5. GENERAL CONTROL OBJECTIVES

Strategic Framework

Implement a full suppression strategy on the Mosquito Fire. Values at risk include human safety, private timberlands, communities, critical infrastructure and associated improvements. Apply tactics that offer the highest probability of firefighter safety and success.

Leaders Intent

Provide the highest level of customer service to all involved with or impacted by the Mosquito Fire. Ensure transparent timely and accurate communication at all levels of the incident and strengthen relationships with stakeholders and cooperators. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take appropriate actions regarding:

- Personnel safety and the safety of others, including driving slowly and defensively.
- Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work/rest cycles.
- Minimize risk and limit exposure to infectious disease by implementing Center of Disease Control, California Department of Public Health, and agency guidelines.
- Professional behavior, conduct, and timely/effective communications.

Management Objectives

- Provide for firefighter and public safety through hazard recognition and application of the risk management process.
- Coordinate suppression activities and suppression repair with assigned incident resource advisors to minimize impacts on natural and cultural resources.
- Provide initial attack assistance to both the Eldorado and Tahoe National Forest.

Control Objectives

Keep the Mosquito Fire:

- Keep the fire North of Wentworth Springs Road
- Keep the fire South of Foresthill Road
- Keep the fire East of Todd Valley Road
- Keep the fire West of Duncan Peak Lookout



...Dry and Warmer Weather into Next Week...

WEATHER DISCUSSION: Dry and warmer weather today with sunny skies. General winds this afternoon will be out of the west, with gusts to 11 mph over ridges. Humidity will trend lower. Temperatures in the mid-70s to low 80s are expected. A warming trend continues into the weekend with temperatures returning to near normal, in the upper 70s to mid-80s. Little change in the pattern is expected into next week.

Friday Weather: Sunny.

TEMPERATURES: 78-81 below 3000 feet and 76-78 3000-5000 feet...6 degrees warmer.

MINIMUM HUMIDITY: 32-36%....8% lower.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP - East 5 to 7 mph in the morning becoming west 5 to 7 with gusts to 11 mph in the afternoon.

SLOPE/VALLEY – Down slope 4 to 8 with gusts to 11 mph through 1000, then up canyon 4 to 6 mph with gusts to 8 mph through the afternoon.

INVERSION: Morning inversion lifting around 1300 hours. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 6000 feet **LAL:** 1

Friday Night: Clear. Moderate humidity recovery.

TEMPERATURES: 48-52...little change.

MAXIMUM HUMIDITY: 55-60%...8% lower.

20 FT WINDS:

RIDGETOP – West 4 to 7 mph through 1900, then east 4 to 7 mph overnight.

SLOPE/VALLEY – up canyon 3 to 6 mph in the evening becoming light and variable, then becoming down canyon 4 to 7 mph at 2200.

STABILITY/INVERSION: Moderate inversion setting up overnight. **LAL:** 1

OUTLOOK FOR SATURDAY Dry and sunny weather continues. Southwest ridgetop winds 4 to 7 mph with gusts to 11 mph in the afternoon. High temperatures will warm to the upper 70s to mid-80s. Afternoon humidity 25-30% with night time recovery 50-55%.

EXTENDED FORECAST: Little change Sunday with clear skies and high temperatures in the upper 70s to mid-80s, with humidity around 25-30%. Afternoon ridge winds will be out of the southwest, gusting to 12 mph.

WEATHER SUMMARY: CHANGE IN WEATHER: WARMING, DRYING TREND

Warming and drying trend. Mostly sunny.

Temp: 76-81 max; 48-52 min

RH: 32-36% min; 55-60% max

Wind (20'): Normal diurnal flow expected, General daytime transport wind SW 7mph, AM: E 5-7; 1200: W 5-7
Gust 11 ridges; 1900: Becoming Easterly 5-7mph on ridges, 2200: Downcanyon 4-7mph

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL: Smoldering and Creeping. Sunny skies and lowering RH will start to dry fuels. 1-hr and 10-hour available to burn in the afternoon.

RH low enough to have minimal fire activity while drying starts to occur. Little movement expected. Fuels will take a few days to react to drying after a week of moist air + 3 days of rain. East side of fire received >2" rain.

Moving into a trend where isolated single tree torching may occur. This fire behavior will be isolated in nature.

