MAP 20, Lower Smith
 Condition: Fire reaches or is expected to reach MAP20 line with the potential to impact Gasquet and Hwy 199, in the next 48-72 hours.
 Values at Risk:
 • Gasquet
 • Hwy 199 transportation route
 • Smith River
 Actions:
 • Consider actions based on current and forecasted fire weather and behavior, the time of season and probability of a season-ending event.
 • Inform Agency Administrator of evacuation and protection action.
 • Consider level 2 evacuation of High and Low Divide Communities.
 • IC to notify AA of structure protection implementation.
 • Begin implementing structure protection operations.

MAP 21, Upper North Fork
 Condition: Fire reaches or is expected to reach MAP21 line with potential to reach control line on 17499 rd within the next 3 to 4 days.
 Values at Risk:
 • High and Low Divide communities
 • Rowdy Creek and Copper Creek watershed
 Actions:
 • Consider actions based on current and forecasted fire weather and behavior, the time of season and probability of a season-ending event.
 • 1. Consider area closure.
 • 2. Inform Agency Administrator of evacuation and protection action.
 • 3. Consider level 2 evacuation of High and Low Divide Communities.
 • 4. Implement structure protection for residents in danger from the fire.
 • 5. Implement tactical firing operation to defend primary control line.

MAP 22, Handcarable
 Condition: Fire is likely to reach MAP22 line with the potential to reach High and Low Divide.

 • Green Diamond Timber Interests
 Actions:
 • Consider actions based on current and forecasted fire weather and behavior, the time of season and probability of a season-ending event.
 • 1. Recommend level 3 Evacuation for High and Low Divide Communities.
 • 2. Inform Agency Administrator of structure protection preparation on High and Low Divide Communities.
 • 3. Consider Unified Command with Cal Fire.

MAP 23, Moores
 Condition: When the fire crosses the MAP and is expected to reach the cabin, and ranch within 72 hours.
 Values at Risk:
 • Major Moore Homes and improvements
 • Major Moore Campground
 • Boat Launch
 Actions:
 • Consider actions based on current and forecasted fire weather and behavior, as well as the time of season and current conditions of a season-ending event.
 • 1. Consider an area closure.
 • 2. Communicate fire situation to Major Moore residents.
 • 3. Inform Agency Administrator of structure protection implementation.
 • 4. Structure preparation should be implemented. Ensure READ is present to address any natural/cultural resource issues.
 • 5. Consider implementing firing operations.

MAP 24, South Fork Road
 Condition: The fire crosses the MAP24 and is expected to impact contingency line with the next 48-72 hours.

 • Jeddiah Smith Redwoods State Park
 Actions:
 • Consider actions based on current and forecasted fire weather and behavior, the time of season and probability of a season-ending event.
 • 1. Consider an area closure.
 • 2. Consider Unified Command with Cal Fire
 • 3. Communicate fire situation to Greater Houchi residents.
 • 4. Inform Agency Administrator of structure protection implementation.
 • 5. Structure preparation should be implemented.
 • 6. Consider implementing firing operations.
 • 7. Coordinate with Resource Advisors to identify and mitigate potential impacts to archaeological or cultural values.

MAP 25, Myrtle Creek
 Condition: When the fire approaches MAP25 and is predicted to impact control line.

 • Hwy 199 transportation corridor
 Actions:
 • Consider actions based on current and forecasted fire weather and behavior, time of season and probability of a season-ending event.
 • 1. Assess and implement structure protection or fuels mitigation options for identified values in the Greater Houchi and Low Divide communities.
 • 2. IC to notify AA. Consider Level 3 evacuation notices for residents of Houchi and Low Divide.
 • 3. Consider expanding area closure.
 • 4. Consider structure protection.

MAP 26, Big Flat
 Condition: Fire threatens MAP 26 with potential to reach Big Flat Communities and residents in the next 48-72 hours.
 Values at Risk:
 • Rock Creek Community
 • Big Flat Community
 Actions:
 • Consider actions based on current and forecasted fire weather and behavior, time of season and probability of a season-ending event.
 • 1. Consider level 3 evacuation.
 • 2. Implement structure protection on structures at risk.
 • 3. Use Defensive tactical firing to defend community if practicable.
 Resources/Notifications:

 • LOFR
 • California Highway Patrol
 • Cal Trans
 • Del Norte Sheriff

MAP 27, Siskiyou Fork
 Condition: Fire crosses Siskiyou Fork and becomes established to the north or east and there is low probability of suppression.
 Note - This is across in one small area but has not moved in several days and should not be considered for this MAP activation unless fire activity increases.
 Values at Risk:
 • Siskiyou Fork Wild and Scenic River watershed
 • Siskiyou Wilderness Values
 Actions:
 • Consider actions based on current and forecasted fire weather and behavior, time of season and probability of a season-ending event.
 • 1. Consult with the AA on what actions should be taken as the fire moves east.
 • 2. Consider increasing direct suppression actions commensurate with the Values at Risk.
 • 3. Retardant is not an option in the protected watershed.
 • 4. Consider continuing prep on the dozer line and Fall Creek road system

MAP 28, Washington Peak
 Condition: Fire becomes established across primary control features to the east or north (Washington Ridge Road and dozer lines) and is not likely to be suppressed.
 Values at Risk:
 • Siskiyou Wilderness Values
 • Stevens Creek watershed
 Actions:
 • Consider actions based on current and forecasted fire weather and behavior, time of season and probability of a season-ending event.
 • 1. Consider continuing prep on the Washington Peak Road as a secondary containment line.
 • 2. Consider increasing direct suppression actions commensurate with the Values at Risk.
 • 3. Retardant is not an option in the Stevens Creek watershed.
 • 4. Consult with the AA on what actions should be taken if the fire breaches the secondary containment line.

MAP 29, WP Firing
 Condition: Fire behavior increases and moves to threaten the established control features.
 Actions:
 • Consider actions based on current and forecasted fire weather and behavior, time of season and probability of a season-ending event.
 • Consider initiating firing operations to keep fire within the primary control line (18N08) road.
 Resources/Notifications:
 • Branch
