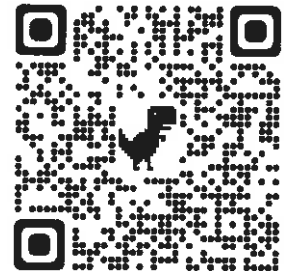

Strategic Framework

- Implement a full suppression strategy on the Mosquito Fire. Values at risk include human safety, private timberlands, communities, critical infrastructure, and associated improvements. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of firefighter safety and success.

Leaders Intent

Provide the highest level of customer service to all involved with or impacted by the Mosquito Fire. Ensure transparent, timely, and accurate communication at all levels of the incident; and strengthen relationships with stakeholders and cooperators. All assigned personnel shall be prepared to take appropriate action regarding:

- Personnel safety and the safety of others; including driving slowly and defensively.
- Fatigue management by maintaining work/rest cycles, taking breaks, and being fit for duty.
- Minimization of risk and exposure to infectious disease through implementation of Center of Disease Control, California Department of Public Health, and agency guidelines.
- Professional behavior, conduct, and timely/effective communication.

Management Objectives

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.
- Coordinate suppression activities, suppression repair, and hazard tree abatement with assigned incident resource advisors to minimize impacts on natural and cultural resources.
- Provide initial attack assistance to both the Eldorado and Tahoe National Forests.

Control Objectives

- Keep the Mosquito Fire within the current perimeter.



WEATHER DISCUSSION: The cooler, moister airmass will be noticeable today. After good RH recovery across the entire fire this morning, RH values will only fall towards about 30% this afternoon. Any marine layer will burn off by late morning. This will keep temperatures a few degrees cooler than Sunday. Winds should be relatively light and follow their typical diurnal patterns. Expect some gusts along the ridges from the southwest in the afternoon. Conditions will be slow to change as we head into the week.

Monday Weather: Partly cloudy. Better RH recovery last night with marine layer influence to Mill Staging.

TEMPERATURES: 75-78 below 3000 feet and 69-73 3000-5000 feet...down 1 degree.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 28-36%...up 6 percent.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - East southeast 4 to 8 mph through 1100, becoming west to southwest 6 to 10 mph. Gusts to 15 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Down canyon 3 to 6 mph through 1100, then switching to up canyon 4 to 7 mph. Near DIV J, gusts 10-12 mph through the afternoon.

INVERSION: Morning inversion lifting to around 3,000' in the PM. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 3100 feet **LAL:** 1

Monday Night: Partly cloudy. Fair RH recovery.

TEMPERATURES: 50-56...4 degrees warmer.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 37-47%...down 8 percent.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - West to southwest 5 to 7 mph through 1900, then northeast-east 4 to 6 mph.

SLOPE/VALLEY - Up canyon 3 to 6 mph early, becoming light and variable, then becoming down canyon 3 to 6 mph at 2200.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Weak inversion setting up overnight. **LAL:** 1


OUTLOOK FOR TUESDAY: Partly cloudy conditions early becoming sunny. Temperatures will start to warm a few degrees from Monday. Drier air will start to slide back over the area driving afternoon RH values down near 25%. Recovery Tuesday night into Wednesday looks to really fall off potentially near 20%.

EXTENDED FORECAST: A slow warming and drying trend will ensue for the middle of the week. By late Friday into next weekend, a new weather system will change the pattern. Temperatures will cool significantly with much higher RHs. There remains a chance for showers late Friday into Saturday.

INPUTS

WEATHER SUMMARY: Clear, warm, and dry weather will continue to dominate for the coming days. A slight cooling trend with better overnight RH recoveries begins Sunday, though recoveries remain moderate to poor. Winds become light & diurnal both day and night with the overnight enhanced easterly breezes fading into typical downslope winds after early Saturday morning. ***See daily Weather Forecasts for details/ ***

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Continued warm and dry weather has made all fuels more available than normal for the time of year, as evidenced by the high ERC values, which are above daily records and approaching fire season 90th percentile values. Recent interior flare-ups validate the potential for problematic fire behavior if fire establishes over containment lines, during interior island consumption, during needle cast re-burn, or when responding to an IA.

Problematic fire behavior could include isolated torching and flame lengths that challenge direct control efforts without water or air support. Max spotting distances between ¼ & ½ of a mile are likely and may increase if unpredicted winds or terrain channeling are present. Rates of spread will be greatest in areas of slope and wind alignment, but the lack of a strong wind pattern is likely to make initial actions successful. Rates of spread may also be limited in grass and herbaceous fuels greening-up from September precipitation, though this impact will wane in the next 1-2 weeks if no additional precipitation occurs.

SPECIFIC:

Branch 10 (Div. J): Existing containment lines expected to hold. Remaining Interior heat will result in slow to moderate spread in areas of unburned fuel or re-burn in areas with significant needle cast.

Branch 25 (Div. U): Low flame lengths with low to moderate spread in areas without containment. Isolated torching of brush and small trees is likely as fuels remain dry and available for consumption

AIR OPERATIONS:

Air operations may be needed if fire escapes containment or during initial attack support. Inversions will impact air operations until late morning or early afternoon.

SAFETY

The slight uptick in overnight recovery and longer, cooler nights may result in wide swings between fine fuel availability during the early morning hours and mid to late afternoon. Be aware that fine fuels change rapidly in response to changes in hour-to-hour temperature, humidity and sunlight.

Remember, light flash fuels are a common factor in blow-ups and tragedy fires.

Medical Incident Report

FOR A NON-EMERGENCY INCIDENT, WORK THROUGH CHAIN OF COMMAND TO REPORT AND TRANSPORT INJURED PERSONNEL AS NECESSARY.

FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY: IDENTIFY ON SCENE INCIDENT COMMANDER BY NAME AND POSITION AND ANNOUNCE "MEDICAL EMERGENCY" TO INITIATE RESPONSE FROM IMT COMMUNICATIONS/DISPATCH.

Use the following items to communicate situation to communications/dispatch.

1. CONTACT COMMUNICATIONS / DISPATCH (Verify correct frequency prior to starting report)

Ex: "Communications, Div. Alpha. Stand-by for Emergency Traffic."

2. INCIDENT STATUS: Provide incident summary (including number of patients) and command structure.

Ex: "Communications, I have a Red priority patient, unconscious, struck by a falling tree. Requesting air ambulance to Forest Road 1 at (Lat./Long.) This will be the Trout Meadow Medical, IC is TFLD Jones. EMT Smith is providing medical care."

Severity of Emergency / Transport Priority

RED / PRIORITY 1 Life or limb threatening Injury or illness. Evacuation need is IMMEDIATE

Ex: Unconscious, difficulty breathing, bleeding severely, 2^o - 3^o burns more than 4 palm sizes, heat stroke, disoriented.

YELLOW / PRIORITY 2 Serious Injury or illness. Evacuation may be DELAYED if necessary.

Ex: Significant trauma, unable to walk, 2^o - 3^o burns not more than 1-3 palm sizes.

GREEN / PRIORITY 3 Minor Injury or illness. Non-Emergency transport

Ex: Sprains, strains, minor heat-related illness.
