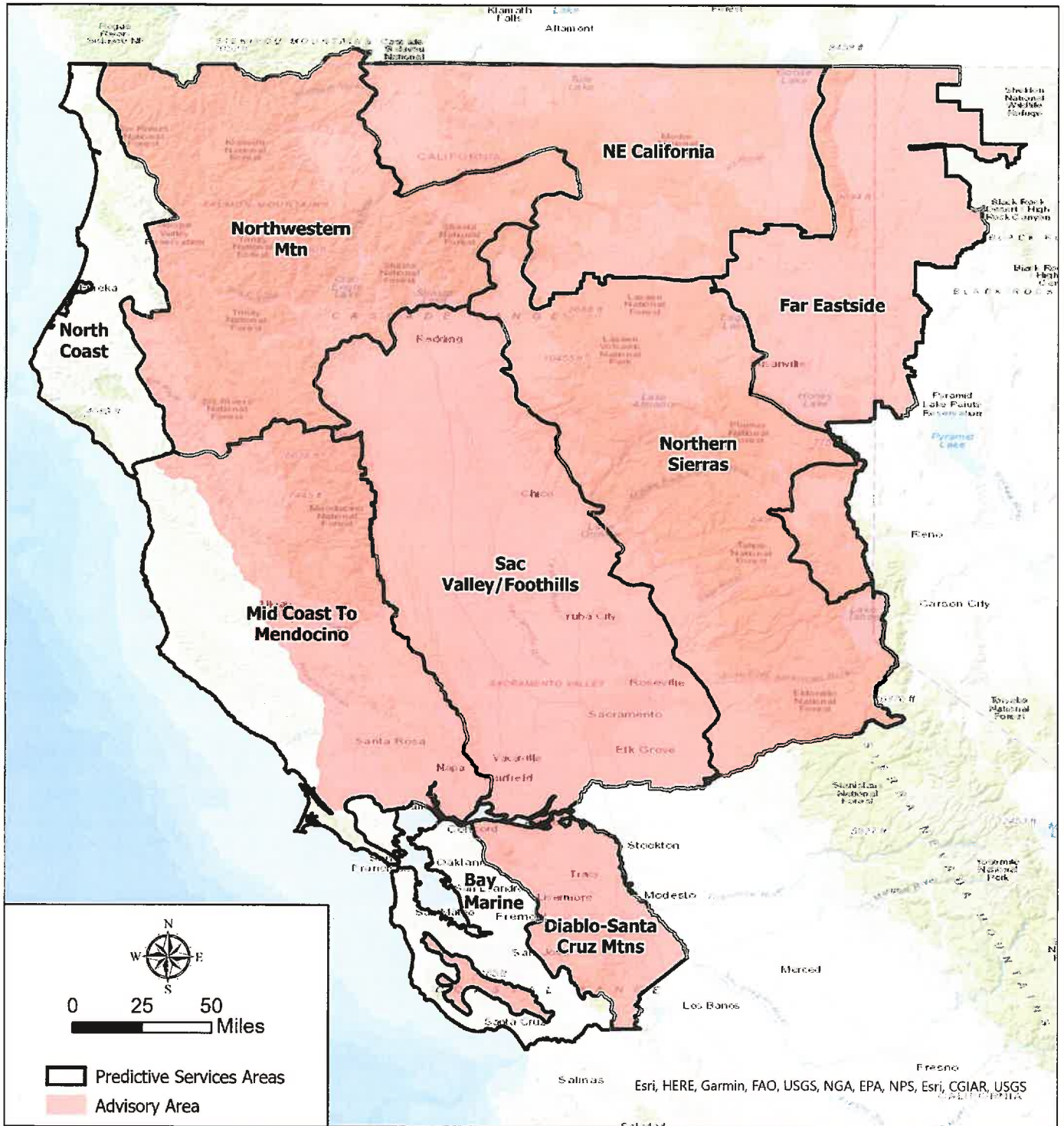
- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates**
- Fire managers should be aware of high use recreation and visitor sites in their area. **The holiday weekend will bring increased visitor use, increasing risk of starts during critical fire weather.**

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast, Bay Marine, and west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino.

Hydration

With continued physically demanding operational periods, expect and predict fatigue of all crew members working in and around your division. Take the following steps to address hydration:

1. You should never underestimate the effects that the caffeine and stimulants in energy drinks could have on your body. Especially in the summer heat, you could experience **severe dehydration, elevated blood pressure, and heat related illness or cardiac arrest.**
2. Electrolyte replacement powder or tablet mixers may be high in sodium. Please follow the package instructions. While mixing multiple packs or tablets make the drink taste better, it is counterproductive and will accelerate dehydration.
3. What goes in, must come out. Monitor urine output. If what is going in, is not coming out, that is a red flag. If the output is dark in nature, that is a big red flag.

Heat Related Illness

Heat Stroke - A condition that occurs when the body becomes unable to control its temperature, and can cause death or permanent disability. Description of signs and symptoms include:

- Confusion, loss of coordination.
- Throbbing headaches.
- High body temperature. Loss of ability to sweat.
- Seizures, coma.

Heat Exhaustion- The body's response to an excessive loss of water and salt, usually through sweating.

- Heavy sweating, extreme weakness or fatigue.
- Dizziness, nausea, vomiting, irritability.
- Fast, shallow breathing.
- Trouble concentrating, loss in coordination.

Heat Cramps- Affects workers who sweat a lot during strenuous activity. Sweating depletes the body's salt and moisture levels.

- Muscle cramps, pain, or spasms in the abdomen, arms or legs.

Personal Hygiene and Illness Prevention

With shared utilities such as sleeping quarters, restrooms and the chow hall, the chance of spreading illness and infection is a concern. Take the following steps to limit your exposure to illness or infection:

- Stay well nourished and get your rest.
- Use handwashing stations routinely.
- Avoid contact with social surfaces (handrails, doorknobs) without washing hands after.
- Small bottles of hand sanitizer are available at the Medical Support Unit.
- Follow all CDC and Agency COVID 19 protocols.
- Notify a supervisor and the Medical Unit if you are not feeling well.

Competent and confident leadership means to provide purpose, direction, and motivation.

- **TAKE CHARGE** of assigned resources.
- **ASSESS SITUATION** by getting intel.
- **MOTIVATE** with a can do and positive attitude.
- **DEMONSTRATE INITIATIVE** and act based on a sound decision making process.
- **COMMUNICATE** by giving specific instructions and following up.
- **SUPERVISE** at the scene of assignment.
