- Provide timely and accurate information regarding fire activity and potential smoke impacts to the communities, cooperators, and stakeholders through personal contacts, meetings, social media, and working closely with the local media outlets.

- Keep the fire South of Foresthill Road.
- Keep the fire East of Todd Valley Road.
- Keep the fire West of Duncan Peak Lookout.



... Scattered Showers and Thunderstorms Wednesday...
... Drier and Warmer Weather Thursday into Early Next Week...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The storm system which has brought rain the past several days will bring additional rain showers and afternoon and evening thunderstorms today. General winds this afternoon will be out of the southwest, with gusts to 11 mph over ridges, though gusty erratic winds are possible with thunderstorms. Brief periods of heavy rain are possible with thunderstorms, as well as lightning and small hail. High humidity and cool afternoon temperatures in the 50s to low 60s are expected. Drier and warmer weather returns Thursday, with a warming trend into the weekend with temperatures near normal.

Wednesday Weather: Mostly cloudy with scattered showers and afternoon thunderstorms.
TEMPERATURES: 59-63 below 2000 feet and 54-60 2000-5000 feet... Little change

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 65-75%....10% lower.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southeast 3 to 6 mph with gusts to 9 mph in the morning becoming southwest 4 to 7 with gusts to 11 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light upslope through midday then up canyon 4 to 7 mph gusts to 9 mph in the afternoon.

INVERSION: Morning inversion lifting around 1100 hours. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 3500 feet **LAL:** 3

Wednesday Night: Good humidity recovery. A chance of showers and thunderstorms in the evening.
TEMPERATURES: 42-46... Little change.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 90-100%... little change.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Southwest 4 to 8 mph with gusts to 12 through 1800, then northeast 4 to 7 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Down canyon 4 to 9 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Weak inversion setting up overnight. **LAL:** 2

OUTLOOK FOR THURSDAY Dry weather returns. Northwest ridgetop winds 4 to 7 mph with gusts to 11 mph in the afternoon. High temperatures will warm to the upper 60s to low 70s. Afternoon humidity 40-50% with night time recovery 65-70%.

EXTENDED FORECAST: Dry weather with a warming trend continues Friday into early next week. High temperatures trend up into the upper 70s to mid-80s for the weekend, with humidity around 30% and southwest ridge winds gusting to 12 mph.

WEATHER SUMMARY: COOL SHOWERS, AFTERNOON THUNDERSTORMS

Rain showers with afternoon thunderstorms. System will depart; temperatures will climb, and RH will decrease through the weekend.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Smoldering. Heavy fuels will maintain heat & rekindle potential after precip. 1- & 10-hr fuels unavailable until Thursday.

RH & precipitation will minimize fire activity. Little movement expected. Fuels reacting to a week of moisture with ERC, BI, & 100-hr values now below average.

SPECIFIC:

Branch III / V / XX / XXV: No fire spread anticipated.

Branch X / XV: No spread anticipated, smoldering fire. Potential for minimal fire spread between pockets of showers, especially with wind gusts. As unlikely as it sounds, potential for isolated torching still exists due to low canopy base height. Heavy fuels can retain heat for rekindle potential after weather system passes. A lot of heat exists in heavy fuels – this can get into timber stringers, jackpots, and isolated pockets of fuels.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Limited visibility during periods of intense rain. Cloud cover.

Mixing height: 3,500 ft. AGL, Transport winds: SW 7 mph, Sunrise 0650, Sunset 1902.

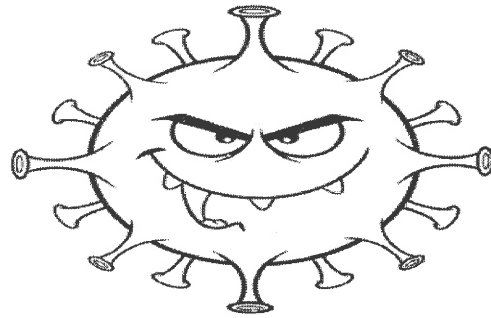

Operational Tempo

- Maintaining good situation awareness in spite of change in operational tempo represents a considerable challenge.
- The majority of our personnel have a task oriented mindset and are high energy. Unchanneled energy can lead to undesired situations. Pose the question, “Is that a good idea?”
- We are most vulnerable to accidents and errors when the operational tempo is at an idle pace and unchecked.
- The key to managing operational tempo successfully is monitoring the changing environment and capabilities of the team. Then applying good judgment to determine whether to push forward or pull back while making necessary adjustments and keeping all personnel informed regularly.

