**5. GENERAL CONTROL OBJECTIVES**

**Strategic Framework**

Implement a full suppression strategy on the Mosquito Fire. Values at risk include human safety, private timberlands, communities, critical infrastructure and associated improvements. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of firefighter safety and success.

**Leaders Intent**

Provide the highest level of customer service to all involved with or impacted by the Mosquito Fire. Ensure transparent timely and accurate communication at all levels of the incident and strengthen relationships with stakeholders and cooperators. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:

- Personnel safety and the safety of others, including driving slowly and defensively.
- Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work/rest cycles.
- Minimize risk and limit exposure to infectious disease by implementing Center of Disease Control, California Department of Public Health, and agency guidelines.
- Professional behavior, conduct, and timely/effective communications.

**Management Objectives**

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.
- Coordinate suppression activities and suppression repair with assigned incident resource advisors to minimize impacts on natural and cultural resources.
- Provide initial attack assistance to both the Eldorado and Tahoe National Forest.

**Control Objectives**

**Keep the Mosquito Fire:**

- Keep the fire North of Wentworth Springs Road
- Keep the fire South of Foresthill Road
- Keep the fire East of Todd Valley Road
- Keep the fire West of Duncan Peak Lookout

...Dry and Warm Weather Continues into Early Next Week...

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**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Little change is expected today, with clear skies and warm temperatures. Highs will reach the upper 70s to upper-80s, peaking today and again Monday. Winds start out of the east this morning, shifting to the southwest in the afternoon, with gusts to 13 mph over ridges, strongest at 1400. Afternoon humidity drops into the 20s. Temperatures gradually trend down Tuesday into Thursday as a disturbance pushes high pressure ridging eastward.

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**Sunday Weather:** Sunny.  
**TEMPERATURES:** 84-87 below 3000 feet and 79-84 3000-5000 feet... 1 degree warmer.

**MINIMUM HUMIDITY:** 21-28%....Little change.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** - East 4 to 7 mph in the morning becoming southwest 5 to 7 with gusts to 13 mph in the afternoon.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – Down canyon 4 to 8 with gusts to 10 mph through 1000, then up canyon 4 to 6 mph with gusts to 8 mph through the afternoon.

**INVERSION:** Morning inversion lifting around 1300 hours. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 6700 feet **LAL:** 1

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**Sunday Night:** Clear. Moderate humidity recovery.

**TEMPERATURES:** 58-65...3 degrees higher

**MAXIMUM HUMIDITY:** 45-55%...Little change.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** – Southwest 3 to 7 mph through 1900, then northeast 4 to 7 mph overnight.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – up canyon 3 to 6 mph in the evening becoming light and variable, then becoming down canyon 5 to 9 mph at 2200.

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Moderate inversion setting up overnight. **LAL:** 1

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**OUTLOOK FOR MONDAY** Dry and sunny weather continues with little change. Southwest ridgetop winds 4 to 7 mph with gusts to 13 mph in the afternoon. High temperatures will warm to the upper 70s to upper 80s. Humidity trends a little higher, with afternoon humidity 23-29% with night time recovery 47-57%.


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**EXTENDED FORECAST:** Tuesday looks a little cooler with partly cloudy skies and high temperatures in the upper 70s to low-80s, with humidity around 24-30%. Afternoon ridge winds will be out of the southwest, gusting to 16 mph and 18 mph Wednesday. Highs cool into the upper 70s to 80 on Wednesday and Thursday with partly cloudy skies.

### INPUTS

**WEATHER SUMMARY: WARMING, DRYING TREND CONTINUES**

Warming and drying. Mostly sunny.

Temp: 79-87 max; 58-65min

RH: 21-28% min; Night 45-55% max

Wind (20'): Normal diurnal flow expected, General daytime transport wind SW 4-7mph Gust 13 ridges; AM Ridgetop E 5-7 becoming SW 4-7 in the afternoon; 1900: NE 4-7mph; 2200: Downcanyon 5-9mph

### OUTPUTS

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL: Smoldering and Creeping. Sunny skies and lowering RH. 1-hr and 10-hour available to burn in the afternoon. Night fine dead fuel moistures forecasted to hit 11 except for most exposed drier ridge tops.**

RH low enough to support fire spread in the fine dead fuels in the afternoon. Little movement expected. Slow rates of spread. Isolated pockets of unburned fuel will have potential to support 2ft flame lengths.

Moving into a trend where isolated single tree torching may occur. This fire behavior will be isolated in nature.

Spotting distances will be short range less than a quarter mile max. Spotting from roll out as heavy fuels burn down on steep slopes may occur.

Fire activity (minimal) will continue in areas of the fire that are inaccessible as heavy fuels continue to hold heat.

Expect an increase in smoke production as we begin to dry out through the weekend. Expect to see more hot spots show themselves as we continue to dry out.

**ERCs for pertinent Predictive Service Areas NC05: 37 <32<sup>nd</sup>%; NC07: 34 <32<sup>nd</sup>% Overall Moderate  
ERC for Bald Mtn RAWs: 39 <32<sup>nd</sup>% Overall Moderate**

#### SPECIFIC:

**Branch 10:** Existing containment lines are expected to hold. If a spot occurs outside the main line, expect slow rates of spread and manageable fire behavior.

**Branch 15/25:** Smoldering and creeping fire. Minimal fire spread/growth in the forecast. Potential for isolated single tree torching, especially around jackpots of heavy fuels. Heat exists in heavy fuels - this can get into timber stringers, jackpots, and isolated pockets of fuels.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

Mostly sunny with clear skies. Moderate inversion sets up overnight, light smoke settling in drainages in the AM. Mixing height: 6,700ft. AGL, Transport winds: SW 7mph, Sunrise 0651, Sunset 1900.

### SAFETY

Be alert for any heat still present on a slope below your work area.

Fire weakened timber poses overhead hazards.

Stump holes will continue to hold heat.

## Back to Basics

Fire Order #10: Fight fire aggressively, having provided for **SAFETY FIRST**

### PPE/Communication/Fire Behavior/Weather/Driving

- Do you have the right PPE for the task and using it correctly?
- Do you have communications back to ICP in event of IWI?
- Fire behavior: is the fire doing what was predicted?
- Is the weather changing?
- Driver safety cushion in place?

Some possible mitigation could include:

- Inspect **PPE** daily. Review JHA if in doubt about appropriate PPE. **PPE** must become second nature because failing to compromises safety.
- Validate:
  - Lookout is still in the best location for the assignment?
  - Communications are still good; do I need to do a radio check and adjust accordingly?
- **At 1400, take a 5-minute break** and re-access your current situation against incident objectives and work assignment. Is the risk and exposure worth the values at risk?
- Continue to take spot weather for updated local weather conditions. Share observations with the ITMET your input will help validate and update the forecast and fire behavior.
- Will your speed allow you to slow down or stop if you encounter another vehicle or animal around the next curve?
