




Values at risk include human safety, private timberlands, communities, critical infrastructure and associated improvements. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of firefighter safety and success.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Leaders Intent</b></p> <p>Provide the highest level of customer service to all involved with or impacted by the Mosquito Fire. Ensure transparent timely and accurate communication at all levels of the incident and strengthen relationships with stakeholders and cooperators. ...Breezy Southwest Winds and Cooler Today and Wednesday...

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** An upper level disturbance will approach the Pacific Northwest today, although mostly clear skies and warm temperatures will continue. Highs will reach the low to mid-80s. Winds start out light from the east this morning, shifting to the southwest in the afternoon, with gusts up to 17 mph over ridges. Humidity will again drop into the 20s. For Wednesday and Thursday, temperatures will be cooler with similar humidity, however, southwest winds could gust up to 19 mph on Wednesday.

**Tuesday Weather:** Mostly sunny.  
**TEMPERATURES:** 84-86 below 3000 feet and 77-84 3000-5000 feet...Down 3.

**MINIMUM HUMIDITY:** 20-27%....3% lower.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** - East 3 to 6 mph in the morning through 1100, becoming southwest 6 to 8 with gusts to 17 mph.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – Down canyon 4 to 7 through 1000, then up canyon 5 to 7 mph with gusts to 9 mph through the afternoon.

**INVERSION:** Morning inversion lifting around 1300 hours. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 5600 feet **LAL:** 1

**Tuesday Night:** Clear. Moderate humidity recovery.

**TEMPERATURES:** 55-62...3 degrees lower

**MAXIMUM HUMIDITY:** 35-45%...10% lower.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** – Southwest 4 to 8 mph through 1900, then northeast 4 to 7 mph overnight.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – up canyon 4 to 7 mph in the evening becoming light and variable, then becoming down canyon 4 to 8 mph at 2200.

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Moderate inversion setting up overnight. **LAL:** 1

**OUTLOOK FOR WEDNESDAY** Dry and mostly sunny to sunny. Southwest ridgetop winds 6 to 8 mph with gusts up to 19 mph in the afternoon. High temperatures will warm to the mid 70s to low-80s. Humidity remaining similar, with afternoon humidity 21-28% and with night time recovery 45-55%.

---

**EXTENDED FORECAST:** Temperatures change little on Thursday with mostly sunny skies and high temperatures in the mid 70s to low-80s, with humidity 23-30%. Afternoon ridge winds will be out of the southwest, gusting to 14 mph. For Friday and Saturday, little change in temperatures. Highs will be in the upper 70s to low 80s, min humidity 22-28%, southwest ridge winds gusting up to 12 mph each afternoon.

### INPUTS

**WEATHER SUMMARY:** WARMING, DRYING TREND CONTINUES, INCREASED SW Wind (Ridges)

Warming and drying. Mostly sunny.

Temp: 77-86 max; 55-62min

RH: 20-27% min; Night 35-45% max

Wind (20'): Normal diurnal flow expected, General daytime transport wind SW 6-8mph Gust 13 ridges; AM

Ridgetop E 3-6 becoming SW 6-8 in the afternoon; 1900: NE 4-7mph; 2200: Downcanyon 4-7mph

Fuel models: 10, TU5, TU1, SH2, TL6

### OUTPUTS

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL:** Surface Fire more active. Sunny skies and lowering RH. 1-hr and 10- hour available to burn in the afternoon. Night fine dead fuel moistures forecasted to hit 10 except for most exposed drier ridge tops.

RH low enough to support fire spread in the fine dead fuels in the afternoon. Slow rates of spread 1-5ch/hr max overall. If fire gets established on an open S aspect aligned with wind and slope, spread rates of 8-15ch/hr max are possible. Isolated pockets of unburned fuel will have potential to support 2ft surface flame lengths and single tree torching where ladder fuels are present.

Single tree torching may occur.

Spotting distances will be short range less than 3/10 of a mile max. Spotting from roll out as heavy fuels burn down on steep slopes may occur.

Fire activity (increasing potential) will continue in areas of the fire that are inaccessible as heavy fuels and duff layers continue to hold heat.

Expect an increase in smoke production as we continue to dry out. Expect to see more hot spots show themselves as we continue to dry out.

ERC for Bald Mtn RAWs: 47 >32<sup>nd</sup>% Overall Moderate (Approaching High)**

#### SPECIFIC:

**Branch 10:** Existing containment lines are expected to hold. Smoldering and creeping fire. Expect an increase in activity especially in unburned islands but should remain manageable.

**Branch 15/25:** Smoldering and creeping fire. Minimal fire spread/growth in the forecast. Potential for isolated single tree torching, especially around jackpots of heavy fuels. Heat exists in heavy fuels - this can get into timber stringers, jackpots, and isolated pockets of fuels.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

Mostly sunny with clear skies. Moderate inversion sets up overnight, light smoke settling in drainages in the AM. Mixing height: 5,400ft. AGL, Transport winds: SW 7mph gusting 13.

### SAFETY

Be alert for any heat still present on a slope below your work area. Unburned islands becoming more active.

Fire weakened timber poses overhead hazards. Stump holes will continue to hold heat.

## COMMUNICATION RESPONSIBILITIES

All firefighters have **five** communication responsibilities:

- Brief others as needed.
- Debrief your actions.
- Communicate hazards to others.
- Acknowledge messages.
- Ask if you do not know or are unclear.

## Mop-Up Hazard Trees

**Situational Awareness:** The probability for unstable trees in burn areas increases over time.

**Flag, Avoid and Notify:** Flag hazard trees, and notify supervisor and adjacent fire personnel.

**Mitigate Hazards:** By felling trees with qualified personnel.

**Be alert for changing conditions:** Wind increases the hazard. Be aware of local diurnal wind patterns.

**Re-evaluate work areas** periodically for overhead hazards. **Never consider an area of burned trees as “safe” to work in.**

## Driving Safely with Civilian Traffic

- Maintain a safe following distance and allow space for cars to pass.
- Be diligent in using your mirrors as cars may be passing you.
- Use turnouts when available to let cars pass.
- Stay calm; we are not part of their race.
- Maintain a heightened level of awareness around blind corners.
- Watch out for wildlife on the road, especially at night.
- Slow down, slow down, and slow down!

## Dehydration

**Did you know...** It is important at night also?  
**Hydrate!**

- Caffeine speeds up loss of fluids in your body (limit coffee and cola intake)
- Thirst always underestimates fluid needs (drink before you feel thirsty)
- Potassium-rich foods help greatly (add bananas, citrus, tomato juice to your diet)
- Signs of possible dehydration include rapid heart rate, weakness, excessive fatigue, dizziness, painful urination, and dark colored urine.
