

...Drier and Warmer Weather into Early Next Week...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Dry and warmer weather returns today, with mostly sunny skies. General winds this afternoon will out of the southwest, with gusts to 11 mph over ridges. Humidity will trend down compared to recent days. Temperatures in the 60s to low 70s are expected. A warming trend continues into the weekend with temperatures returning to near normal, in the 70s to low 80s.

Thursday Weather: Mostly sunny.

TEMPERATURES: 64-70 below 2000 feet and 63-66 2000-5000 feet...6 degrees warmer.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 43-47%....30% lower.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - Northeast 3 to 6 mph with gusts to 8 mph in the morning becoming west 5 to 7 with gusts to 11 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Light upslope through midday then up canyon 4 to 6 mph gusts to 8 mph in the afternoon.

INVERSION: Morning inversion lifting around 1300 hours. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 4800 feet **LAL:** 1

Thursday Night: Good humidity recovery. A chance of showers and thunderstorms in the evening.

TEMPERATURES: 42-46...Little change.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 55-65%...30% lower.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP – West northwest 4 to 7 mph with gusts to 11 mph through 1900, then northeast 4 to 7 mph gusts to 9 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Down canyon 4 to 9 mph.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate inversion setting up overnight. **LAL:** 1

OUTLOOK FOR FRIDAY Dry weather continues. Northwest ridgetop winds 4 to 7 mph with gusts to 11 mph in the afternoon. High temperatures will warm to the upper 60s to low 70s. Afternoon humidity 33-38% with night time recovery 50-55%.

EXTENDED FORECAST: Dry weather with a warming trend continues into early next week. High temperatures trend up into the upper 70s to mid-80s for the weekend, with humidity around 30% and southwest ridge winds gusting to 12 mph.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Smoldering. Sunny skies and lowering RH will start to dry fuels. 1-hr and 10- hour may become available for burning.

RH low enough to have minimal fire activity while drying starts to occur. Little movement expected. Fuels will take a few days to react to drying after a week of moist air + 3 days of rain. East side of fire received >2" rain.

In the absence of weather conditions outside the forecast or extreme fire behavior conditions expect:

SPECIFIC:

Branch III / V / XX / XXV: No fire spread anticipated.

Branch X / XV: Smoldering fire. Potential for minimal fire spread between pockets of showers, especially with wind gusts. Potential for isolated torching, especially around heavy fuels. A lot of heat exists in heavy fuels – this can get into timber stringers, jackpots, and isolated pockets of fuels.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Mostly sunny with clear skies.

Mixing height: 4,800 ft. AGL, Transport winds: SW 6 mph, Sunrise 0651, Sunset 1900.

SAFETY

Mop up should be more extensive in areas that could generate wind-blown embers across the line.

Incident Management Team Transition

- Sometimes called the 19th Watch Out Situation
- Take the time to understand the plan. Ensure all resources completely understand the assignment, the Communications Plan, and the Medical Plan.
- Supervisory positions have changed. Know who you are working for.
Briefings: Required every shift, for all personnel, for new assignments, and for changing conditions.

Safety Around Heavy Equipment Operations

- Never assume that the operator can see you, especially at night.
- Ensure that communications are established with the operator.
- Use hand signals if other communications are unavailable.
- Maintain a 50' to 100' exclusion area around equipment. Beware of flying objects!
- Use a spotter when backing.

Hazard Tree Safety

Hazard trees, both dead snags and live green trees, are one of the most common risks encountered on the fireline. All firefighters should frequently survey their work area for potential hazard trees.