Spotting distances will be short range less than a quarter mile max. Spotting from roll out as heavy fuels burn down on steep slopes may occur.

Fire activity (minimal) will continue in areas of the fire that are inaccessible as heavy fuels continue to hold heat.

Expect in increase in smoke production as we begin to dry out through the weekend.

ERC's for pertinent Predictive Service Areas NC05: 43 <50th%; NC07: 23 <30th%

SPECIFIC:

Branch 3/5 and 20/25: Existing containment lines are expected to hold. If a spot occurs outside the main line, expect slow rates of spread and manageable fire behavior.

Branch 10/15: Smoldering fire. Minimal fire spread in the forecast. Potential for isolated single tree torching, especially around jackpots of heavy fuels. A lot of heat exists in heavy fuels - this can get into timber stringers, jackpots, and isolated pockets of fuels.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Mostly sunny with clear skies.

Mixing height: 6,000ft. AGL, Transport winds: SW 7mph, Sunrise 0651, Sunset 1900.

SAFETY

Be alert for any heat still present on a slope below your work area.

Fire weakened timber poses overhead hazards.

Stump holes will continue to hold heat.

Major Hazards, Risks, Mitigation Reminders:

- **Complacency:** Human Factors, Attitudes, Leaders Intent, Duty, Respect, Integrity
- **Driving:** Slow and Cautious with Lights On. Traffic, Wildlife, Follow Agency Policy
- **Snags and Weakened Trees:** Maintain Situational Awareness
- **Suppression Repair:** Heavy Equipment, Trained Operators, Safe Equipment, Inspected Equipment
- **Soil and Hillside Stabilization:** Rollout, Rocks, Debris, Slippery Roads

- **Transition:** Risks to firefighters increase during transitions and transfer of command periods. Know who your leadership is, know where you are supposed to be, know your assignment, and who you report to. Implement effective communication procedures, ensure your radios have the appropriate frequencies. Give and receive understandable and comprehensive briefings. Confirm that information is received, acknowledged, and understood. Establish and maintain continuous information flow. Take your time through transitions, serious accidents can occur at any time. Know what your roles and responsibilities are. Review ICS 206 Medical Plan and Medical Incident Report in the IAP.
- **Driving:** Local residence traffic has increased. Drive defensively. Hillside stabilization is weakened due to fire damage and recent rainfall. Be heads-up while driving. Be mindful that the hillsides are unstable, specifically on roads such as Mosquito Ridge Road. Do not get distracted. Communicate traffic problems and hazards. Civilian traffic on highways tend to travel at high speeds. Continue to slow down, be courteous and drive cautiously. Be mindful of pedestrians and wildlife on the roads.
- **Snags and Weakened Trees:** Hazard Tree Safety, LCES is a must. Establish a NWZ (no work zone) if necessary. Make sure you communicate all hazards. If you see something – say something. Maintain Situational Awareness... Please Remember: Look Up, Look Down, Look Around
- **Heavy Equipment:** Keep a safe distance. Make sure the heavy equipment operator knows your location. Watch for rolling material, falling, and moving of trees, branches, logs, and rocks. Ensure the operators and folks working with the heavy equipment are trained and know the hazards. Don't approach moving equipment until you are sure the operator is aware of your presence.

Practice Leadership in Safety

- **Situational Awareness:** Communications, Weather, Local Factors, Assess Hazards, Communicate Hazards. Personal Safety, Safety of Others, Manage Fatigue, Mitigate hazards using sound Risk Management Processes
- **Maintain Your Health:** Personal Safety, Safety of Others, Manage Fatigue, Minimize Risk Quality rest, nutrition, hydration, wash your hands often, limit exposure to infectious disease

