**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** \* Valley elevations = 400-1200ft (Gasquet), Ridgetop elevations = 3500 ft (Camp Six) \*  
 Temperatures and humidity values continue to moderate through Monday. Mostly sunny skies are expected today. A shallow inversion and very light winds will keep smoky conditions in place today and tonight, with the worst conditions across the lower elevations below 3,000 ft. Good to fair RH recoveries are expected tonight as some maritime air makes it into the fire area.

**EXTENDED OUTLOOK:** Weak Pacific flow keeps temperatures and humidities near seasonal normals. Much drier air return on Tuesday as winds turn northeasterly and increase to gusts above 20 mph possible, especially in the higher elevations. Temperatures will remain near normal, though relative humidities will drop into the 20s to 30s percentile, with poor recoveries expected during the overnight period as well.

**Today's General Fire Behavior:**  
 Expect a significant change in the fire weather. Cooling conditions will aid in securing control lines. Firing opportunities will be limited due to higher RH (30-40%). Micro-climates throughout the incident may continue to support fire spread.

**Specifics:**

**Branch V**

**Division VV:** Minimal fire behavior, interior smoldering all the way through to the zone break (North).  
**Division SS:** Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering and creeping. Backing fire adjacent to DP96 (40 Charlie Rd.), potential slope reversal, slow ROS  
**Division RR:** Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering and creeping, backing fire into Craigs Creek. Potential for roll-out, spotting and slope reversal. Slow ROS.

**Branch XX**

**Division YY:** Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering and creeping near Washington Peak and between DP 55 and DP56. Backing fire in Siskiyou fork slow ROS.  
**Division LL:** Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering, creeping and backing fire off of Bear Basin Rd.  
**Division MM:** No fire behavior expected.  
**Division PP:** Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering, creeping and backing off DP86 (405 Rd.). Potential for rollout spotting.

**Night Shift:** Fire activity may continue into the evening hours based on day operation's environmental factors and fire behavior. Expect moderate to good overnight recoveries above 3500ft. West winds becoming East after midnight and downslope in the valleys. Inversion will set in at approx. 2300.

**Initial Attack:** Forecasted cooler conditions over the next few operational periods will reduce the probability of ignition. New starts in the area will be challenged to becoming established due to high RH, lower temps and smoke shading. Expect minimal to moderate fire behavior with surface fire, flanking, and potential single tree torching with alignment.

#### Aviation Safety/Watch out:

Use easily understandable directions, such as north, south, east, west, 2 o'clock, 9 o'clock, left 20 degrees, right 45 degrees, etc.

#### Safety Message/ Watch Out Situations:

Are there adequate safety zones and escape routes? Review what constitutes an adequate safety zone and escape route. Who has the responsibility to designate them and monitor their continued suitability?



## **CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOR**

Local Law Enforcement Officials will be called to deal with any suspected illegal activities. Each employee has the responsibility to be ready, willing, and able to perform the duties for which they are qualified.

### **Sexual Harassment**

Inappropriate actions or comments will not be tolerated. Everyone is expected to act in a professional manner. It is your responsibility to stop inappropriate actions or comments immediately upon becoming aware of such. Sexual Harassment must be reported to the Human Resource Specialist or Incident Commander. When outside of your designated sleeping area, you are required to wear at least a shirt, appropriate shorts, and shoes or sandals. If you need clarification of these expectations contact the Human Resource Specialist or IC. What we PERMIT we PROMOTE!!!!

## **SAFETY**

The commitment to and accountability for safety is a joint responsibility of firefighters, managers and administrators. Individuals must personally be committed and responsible for their own performance and accountability. Everyone assigned to this incident can expect an assignment that follows all safety rules & regulations. Every person is expected to perform his or her duties in compliance with all known safety practices at all times. Anything less is unacceptable.

## **EMPHASIS AREAS**

### **Training**

All trainees and trainers are expected to follow the procedures outlined in the California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 **Training Expectations** – See back page.

