

## **FIRE WEATHER**

OUTLOOK FOR TUESDAY: Cool and wet with highs upper 50s to lower 60s. Rain begins in the morning, heaviest in the afternoon and overnight. Southwest winds 5 to 9 mph with gusts to 20 to 30 mph over ridges in the afternoon and evening. Afternoon humidity 70-95%. Snow begins Tuesday night above 5000 feet.

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EXTENDED FORECAST: Cold temperatures are expected Wednesday as the storm moves through, with lows in the upper 20s and low 30s, and highs in the upper 30s and lower 40s. Wetting rainfall with amounts of an inch. Accumulating snow with up to 4" of wet snow above 5000 feet, and light snow down to 4000 feet. Heavier amounts are possible on the higher mountains to the east of the fire. Dry weather returns Thursday into early Saturday. Morning lows will be around freezing Friday, with gradual warming for the weekend. Rain is possible late Saturday into early next week, but uncertainty remains high for exact timing and amounts.

## **FIRE BEHAVIOR**

### **Predicted Fire Behavior**

November 1, 2022 – November 7, 2022

Wet and cold weather is expected to begin on Tuesday, November 1 and persist for 2-3 days. Although models still vary, it appears this weather system could bring 1"+ of rain and 1-4" of snow above 5,500 ft elevation. The amount and duration of the predicted precipitation could likely constitute a season ending event for Northern California. Expect danger indices to drop below levels where active fire spread is possible and remain at or below seasonal averages for the foreseeable future.

### **Season Slowing/Ending Events**

Season-ending event consists of a fire-stopping—sometimes referred to as a fire-slowng event(s)—followed by a persistent combination of environmental factors that mark the end of the fire season. These factors can include subsequent pulses of rain or snow, lower temperatures, higher relative humidity, a lower sun angle, and/or a shorter photo period.

## Incident Behavior

Fireline Handbook, Chapter 6 – Common Responsibilities

### Inappropriate Behavior:

It is extremely important that inappropriate behavior be recognized and dealt with promptly. Inappropriate behavior is all forms of harassment including sexual and racial harassment and shall not be tolerated. When you observe or hear of inappropriate behavior you should:

- Inform and educate subordinates of their rights and responsibilities
- Provide support to the victim.
- Develop appropriate corrective measures.
- Report the incident to your supervisor, if the behavior continues. Disciplinary action may be necessary.
- Document inappropriate behavior and report it to the employee's home agency.
- While working in and around private property, recognize and respect all private property.

### Drugs and Alcohol:

- Non-prescription unlawful drugs and alcohol are not permitted at the incident. Possession or use of these substances will result in disciplinary action.
- During off-incident Rest & Recuperation periods, personnel are responsible for proper conduct and maintenance of fitness for duty. Drug or alcohol abuse resulting in unfitness for duty will normally result in disciplinary action.
- Be a positive role model. Do not be involved with drug or alcohol abuse.
- Report any observed drug or alcohol abuse to your supervisor.

As such, self sufficient is no longer practical for the Mosquito Fire.

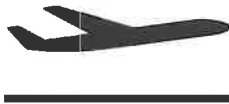
