

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Onshore flow continues today with lighter southwest ridge winds for the afternoon. Mostly sunny conditions and good ventilation will bring quite a lot of sun on the fuels, except for areas shaded by smoke. Temperatures will be cool again today and will be below normal for mid-September. Humidity values will trend higher with continued onshore flow, but these features will likely be offset by the increased sunshine, early inversion break and increased southwesterly ridgetop winds.

Thursday Weather:

TEMPERATURES: 70-75 below 2000 feet and 62-69 2000-5000 feet. Coolest under thick smoke.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 28-38%...under full sunshine otherwise 40-47% smoky areas. Little change.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southeast 2-5 mph early becoming southwest 4-7 mph gusts to 11 mph afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light upslope through midday then up canyon 3-7 mph gusts 4 to 8 mph afternoon.

INVERSION: Moderate morning inversion lifting around 1400 hours. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 4100 feet

Thursday Night: Smoke settling into drainages with easing winds and good humidity recovery.

TEMPERATURES: 50-59 Little change.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 60-70% Little change.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southwest 4-7 mph through sunset then turning southeast 3-6 mph.


SLOPE/VALLEY - Evening up canyon 5-9 mph through sunset, down canyon 4-7 mph after 2300.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate inversion setting up overnight below 4000 feet.

OUTLOOK FOR FRIDAY Southwest ridgetop winds with gusts to 10 mph. Temperatures will be seasonably cool in the 60s and lower 70s. Afternoon humidity 28-45% with moderate night time recovery to around 60%.

EXTENDED FORECAST: Cooler weather is expected Saturday, with highs in the 60s and increasing southwest ridge winds gusting to 20 mph. Periods of rain showers are possible late Saturday night into early next week and could potentially bring wetting rain.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Clear Air: group torching and upslope/ridgeline runs; smolder under smoke.

Different burning environments – under smoke (Branch 3/5/10) vs clear air (Branch 15/20). Fuels remain critically dry with ERC, BI, 100-hr, & 1,000-hr values still above 90th percentile.

SPECIFIC:

Branch III / V / XXV: Rollout, spotting, and wind gusts can cause additional control issues along Middle Fork.

Branch X: Group torching expected, even under smoke cover. DIV H fuels young manzanita, ceanothus, & conifer seedlings. DIV J mixed conifer. Brush not fully consuming but 1-, 10-, & 100-hr fully consuming.

Branch XV: Group torching with possible crown runs upslope and with wind gusts, especially with clear air.

Branch XX: DIV GG minimal spread expected. DIV CC should see wind & slope drive fire toward Pigeon & Big Grizzly Canyons (DIV R).

AIR OPERATIONS:

Clear air in the south; smoke impacts in the north.

Mixing height: 4,000 ft. AGL, Transport winds: SW 5-10 mph, Sunrise 0645, Sunset 1911.

SAFETY

Limited visibility may give you a false sense of security. Lookouts are a must especially in thick brushy areas. Visibility is also hampered by smoke and dust. Make sure you know what the fire is doing at all times.

Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory

Northern California

September 2nd, 2022



Subject: Potential for extreme fire behavior due to critically elevated fire danger indices, low live and dead fuel moistures, and very hot and dry conditions across much of northern California.

Discussion: An extended period of hot, dry weather with embedded periods of enhanced winds will impact Northern California. The elevated fire weather concerns with fuels reaching their yearly minimum moisture values will create conditions conducive to long range spotting, rapid fire growth, and high resistance to control.

Difference from normal conditions: The current values for Energy Release Component (ERC) are at or above the 90th percentile for the majority of Northern California, with live fuel moistures dropping to critical levels as herbaceous and woody fuels cure. These conditions will be exacerbated by a predicted heat wave, resulting in anomalous daytime highs with little relief in temperature or humidity recovery overnight. Some PSA's, may reach daily record ERC values, with all covered PSA's predicted to reach or exceed the 97th percentile for an extended period. The combination of extreme ERC's with high temperatures and poor overnight humidity recovery is highly correlated with extreme fire behavior in Northern California.

Concerns to Firefighters and the Public:

- The advisory coincides with the Labor Day holiday weekend that is likely to result in increased outdoor recreation and visitor use to public lands across Northern California. The increase in public use carries an increased risk of fire starts as well as potential for evacuations of visitors/ recreational users in the event of a fire starting.
- Energy Release Component (ERC) in areas covered by this advisory are at or above the 90th percentile and are expected to approach or exceed the 97th percentile. **Anticipate increased spread rates, long range spotting, and active nighttime burning.**
- The combination of persistent drought, a building heat wave, and a very dry atmosphere will continue to decrease already low fuel moisture values:
 - 1000-hour fuel moistures are below average and approaching the 90th percentile.
 - Live woody fuel moisture in brush is near or slightly below average, making them readily available and will likely reach critical levels because of the forecasted hot, dry weather.
 - The above average herbaceous fuel load at low and mid elevations (below 5,000 ft.) is fully cured, with high elevation herbaceous fuels rapidly curing during the hot, dry forecast.
 - Higher than average surface fuel loading is present in areas that experienced winter snow and ice storms in the Coast Range and northern Sierra Nevada.

