WEATHER DISCUSSION: * Valley elevations = 400ft (Gasquet), Ridgetop elevations = 3500 ft (Camp Six) *

A weak trough moves through the area bringing slightly stronger westerly winds. Marine layer intrusion will be significantly less this morning but visibility will still be very low as smoke gets trapped under the surface inversion. Transport winds from the northwest will be stronger, allowing for better visibility on the west side of the fire earlier in the day. Winds will shift to the northeast by night and increase in speed above the surface inversion, which will be shallower and only reach up to 2500ft. Expect a drying trend overnight with near critical fire weather conditions for the higher terrain by Wednesday morning. Winds will diminish with moderating fire weather conditions by Thursday midday.

WEATHER: Clear. Heavy smoke in valleys near the fire with better smoke transport to the east in afternoon.

EXTENDED OUTLOOK: Offshore wind pattern weakens by Thursday as another Pacific trough begins to develop off the coast with a return to onshore flow, increased cloud cover and a chance for rain Thursday night into Friday morning. Upper-level low parks almost overhead and stalls out over the region. This will bring a cool marine influenced

airmass and moderated fire weather conditions straight into the weekend. There is a slight chance for afternoon showers Friday through Saturday along with valley night fog.

WEATHER SUMMARY:

FUELS SUMMARY:

Due to the below normal amount of precipitation, live fuel moisture levels did not fully recover this spring, making the shrubs readily available for consumption. There are snag patches within the fire scars with scabbier fuels; Biscuit (2002), Coon (2015), Bear (2015), Oak (2017) and Slater (2020). The fuel moistures of the manzanita are around 110% and the 1000-hour fuels 9%, below critical levels. The fire scars, including the 2002 Biscuit fire, are a grass and low shrub fuel type (GS2) and have hampered growth of the Corral, Diamond, Island, Prescott, and western portion of the Kelly fires. Outside of the fire scars, the fuels are dominated by a high load conifer with shrub fuel type (TU5) and are highly variable based on elevation.

OUTPUTS

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

We are currently on the tail end of what is peak of fire season for this area of the state. Under smoky conditions, the fire will consume the heavy dead surface fuels with relatively slow rates of spread. Roll-out is a driver of growth in these areas. When the fire is exposed to a stronger wind or gets established on a steep slope with aligned fuels and topography, expect rapid rates of spread with sustained crown runs and moderate range spotting. Take advantage of one last day of favorable conditions to secure as much of the fires edge as possible before 24-hours of adverse weather brings drier conditions and easterly flow over the area starting early Wednesday morning.

SPECIFIC:

Branch V: Unburned fuels will continue to consume in the recently completed burning operations. Take advantage of one last day to secure and mop-up as much of the heat as possible before the winds swap overnight. If available, utilize the UAS to patrol the area between the North Fork and the Biscuit scar. Take advantage of clearer air to work any heat above Gasquet with helicopters before the weather shifts.

Branch XX: The fire will remain active on the south side of the Kelly fire along the 405 and Bear Basin Roads. As the afternoon winds are from a more northerly direction, expect winds in your face and the potential for spot fires across the road to be high. The fire backing down the Craigs Creek should become more active, but won't likely threaten the primary control line this operational period.

Night shift: An inversion should settle in over the fire around 220 moderating fire behavior below 3,000 feet. Expect active fire in Div. YY near DP86 as this area will remain above the inversion layer.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Sunrise 0610, Last Light 2023 (Daylength: losing 2 min, 39 sec each day)

Smoke and marine layer influence will keep air support limited in the morning, with clearing expected around 1000.

SAFETY:

As you begin mopping up the burned area, make sure to scout for hazard trees. Mitigate the hazard, if possible. If not, flag the area and communicate the hazard to adjacent resources.


Invasive Plant Species – PLEASE USE WEED WASH



The area in and around the Smith River Complex, are home to many sensitive species. Infestations of highly invasive plant species are one of the largest threats to sensitive species populations here. Spread via vehicles and foot traffic as well as re-activation via fire is of high concern. To help protect these sensitive places, do not park in and-try to avoid areas flagged areas. Make sure to visit the WEED WASH at end of shift AND at demob. Located on Hwy 199 on the right just past the Ranger Station.

Fish Screens: Coho Salmon Critical Habitat

Most rivers and streams in this area are considered critical habitat for Threatened Coho salmon. Please ensure that Mark 3 and Engine/Tender suction hoses have the appropriate screen attached. Talk to a READ if you think you need a screen!





Port Orford Cedar root disease

Some local drainages are infected with a root disease that spreads via mud and water. To prevent spreading this disease to uninfected areas, all water tenders and engines will apply bleach to their tanks in a 1:1000 ratio (using bleach with 6.0 % Sodium hypochlorite). Talk to a READ if you need some bleach!

• Make sure to call in or stop by to make sure all necessary info is obtained to get the flight that is required






