...Dry and Warmer Weather into Next Week...

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**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** The dry and warming pattern continues with sunny skies. General winds start out of the east this morning, shifting to the southwest in the afternoon, with gusts to 12 mph over ridges, peaking at 1400. Humidity will continue to trend downward. Temperatures today will reach the upper 70s to mid-80s. High temperatures peak on Sunday and Monday, slightly warmer than Saturday. Temperatures then gradually trend down Tuesday and into Thursday as high pressure ridging over the region weakens.

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**Saturday Weather:** Sunny.

**TEMPERATURES:** 82-86 below 3000 feet and 78-83 3000-5000 feet... 3 degrees warmer.

**MINIMUM HUMIDITY:** 20-26%....3% lower.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** - East 5 to 7 mph in the morning becoming southwest 5 to 7 with gusts to 12 mph in the afternoon.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – Down canyon 4 to 8 with gusts to 11 mph through 1000, then up canyon 4 to 6 mph with gusts to 8 mph through the afternoon.

**INVERSION:** Morning inversion lifting around 1300 hours. **MIXING HEIGHT:** 6500 feet **LAL:** 1

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**Saturday Night:** Clear. Moderate humidity recovery.

**TEMPERATURES:** 55-62...5 degrees higher

**MAXIMUM HUMIDITY:** 45-55%...5% lower.

**20 FT WINDS:**

**RIDGETOP** – Southwest 3 to 7 mph through 1900, then northeast 4 to 7 mph overnight.

**SLOPE/VALLEY** – up canyon 3 to 6 mph in the evening becoming light and variable, then becoming down canyon 5 to 9 mph at 2200.

**STABILITY//INVERSION:** Moderate inversion setting up overnight. **LAL:** 1

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**OUTLOOK FOR SUNDAY** Dry and sunny weather continues with little change. Southwest ridgetop winds 4 to 7 mph with gusts to 12 mph in the afternoon. High temperatures will warm to the upper 70s to mid-80s. Afternoon humidity 20-26% with night time recovery 45-55%.

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**EXTENDED FORECAST:** Little change Monday with clear skies and high temperatures in the upper 70s to mid-80s, with humidity around 22-28%. Afternoon ridge winds will be out of the southwest, gusting to 14 mph. Highs will be several degrees cooler Tuesday and Wednesday, with breezier southwest winds, gusting to 15 to 18 mph over ridges.

### INPUTS

**WEATHER SUMMARY: CHANGE IN WEATHER: WARMING, DRYING TREND**

Warming and drying. Mostly sunny.

Temp: 78-86 max; 55-62 min

RH: 20-26% min; Night 45-55% max

Wind (20'): Normal diurnal flow expected, General daytime transport wind SW 3-7mph Gust 12 ridges; AM Ridgetop E 5-7 becoming SW 3-7 in the afternoon; 1900: NE 4-7mph; 2200: Downcanyon 5-9mph

### OUTPUTS

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR

**GENERAL: Smoldering and Creeping. Sunny skies and lowering RH will start to dry fuels. 1-hr and 10-hour available to burn in the afternoon. Night fine dead fuel moistures forecasted to hit 13 except for most exposed drier ridge tops.**

RH low enough to support fire spread in the fine dead fuels in the afternoon. Little movement expected. Slow rates of spread. Isolated pockets of unburned fuel will have potential to support 2ft flame lengths.

Moving into a trend where isolated single tree torching may occur. This fire behavior will be isolated in nature.

Spotting distances will be short range less than a quarter mile max. Spotting from roll out as heavy fuels burn down on steep slopes may occur.

Fire activity (minimal) will continue in areas of the fire that are inaccessible as heavy fuels continue to hold heat.

Expect in increase in smoke production as we begin to dry out through the weekend. Expect to see more hot spots to show themselves as we continue to dry out.

**ERCs for pertinent Predictive Service Areas NC05: 26 <32<sup>nd</sup>%; NC07: 28 <32<sup>nd</sup>% Overall Moderate  
ERC for Bald Mtn RAWs: 36 <32<sup>nd</sup>% Overall Moderate**

#### SPECIFIC:

**Branch 3/5 and 20/25:** Existing containment lines are expected to hold. If a spot occurs outside the main line, expect slow rates of spread and manageable fire behavior.