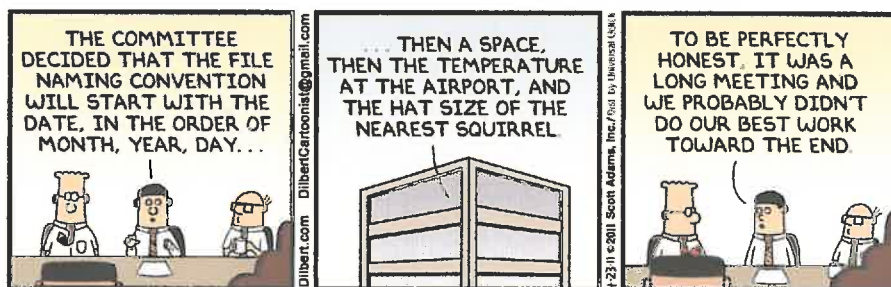

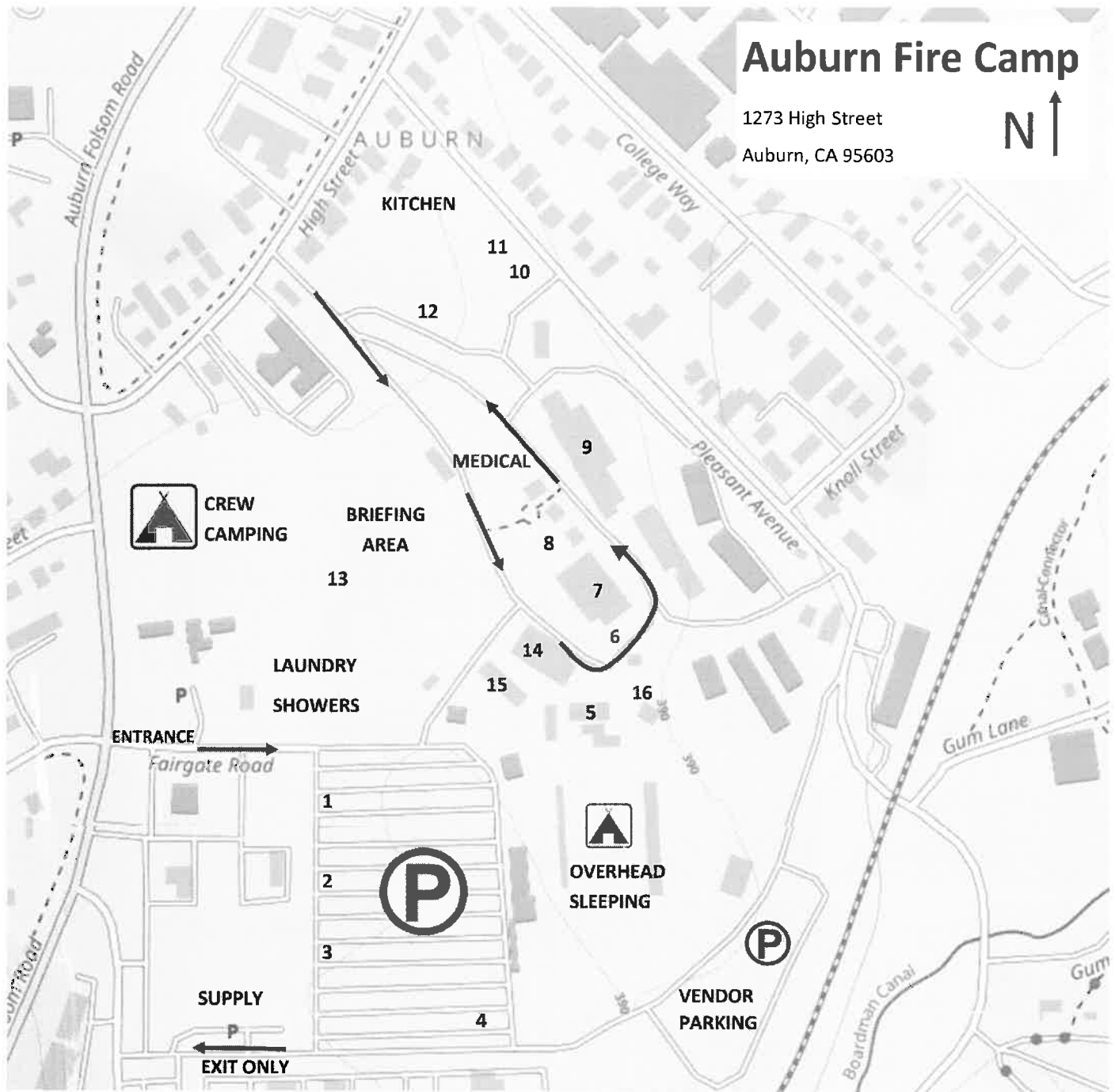