### **Evaluations**

All supervisory personnel assigned will complete an ICS 225 Incident Personnel Performance Rating form for their assigned resources according to agency policy or contractual agreement.

### **Injuries/Claims**

Ensure all injuries and potential claims are reported to the Comp/Claims Unit for completion of appropriate paperwork. Contract claims will be reported to the Procurement Unit Leader.

### **Work Rest Cycles**

The 2: 1 work/rest ratio is mandatory. For every two hours on shift you will be required to rest for one hour. Every effort shall be used to limit work hours to a maximum of 16. If circumstances require you to exceed 16 hours, this needs to be coordinated in advance with your supervisor and the Justification/Mitigation form completed to support the excessive hours prior to submitting for approval by the IC. It is your responsibility to comply with this direction and provide the appropriate documentation to your Supervisor and Finance.

### **Position Qualifications**

Personnel shall only be assigned to positions for which they are qualified. Proof of qualifications shall be approved prior to being assigned to any fire line position. Non-fireline positions may be filled based on the word of the employee pending home unit confirmation, which must be requested immediately. Contract dozer operators, tactical water tender operators and contract fallers must provide proof that they have received the annual fire refresher training.

### **Engagement/Disengagement**

The 10 Standard Orders & 18 Watchout Situations will be followed at all times and mitigated as needed. Staying aware of your situation is critical. This includes Geographic Area and incident briefings. Follow the Risk Management Process outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

### **Debriefing**

All Branch Directors/Division/Group Supervisors will report to their Supervisor and Situation Unit at the end of the operational period for debriefing with emphasis on the accomplishment of objectives. All unit logs (ICS 214) will be turned in after the debriefing to Documentation reflecting accomplishment and/or special incidents that occurred during the operational period.

### **Crew Time Reports/Shift Tickets**

It is your responsibility to ensure all time is properly accounted for and recorded each shift. The records are to be reviewed and signed by the next level supervisor. A finance "Rules of Engagement" document will be provided in the IAP explaining further requirements.

### **Social Media**

It is your responsibility to know and understand guidelines for firefighter photography, video and social media use. California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 goal is simple: to participate online in a respectful, relevant way that protects our incident's professional reputation, does not confuse the public about the incident and follows the letter and spirit of the law. Be mindful that social media postings can be viewed as unprofessional, damage careers and lead to disciplinary actions. For further information, contact the Public Information Officer.

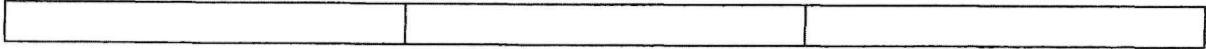

**Remember we are all Information Officers.**

**Here are some helpful tips:**

**Fire Information is Everyone's Job**

Notify chain of command and incident Public Information/ Affairs Officer (PIO/PAO) if media arrives unescorted. Provide for their safety until an escort arrives.

**Media Interviews:**

- Develop and deliver key factual messages; anticipate tough questions.
- Give simple answers (10-20 sec.) and avoid using jargon or acronyms.
- Stick to *your* knowledge and avoid speaking for other incident personnel.
- Never speak off the record, exaggerate, or try to be cute or funny.
- Keep quiet in between questions; if you misspeak, ask to start again.
- Be personable, professional, and presentable (remove sunglasses and hat).
- Conclude with a safety or wildfire prevention message.

**Social Media – PAUSE Before Posting:**

- PERCEPTION – You are representing the jurisdictional agency and your home unit.
- AUTHORITY – Be aware of federal and host agency social media policies.
- UNDERSTANDING – Know the incident objectives. Never post negative, controversial, or unsafe messages to personal accounts. Ask a PIO/PAO or supervisor for clarification.
- SAFETY – Do not compromise your safety while taking photos and always wear proper PPE. Never post photos of children, inmates, investigations, or cultural sites; be sensitive to burned structures and private information.
- EXPECTATION – Share relevant content or photos with PIOs/PAOs to help tell the incident story.