Situation Awareness

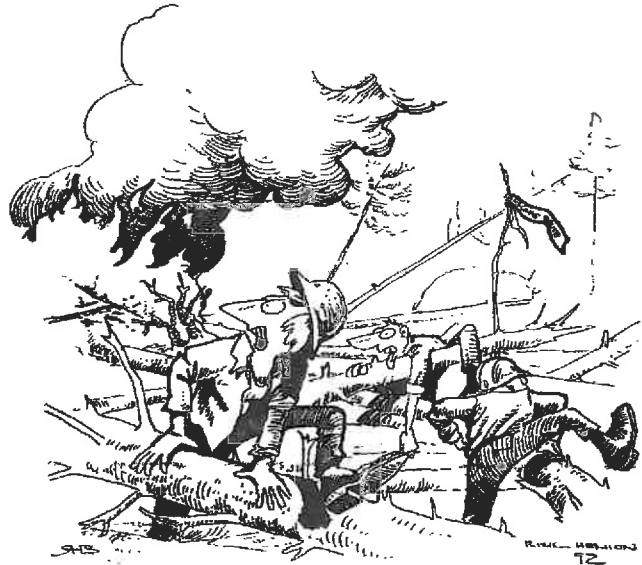
Environment:

- Current and forecasted winds
- Night operations
- Steep slopes
- Diseased or bug-kill areas
- Number and height of hazard trees
- Anticipated burn-down time
- Potential for trees to domino

Hazard tree indicators:

- Trees burning for any period of time
- High risk tree species (rot and shallow roots)
- Numerous downed trees
- Dead, broken, or burning tops and limbs overhead
- Accumulation of downed limbs
- Absence of needles, bark or limbs
- Leaning or hung-up

Know where it is *before* you need it!!