Expect fires to ignite easier and spread faster. Do not expect fires to exhibit reduced fire behavior when entering areas of live fuels; anticipate increased spread rates and spotting.

- Periods of enhanced winds are expected during the hot and dry period. Given the current and anticipated fuels conditions, increases in winds will make direct attack of any new starts difficult and may hamper use of aerial resources.
- Review the current [North Ops Outlooks](#) and [national fuels and fire behavior advisories](#).

Mitigation Measures:

- Suppression actions need to be based on good anchor points, escape routes, and safety zones. **Remember LCES. Experienced lookouts are essential under these conditions.**
- Base all actions on current and expected behavior of the fire. **Augment initial attack resources as incident activity dictates**
- Fire managers should be aware of high use recreation and visitor sites in their area. **The holiday weekend will bring increased visitor use, increasing risk of starts during critical fire weather.**

Area of Concern: Northern California except for the following Predictive Service Areas: North Coast, Bay Marine, and west of Highway 101 in Mid-Coast to Mendocino.

Unit Supervisors Approval:

If submitted on an incident this section must be completed by the supervisor of the property custodian. This may be the Strike Team Leader, Division Supervisor, Receiving and Distribution Manager, Supply Unit Leader, Logistics Section Chief, Agency Representative or Incident Commander.

If submitted at the home Unit this section must also be completed by the supervisor of the property custodian. This may be a Battalion or Division Chief.

Comments: Supervisors may enter comments of approval or disapproval.

Signature of Unit Administrator: Signature of Unit Supervisor reviewing the certification described.

Title: Title of the signature.

Date: Date of the signature.

Notes:

This document is NOT required if exchanging property at an incident base with the exception of capitalized or sensitive property assigned a CDF property number.

This document is required as certification when submitting an MRT to your local Service Center for replacement of property.

An OF-315 (Incident Replacement Requisition) is required as authorization to purchase fire replacement items at your local Unit. This document is required when submitting an MRT to your local Service Center for fire replacement items. A CDF-101 and/or A STD-152 are required for the certification of the status of property being requisitioned for replacement.

