#### Today's General Fire Behavior:

Last day of heating and drying trend. Fuels will remain dry and receptive for several operational periods. Branch V Divisions have realized an increase in fire behavior due to this latest drying period. Fire activity will be representative of smoldering, creeping, backing and potential for single tree torching with alignment. Light ridge-top forecasted winds will aid in firing operations.

#### Specifics:

#### Branch V

Division VV: Minimal fire behavior, interior smoldering all the way through to the zone break (North).

**Division SS:** Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering and creeping. Backing fire adjacent to DP96 (40 Charlie Rd.), potential slope reversal, slow ROS

Division RR: Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering and creeping, backing fire into Craigs Creek. Potential for roll-out, spotting and slope reversal.

#### Branch XX

**Division YY:** Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering. Backing fire due to previous firing operation between DP55 and DP56. Interior smoldering and creeping near Washington Peak. Backing fire in Siskiyou fork slow ROS.

Division LL: Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering, creeping and backing fire due to previous firing operation in Little Jones Creek off of Bear Basin Rd. Backing fire in the "claws" area.

Division MM: No fire behavior expected.

**Division PP:** Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering, creeping and backing due to previous firing operation on Big Flat Rd. near DP86 (405 Rd.). Potential for spotting.

**Night Shift:** Fire activity may continue into the evening hours based on day operation's environmental factors and fire behavior. Expect poor recovery above 3500ft. West winds becoming East after midnight and downslope in the valleys. Inversion will set in at approx. 2300.

Initial Attack: Warm and dry conditions continue. New starts in the area may exhibit signs of resistance if enough momentum is gained via alignment. Expect moderate to active fire behavior with running surface fire, flanking, and single tree torching.

#### Aviation Safety/Watch out:

Only approach and depart a helicopter as directed. Use a slightly crouched position. Do not run. Always keep in the pilot's field of vision.

#### Safety Message/ Watch Out Situations:

Will you get enough warning of rolling material to prevent being hit by it? Who needs to be watching for rolling material?

#### **Gaining Respect**

- Know your subordinates and look out for their well-being.
- Put the safety of your subordinates above all other objectives.
- Take care of your subordinates' needs.
- Resolve conflicts between individuals on your team.

#### **Operational Leadership**

The most essential element of successful wildland firefighting is competent and confident leadership. In confusing and uncertain situations, a good operational leader will:

- TAKE CHARGE of assignment.
- ASSESS SITUATION by gaining intel.
- MOTIVATE firefighters with a "can do safely attitude."
- DEMONSTRATE INITIATIVE by taking action in the absence of orders.
- COMMUNICATE by giving specific instructions and asking for feedback.
- SUPERVISE at the scene of action.

#### Situational Awareness

There are five major common denominators of fire behavior in fatal and near-fatal fires. Such fires often occur:

- On relatively small fires or deceptively quiet areas of large fires.
- 2. In relatively light fuels, such as grass, herbs, and light brush.
- 3. When there is an unexpected shift in wind direction or in wind speed.
- 4. When fire responds to topographic conditions and runs uphill.
- Critical burn periods between 1400 and 1700. (IRPG p. 5).

Keep these factors in mind during mop-up activities.

## **End of Assignment Watchouts**

- Not mentally engaged in the task at hand.
- Your driver is driving faster than when you got here.
- Not giving good, thorough briefings.
- Your hardhat and web gear are still on the truck.
- Assuming all is good because you worked this piece of ground yesterday.
- All the conversations are about what you are going to do when you get home.
- You and your folks are tripping and stumbling more than usual.
- It is taking you longer to get out of camp and out to the line.
- No AAR after each shift.

#### **CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOR**

#### **SAFETY**

The commitment to and accountability for safety is a joint responsibility of firefighters, managers and administrators. Individuals must personally be committed and responsible for their own performance and accountability. Everyone assigned to this incident can expect an assignment that follows all safety rules & regulations. Every person is expected to perform his or her duties in compliance with all known safety practices at all times. Anything less is unacceptable.