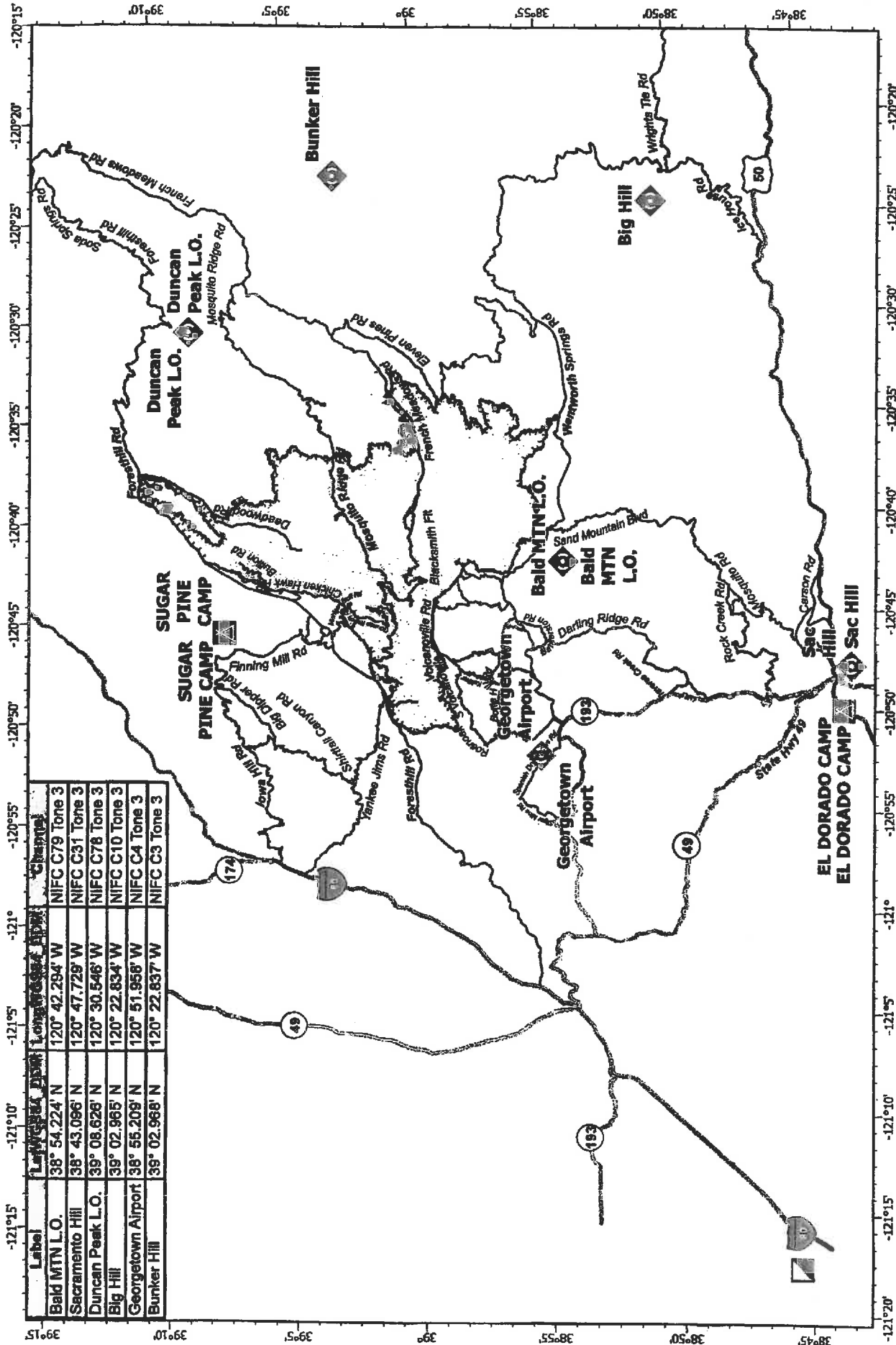

Instructions for Use of CDF 101 Property Certification of Location or Damage

Document Number: for use as a local number system or when attached to a FC-40 document.

Location / Incident Name: Enter the CDF facility property is assigned to. If submitting to an incident base, enter the Incident Name.

Incident Number: Enter the appropriate incident number

Unit: Enter the Unit the property is assigned to. If submitting to an incident base, enter the request number of the person certifying damage example E-320, C-14 or O-355.

Region: Enter the CDF Region where the property was assigned. If submitting to an incident base, enter the CDF Region responsible for the incident.

Date: Enter the date the P.L. or D. was completed.

The following items were: Enter either 'Broken', 'Left on Line', 'Damaged' or other status of the property.

Reminder, this form cannot be used in place of the STD-152 to certify Lost, Stolen, Worn Out or Damaged beyond repair property.

Date of Occurrence: Enter the date the property was broken, left on line or damaged.

Quantity: Enter the quantity for the line item.

Unit of Measure: Enter the unit of measure for the line item (example ea = each).

CDF Stock Number: Enter the PIN or stock number.

Description: Enter the description of the line item, indicate size, make, model and type. Clearly describe the item and provide adequate data to effectively identify equipment or property.

Property Number: Enter the CDF property number assigned to the line item, Capitalized or sensitive property must have their property number entered here.

Location of Items: Where is the property now (example, left on Division B night shift 8/1/04, Drop Point 2). A GPS coordinate, Station 22 or Unit Service Center may also be used to describe Location.

Remarks: Enter specific remarks here, how was the property damaged, what specifically is wrong with it.

Signature of Person Certifying Occurrence as Described:

Signature: The CDF Employee certifying the occurrence must sign.

Printed Name: Enter the printed name of the signature.

Title: Enter the title of the signature.

Date: Enter the date of the signature.

Unit Supervisors Approval:

If submitted on an incident this section must be completed by the supervisor of the property custodian. This may be the Strike Team Leader, Division Supervisor, Receiving and Distribution Manager, Supply Unit Leader, Logistics Section Chief, Agency Representative or Incident Commander.

If submitted at the home Unit this section must also be completed by the supervisor of the property custodian. This may be a Battalion or Division Chief.

Comments: Supervisors may enter comments of approval or disapproval.

Signature of Unit Administrator: Signature of Unit Supervisor reviewing the certification described.

Title: Title of the signature.

Date: Date of the signature.

Notes:

This document is NOT required if exchanging property at an incident base with the exception of capitalized or sensitive property assigned a CDF property number.

This document is required as certification when submitting an MRT to your local Service Center for replacement of property.

An OF-315 (Incident Replacement Requisition) is required as authorization to purchase fire replacement items at your local Unit. This document is required when submitting an MRT to your local Service Center for fire replacement items. A CDF-101 and/or A STD-152 are required for the certification of the status of property being requisitioned for replacement.