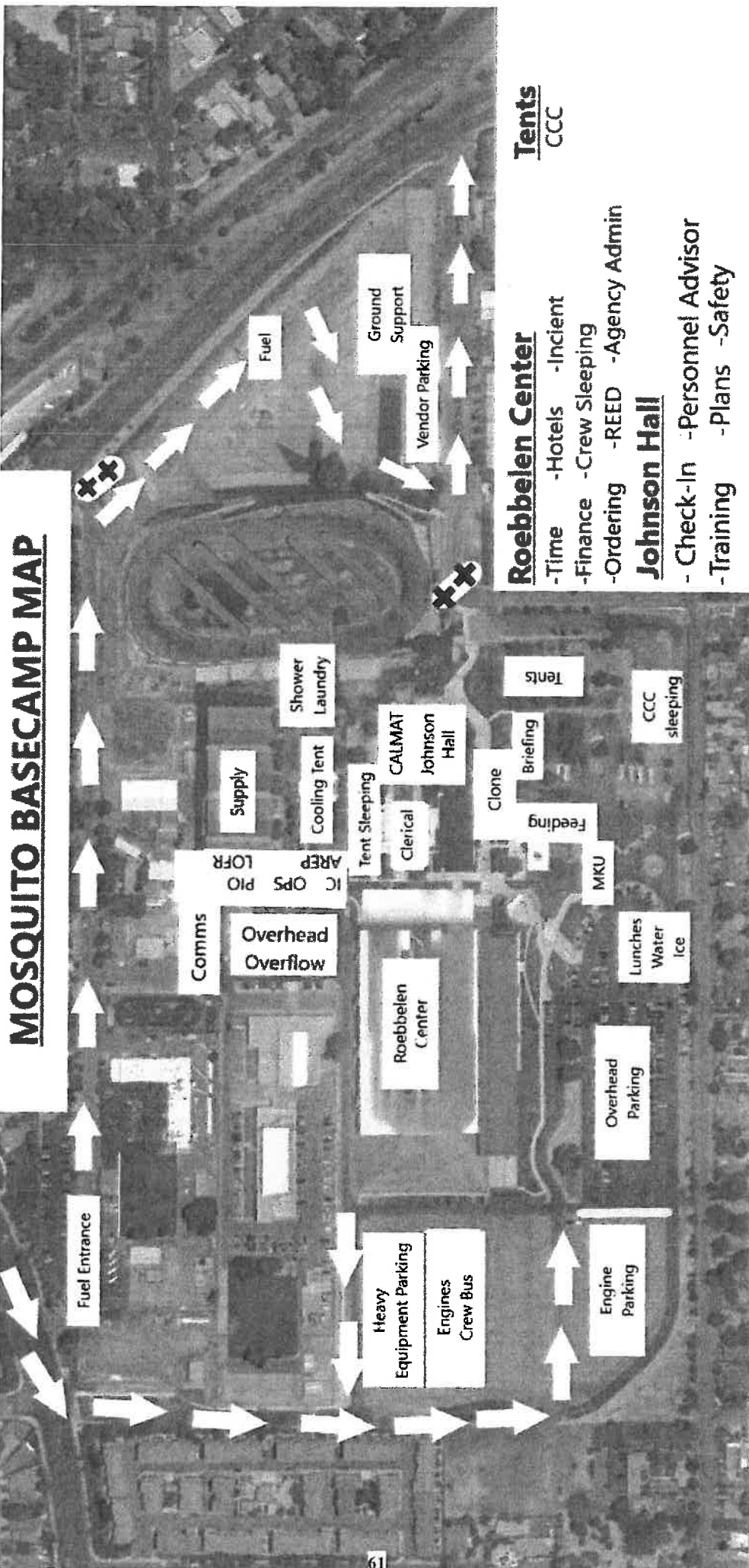

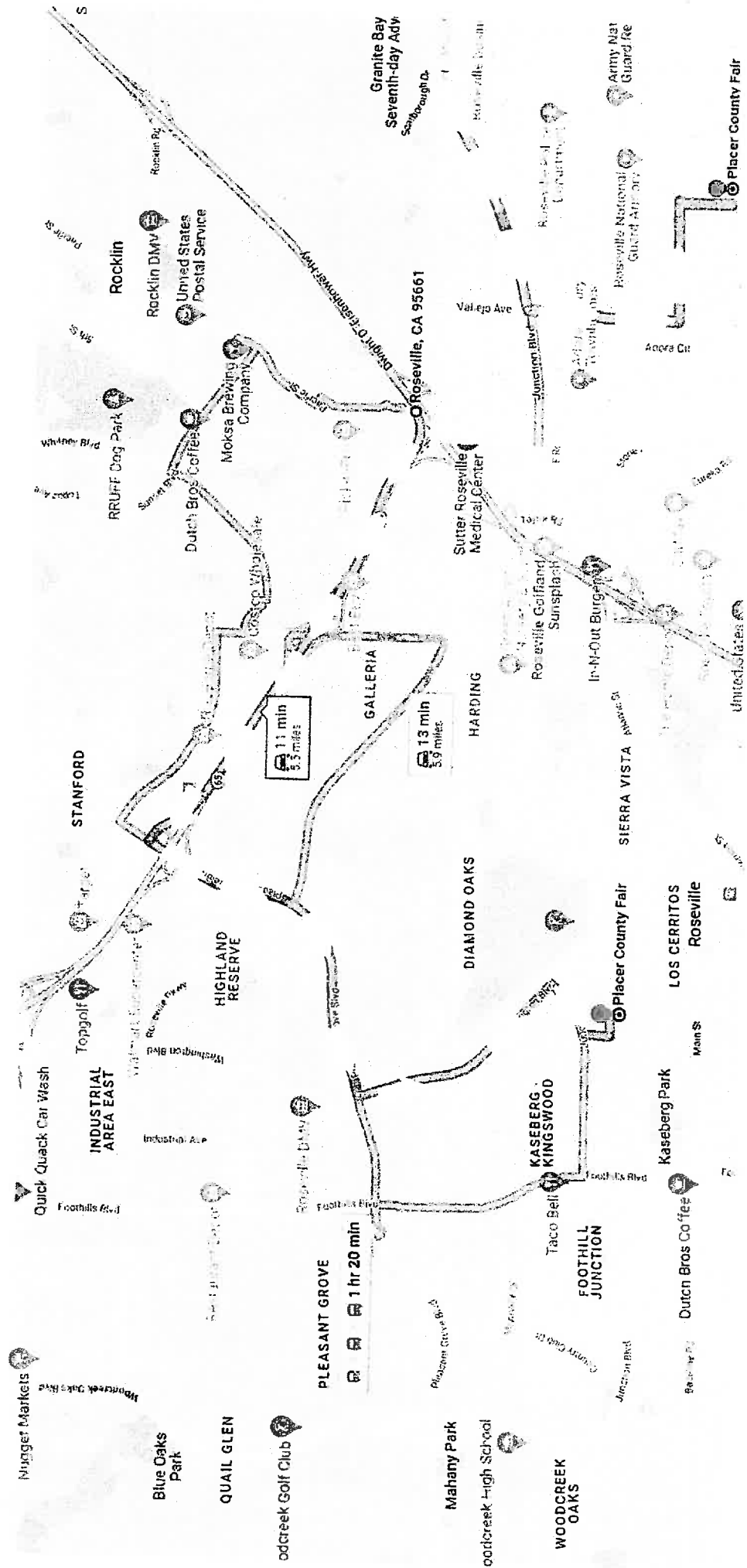