#### **EMPHASIS AREAS**

## **Training**

All trainees and trainers are expected to follow the procedures outlined in the California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 Training Expectations – See back page.

#### **Evaluations**

All supervisory personnel assigned will complete an ICS 225 Incident Personnel Performance Rating form for their assigned resources according to agency policy or contractual agreement.

## Injuries/Claims

Ensure all injuries and potential claims are reported to the Comp/Claims Unit for completion of appropriate paperwork. Contract claims will be reported to the Procurement Unit Leader.

## Work Rest Cycles

The 2: 1 work/rest ratio is mandatory. For every two hours on shift you will be required to rest for one hour. Every effort shall be used to limit work hours to a maximum of 16. If circumstances require you to exceed 16 hours, this needs to be coordinated in advance with your supervisor and the Justification/Mitigation form completed to support the excessive hours prior to submitting for approval by the IC. It is your responsibility to comply with this direction and provide the appropriate documentation to your Supervisor and Finance.

#### **Position Qualifications**

Personnel shall only be assigned to positions for which they are qualified. Proof of qualifications shall be approved prior to being assigned to any fire line position. Non-fireline positions may be filled based on the word of the employee pending home unit confirmation, which must be requested immediately. Contract dozer operators, tactical water tender operators and contract fallers must provide proof that they have received the annual fire refresher training.

#### Engagement/Disengagement

The 10 Standard Orders & 18 Watchout Situations will be followed at all times and mitigated as needed. Staying aware of your situation is critical. This includes Geographic Area and incident briefings. Follow the Risk Management Process outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

#### Debriefing

All Branch Directors/Division/Group Supervisors will report to their Supervisor and Situation Unit at the end of the operational period for debriefing with emphasis on the accomplishment of objectives. All unit logs (ICS 214) will be turned in after the debriefing to Documentation reflecting accomplishment and/or special incidents that occurred during the operational period.

#### Crew Time Reports/Shift Tickets

It is your responsibility to ensure all time is properly accounted for and recorded each shift. The records are to be <u>reviewed and signed</u> by the next level supervisor. A finance "Rules of Engagement" document will be provided in the IAP explaining further requirements.

#### Social Media

It is your responsibility to know and understand guidelines for firefighter photography, video and social media use. California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 goal is simple: to participate online in a respectful, relevant way that protects our incident's professional reputation, does not confuse the public about the incident and follows the letter and spirit of the law. Be mindful that social media postings can be viewed as unprofessional, damage careers and lead to disciplinary actions. For further information, contact the Public Information Officer.

#### Here are some helpful tips:

#### Fire Information is Everyone's Job

Notify chain of command and incident Public Information/ Affairs Officer (PIO/PAO) if media arrives unescorted. Provide for their safety until an escort arrives.

#### Media Interviews:

- Develop and deliver key factual messages; anticipate tough questions.
- Give simple answers (10-20 sec.) and avoid using jargon or acronyms.
- Stick to your knowledge and avoid speaking for other incident personnel.
- Never speak off the record, exaggerate, or try to be cute or funny.
- Keep quiet in between questions; if you misspeak, ask to start again.
- Be personable, professional, and presentable (remove sunglasses and hat).
- Conclude with a safety or wildfire prevention message.

#### Social Media - PAUSE Before Posting:

- PERCEPTION You are representing the jurisdictional agency and your home unit.
- AUTHORITY Be aware of federal and host agency social media policies.
- UNDERSTANDING ~ Know the incident objectives. Never post negative, controversial, or unsafe messages to personal accounts. Ask a PIO/PAO or supervisor for clarification.
- SAFETY Do not compromise your safety while taking photos and always wear proper PPE. Never post photos of children, inmates, investigations, or cultural sites; be sensitive to burned structures and private information.

 EXPECTATION – Share relevant content or photos with PIOs/PAOs to help tell the incident story.
