**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** \* **Valley elevations = 400-1200ft (Gasquet), Ridgetop elevations = 3500 ft (Camp Six) \***  
Temperatures and humidity values continue to moderate through today. Morning clouds will give way to sun in the afternoon, though marine clouds may persist all day below 3,000 ft as the inversion remains in place, especially on the western half of the fire area. Good to excellent RH recoveries are expected overnight as a Pacific air mass will be over the area. Tuesday will be much drier, with relative humidities plummeting through the afternoon and reaching minimums in the 20s percentile on a northerly breeze.

**WEATHER:** Mostly cloudy in the morning, then mostly sunny. Clouds may persist in the low elevations.  
**MAX TEMP:** **Valleys:** 71-77°F (2-3 ↓) **MIN RH:** **Valleys:** 40-70% (little change)  
**Ridgetops:** 68-74°F (little change) **Ridgetops:** 35-45% (3-5 ↑)  
**CHC WTG RAIN:** 0% **LAL:** 1 **SFC VIS:** 1 to 3 miles in clouds partially mixes out  
**WINDS:** **Valleys:** Downslope 3-5 mph becoming upslope 6-8 mph in the afternoon.  
**(20 feet)** **Ridgetops:** Northwest 5-10 mph with gusts to 14 mph.

**MIXING HEIGHT:** Rising to 3,000 ft MSL by 1200. **TRANSPORT WIND:** Northwest 8 mph.

**TONIGHT:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly cloudy with patchy smoke in the valleys and low elevations.  
**MIN TEMP:** **Valleys:** 48-55° (2-3 ↓) **MAX RH:** **Valleys:** 75-95% (5-10 ↑)  
**Ridgetops:** 54-60° (2-3 ↓) **Ridgetops:** 40-70% (5-10 ↑)  
**CHC WTG RAIN:** 0% **LAL:** 1 **SFC VIS:** 1/2 to 2 miles in fog below 2500 ft  
**WINDS:** **Valleys:** Upslope 3-5 mph, becoming downslope after 2100.  
**(20 FEET)** **Ridgetops:** West 4-6 mph, becoming northeast 5-8 mph with gusts to 12 mph after midnight.

**INVERSION:** Inversion height 2500 ft, develops by 2000. **TRANSPORT WIND:** East 7 mph.

**TUESDAY:**

**WEATHER:** Mostly cloudy early, then sunny. Patchy smoke.  
**MAX TEMP:** **Valleys:** 74-80°F (2-4 ↑) **MIN RH:** **Valleys:** 20-28% (15-25 ↓)  
**Ridgetops:** 69-75°F (little change) **Ridgetops:** 25-35% (6-10 ↓)  
**CHC WTG RAIN:** 0% **LAL:** 1 **SFC VIS:** 5 to 10 miles  
**WINDS:** **Valleys:** Downslope 3-5 mph becoming upslope 5-9 mph with gusts to 13 mph in the afternoon.  
**(20 feet)** **Ridgetops:** North 6-12 mph with gusts up to 16 mph.

**MIXING HEIGHT:** Rising to 4,000 ft MSL by 1200. **TRANSPORT WIND:** North 12 mph.

**EXTENDED OUTLOOK:** Dry and breezy conditions for Wednesday and Thursday are expected as winds turn northeasterly with gusts around 25 mph possible, especially in the higher elevations. Temperatures will remain near normal, though relative humidities will drop into the 20s to 30s percentile, with poor recoveries expected during the overnight period as well.

**Today's General Fire Behavior:**  
 Cooler moister conditions have reduced fire activity and shortened burn windows. Marine clouds may persist within the drainages along the western edge of the fire area which will further reduce fire behavior. Surface fuels will support fire spread in shaded and unshaded fuels above the inversion. Fire is expected to continue to creep and smolder but not actively spread.

#### Specifics:

##### Branch V:

**Division VV:** Minimal fire behavior, interior smoldering all the way to the zone break to the (North).  
**Division SS:** Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering, and creeping, backing fire adjacent to DP96 (40 Charlie Road) potential slope reversal, slow ROS.  
**Division RR:** Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering and creeping, backing fire into Craigs Creek, potential slope reversal, slow ROS.

##### Branch XX:

**Division YY:** Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering, creeping, and backing fire near Washington Peak and between DP 55/DP56. Backing fire in Siskiyou fork, slow ROS.  
**Division LL:** Moderate fire behavior, interior smoldering, creeping, and backing fire off Bear Basin Rd. and into Hurdy Gurdy Creek  
**Division MM:** No Fire behavior expected.  
**Division PP:** Minimal fire behavior, interior smoldering, and creeping.

**Night Shift:** Fire behavior is expected to continue to be diminished from what was observed over the past week. Primarily creeping and backing along ridges and down the lee side of ridges. On steeper topography, the fastest spread method for fire will continue to be rollout, but this is less likely due to decreased winds and higher humidity.