Texting While Driving is Prohibited!

1. Texting while driving is against California State Law and is enforced by local and state law enforcement agencies.
2. 23% of all auto accidents in 2011 were attributed to cellular phone use while driving.

Taking your eyes off the road for 5 seconds while traveling 55 MPH, is equivalent to driving the length of 1 football field without looking at the road!



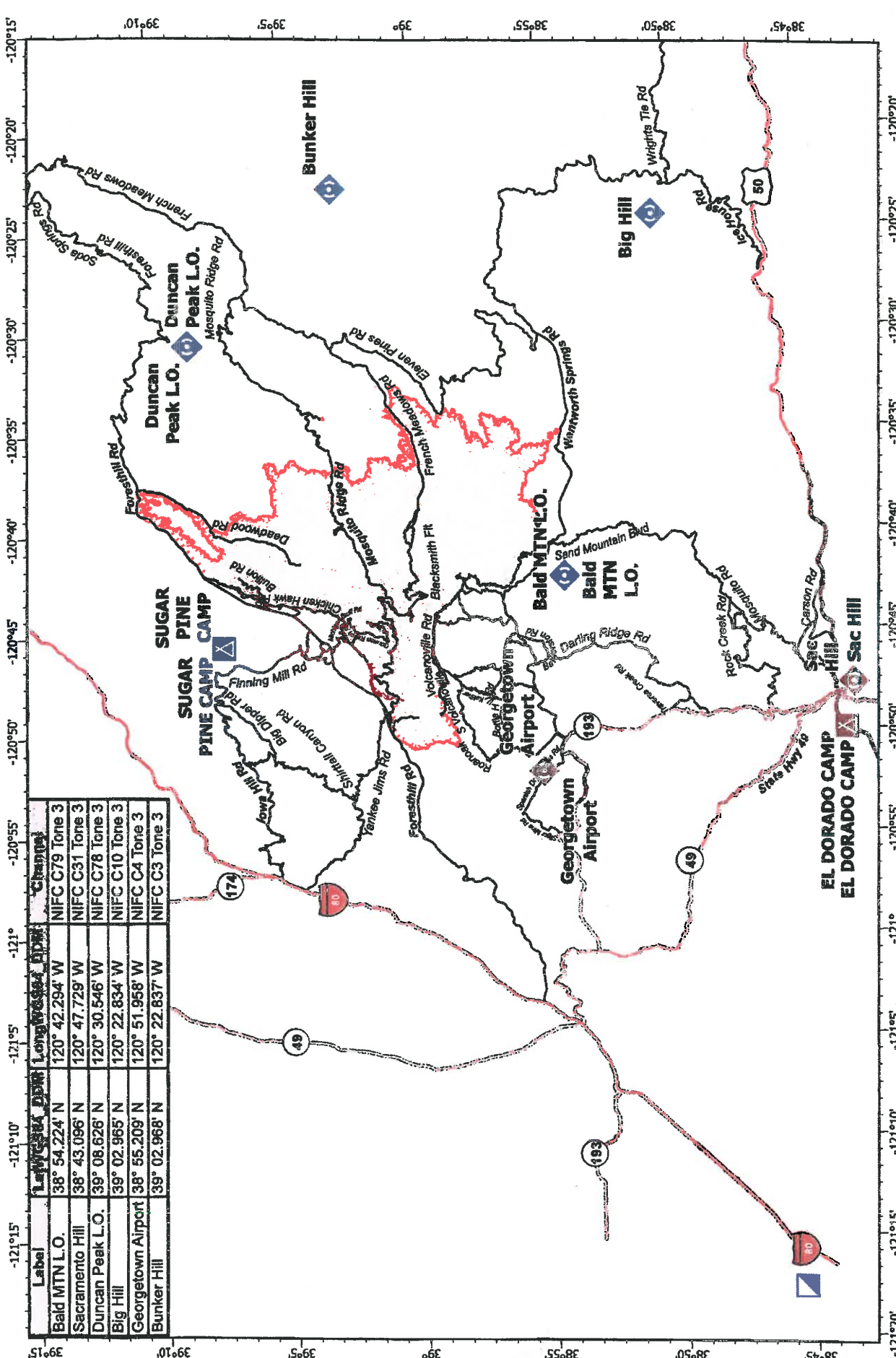

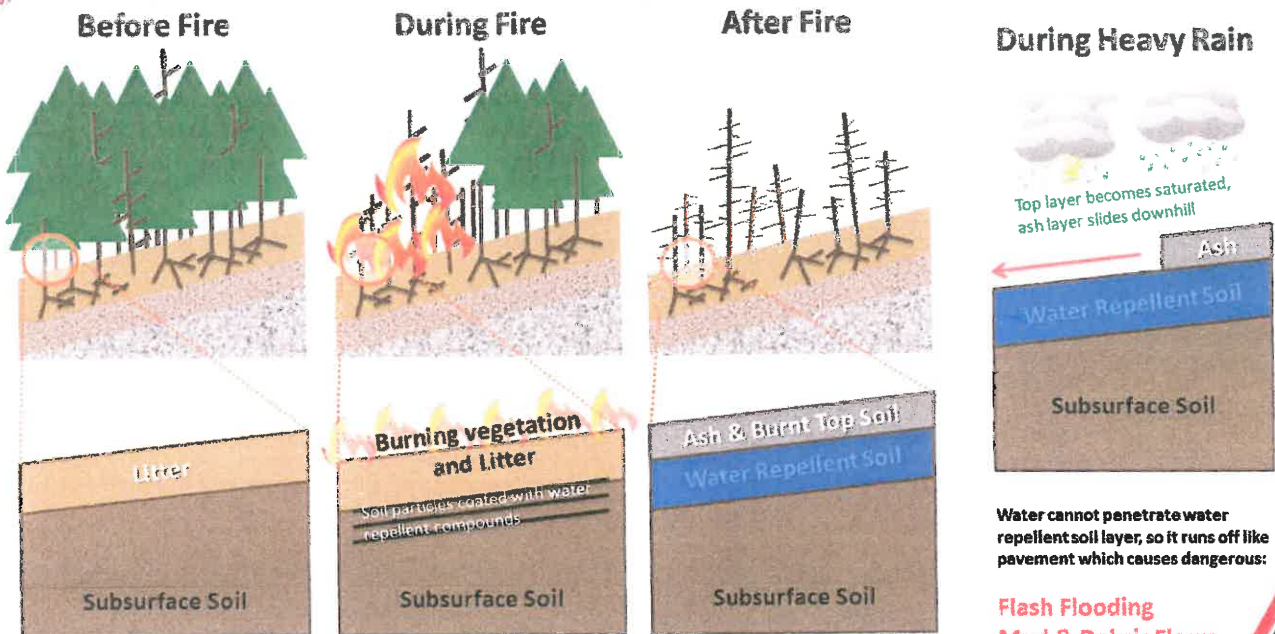

Litter: organic material such as needles, leaves, grass, brush, bark.

Water Repellent Soils: formed when organic material such as trees, scrubs, plants and litter burn at high intensity, water repellent compounds are vaporized, and condense on cooler soil layers below, which prevents soil from absorbing water.

- You cannot outrun a debris flow, and debris flows can happen very quickly in burn areas with intense enough rainfall.
- Treat a National Weather Service “Flash Flood Watch” as a “Watch Out Situation.”
- A “Flash Flood Warning” means that flooding or debris flows are imminent.
- Intense rainfall is more important than total rainfall for triggering post-fire flooding and debris flows.
- If “Flash Flood Warning” is issued, or if intense rainfall occurs, avoid low areas where water can concentrate and avoid staging at or near watercourse crossings.
- Egress and access routes may be affected by flooding and debris flows.