**Branch 10/15:** Smoldering and creeping fire. Minimal fire spread/growth in the forecast. Potential for isolated single tree torching, especially around jackpots of heavy fuels. A lot of heat exists in heavy fuels - this can get into timber stringers, jackpots, and isolated pockets of fuels.

#### AIR OPERATIONS:

Mostly sunny with clear skies. Moderate inversion sets up overnight, smoke settling in drainages in the AM. Mixing height: 6,000ft. AGL, Transport winds: SW 7mph, Sunrise 0651, Sunset 1900.

### SAFETY

Be alert for any heat still present on a slope below your work area.

Fire weakened timber poses overhead hazards.

Stump holes will continue to hold heat.

**Words of the Day = SITUATIONAL AWARENESS**

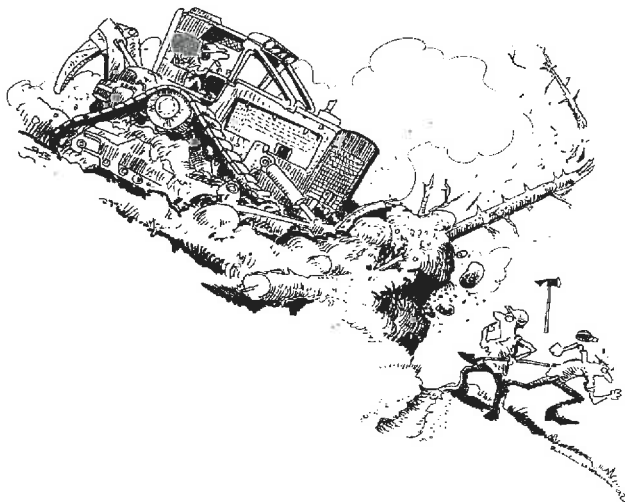
**So what's new on the radar today:**

- 1. Hunting Season (Rifle)** starting today. Maintain ***situational awareness***. If you see a hunter, let them know where you are working. If you hear shooting in your area, advise the division and clear the area if needed until safe. If needed, contact LEO for assistance through the command.
- 2. Traffic issues at and around camp.** Signs are there for a reason, follow them. Be respectful of the public. Evaluate your division's impact on traffic and stagger report and release times if needed. Again, ***situational awareness*** is key. If you see a way you can make the public driver's day better by pulling over, slowing down, or choosing a different route, please do so.
- 3. Hazardous Tree abatement starts** – Heavy equipment is not forgiving, and we will have a wide variety and quantity in this operation. For the operators, ensure you know where you are going, how you are getting there and the leader's expectations. For overhead and support, simply stated stay out of their way. Work together to come up with a mutual plan for safe and efficient operations. Good Briefings are key to your success. Again, ***situational awareness*** is key.

**And welcome back Night Shift**

The limited night shift starts tonight. Ensure good briefings are given. Night forces ensure you have good communication before taking any actions. Remember hazards are a lot harder to see at night and tend to sneak up on you. Have a plan, maintain ***situational awareness***, and when in doubt, stay out.

**5. UNINFORMED ON STRATEGY, TACTICS AND HAZARDS**

**Working with Heavy Equipment**

- When working around heavy equipment, stay at least 100 feet in front and 50 feet behind the equipment. In timber, distances should be increased to 2½ times the canopy height.
- Never approach equipment until you have eye contact with the operator, all implements have been lowered to the ground, and equipment is idled down.
- Avoid working downhill from equipment where rolling material could jeopardize your safety.
- Establish visual and radio communication methods before engaging.
- Communicate all hazards to the operator.
- Equipment operators have difficulty seeing the ground personnel; take responsibility for your safety and all those around you.

