SAFETY BULLETIN

Driving Safety

- To be a safe driver you have to WANT to be one. Take a good hard look at your driving habits. Do you fasten your seat belt, check your mirrors, and maintain safe following distances?
- Slow Down! Be aware of your speed. Rural and mountain roads can be narrow and twisty. Be aware of limited sight distances due to vegetation, topography, or smoke.
- Inattentiveness is a major contributing factor in motor vehicle accidents within the wildland
 firefighting community. Many things can lure your attention away from driving such as
 fatigue, eating and drinking, reading maps, and using a cell phone or radio. Resist activities
 that take your eyes or mind off the road and your hands off the wheel.
- Practice situation awareness; be aware of what is happening in front, behind, and on both sides of your vehicle. Be constantly moving your vision, checking mirrors and distant road conditions, avoid highway hypnosis and daydreaming
- Be cautious of wet and slippery road surfaces
- Use backers or when alone get out and check your backing path
- Drive only when you are well rested and alert. Take a 10 to 15 minute break after every 2 hours.
- Never drive when drowsy or when taking medications that make you drowsy.
- Check parking areas for snag hazards be aware of other traffic when parking or working on the side of the road
- Maintain vehicle in good condition clean windshields and mirrors daily or as needed, check tires for tread depth, damage and age.
- Secure all cargo in pick-up beds and vehicle interior
- Be aware of embers. Keep windows rolled up, pick-up beds free of flammable material and check black for hot areas if parking or driving in burned area.

Incident Behavior

Fireline Handbook, Chapter 6 – Common Responsibilities

Inappropriate Behavior:

It is extremely important that inappropriate behavior be recognized and dealt with promptly. Inappropriate behavior is all forms of harassment including sexual and racial harassment and shall not be tolerated. When you observe or hear of inappropriate behavior you should:

- Inform and educate subordinates of their rights and responsibilities
- Provide support to the victim.
- Develop appropriate corrective measures.
- Report the incident to your supervisor, if the behavior continues. Disciplinary action may be necessary.
- Document inappropriate behavior and report it to the employee's home agency.
- While working in and around private property, recognize and respect all private property.

Drugs and Alcohol:

- Non-prescription unlawful drugs and alcohol are not permitted at the incident. Possession or use of these substances will result in disciplinary action.
- During off-incident Rest & Recuperation periods, personnel are responsible for proper conduct and maintenance of fitness for duty. Drug or alcohol abuse resulting in unfitness for duty will normally result in disciplinary action.
- Be a positive role model. Do not be involved with drug or alcohol abuse.
- Report any observed drug or alcohol abuse to your supervisor.