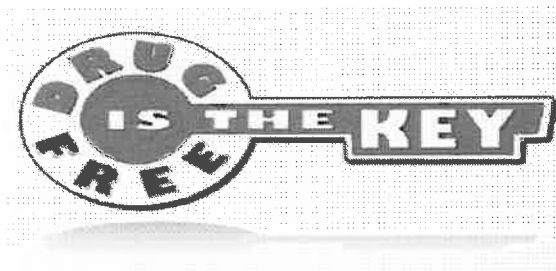

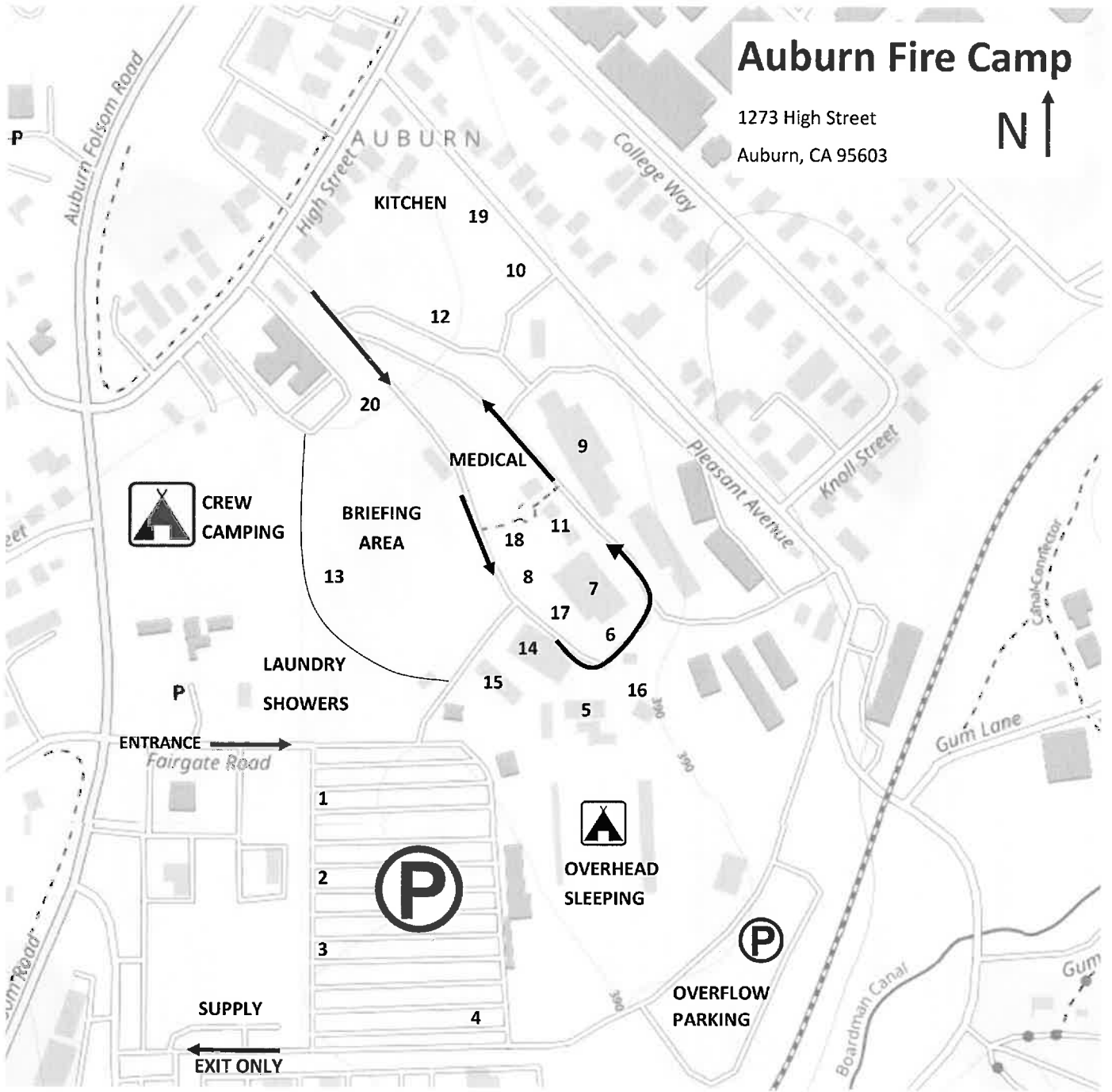

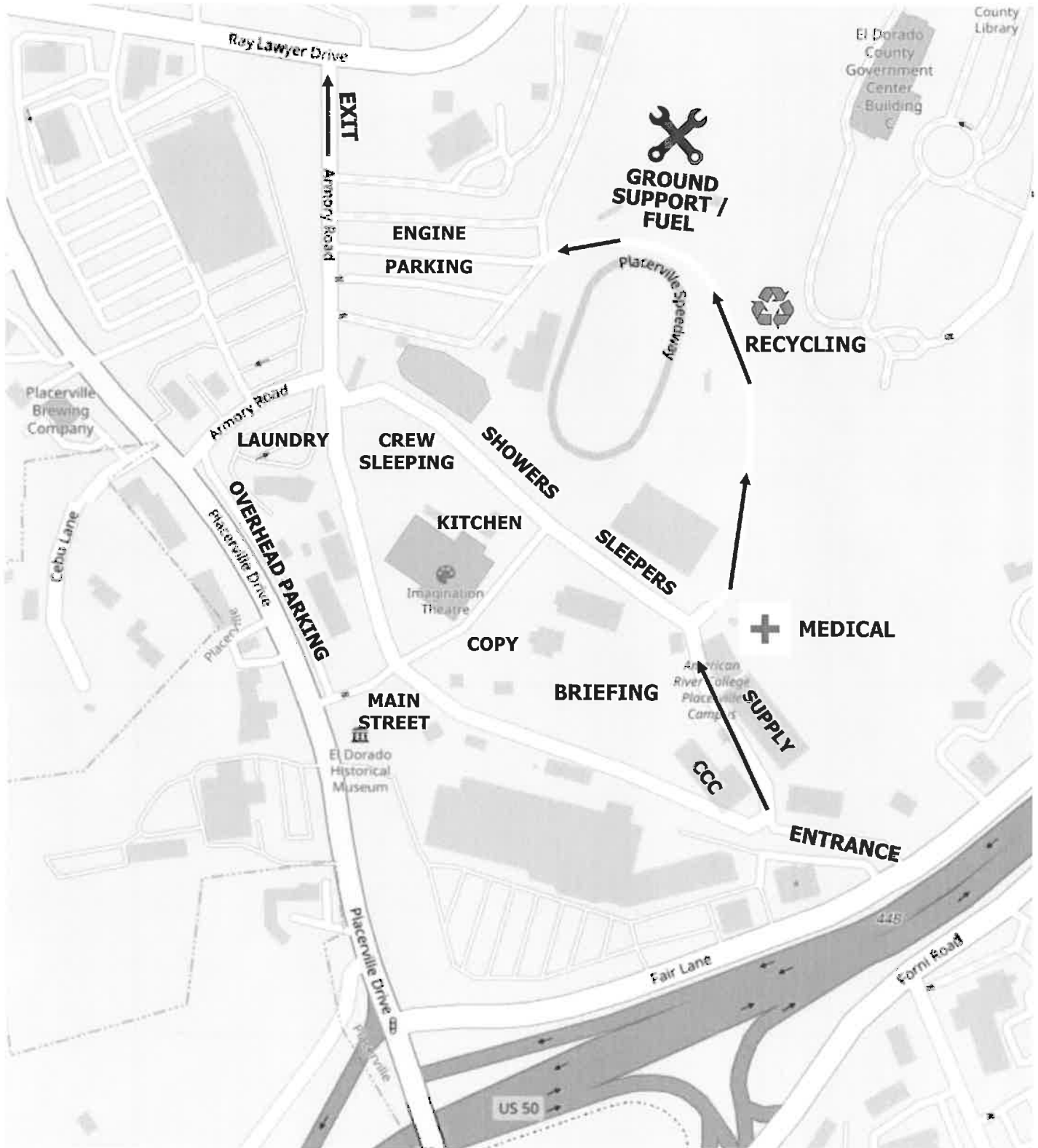