**Initial Attack:** If new starts occur, use the above matrix to estimate fire behavior based on the dominant fuel type. New starts are unlikely to exhibit high rates of spread due to cloud cover and humidity over the next operational period.

### Aviation Safety/Watchout

Marine layers and fog will limit visibility early in the morning, do not depend on aircraft for medical extraction.

### Safety Message/Watchout Situations

Although surface fire is expected to diminish throughout the day and night shifts, ground fuels will continue to burn out. Rocks and logs can become dislodged as vegetation burns away that has held them in place. Be mindful of rolling debris and vegetation as you work, have an escape plan, and don't work in areas where material could potentially hit you.




## Lead with Respect

Fireline leaders respect their co-workers and subordinates. This attitude creates an atmosphere of professionalism and effectiveness in line resources. As an additional benefit, safety is enhanced. Employ your people by their qualifications and capabilities.

- Know your people and look out for their well-being.
- Keep your people informed.
- Build the team.

## Command and Control

Ask yourself key questions.

- Are tasks in alignment with tactical objectives?
- Are tactical objectives in alignment with the strategic objectives?
- Are the strategic objectives in alignment with the incident priorities?
- What am I going to do to make a positive impact on this incident today?

## Chainsaw After Action Review

Have the team form a loose circle. Start with a single team member and ask one of these questions.

- **What is one thing that went well on this shift?**
- **What is one thing that did not go well on this shift?**
- **What is one thing you would do differently next time?**
- **What is one thing you learned today?**

Continue around the circle until everyone has had a chance. Avoid unnecessary discussion.

## Operational Briefings

Operational briefings are critical to safe fire operations. A standardized briefing checklist should always be used to ensure a consistent and effective briefing. (Inside back cover of the IRPG)

Briefings should include:

- Situation
- Mission / Execution
- Communications
- Service / Support
- Risk Management

## **CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOR**

Local Law Enforcement Officials will be called to deal with any suspected illegal activities. Each employee has the responsibility to be ready, willing, and able to perform the duties for which they are qualified.

### **Sexual Harassment**

Inappropriate actions or comments will not be tolerated. Everyone is expected to act in a professional manner. It is your responsibility to stop inappropriate actions or comments immediately upon becoming aware of such. Sexual Harassment must be reported to the Human Resource Specialist or Incident Commander. When outside of your designated sleeping area, you are required to wear at least a shirt, appropriate shorts, and shoes or sandals. If you need clarification of these expectations contact the Human Resource Specialist or IC. What we PERMIT we PROMOTE!!!!

## **SAFETY**

The commitment to and accountability for safety is a joint responsibility of firefighters, managers and administrators. Individuals must personally be committed and responsible for their own performance and accountability. Everyone assigned to this incident can expect an assignment that follows all safety rules & regulations. Every person is expected to perform his or her duties in compliance with all known safety practices at all times. Anything less is unacceptable.

## **EMPHASIS AREAS**

### **Training**

All trainees and trainers are expected to follow the procedures outlined in the California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 **Training Expectations** – See back page.

### **Evaluations**

All supervisory personnel assigned will complete an ICS 225 Incident Personnel Performance Rating form for their assigned resources according to agency policy or contractual agreement.

### **Injuries/Claims**

Ensure all injuries and potential claims are reported to the Comp/Claims Unit for completion of appropriate paperwork. Contract claims will be reported to the Procurement Unit Leader.

### **Work Rest Cycles**

The 2: 1 work/rest ratio is mandatory. For every two hours on shift you will be required to rest for one hour. Every effort shall be used to limit work hours to a maximum of 16. If circumstances require you to exceed 16 hours, this needs to be coordinated in advance with your supervisor and the Justification/Mitigation form completed to support the excessive hours prior to submitting for approval by the IC. It is your responsibility to comply with this direction and provide the appropriate documentation to your Supervisor and Finance.

### **Position Qualifications**

Personnel shall only be assigned to positions for which they are qualified. Proof of qualifications shall be approved prior to being assigned to any fire line position. Non-fireline positions may be filled based on the word of the employee pending home unit confirmation, which must be requested immediately. Contract dozer operators, tactical water tender operators and contract fallers must provide proof that they have received the annual fire refresher training.

### **Engagement/Disengagement**

The 10 Standard Orders & 18 Watchout Situations will be followed at all times and mitigated as needed. Staying aware of your situation is critical. This includes Geographic Area and incident briefings. Follow the Risk Management Process outlined in the Incident Response Pocket Guide.

### **Debriefing**

All Branch Directors/Division/Group Supervisors will report to their Supervisor and Situation Unit at the end of the operational period for debriefing with emphasis on the accomplishment of objectives. All unit logs (ICS 214) will be turned in after the debriefing to Documentation reflecting accomplishment and/or special incidents that occurred during the operational period.

### **Crew Time Reports/Shift Tickets**

It is your responsibility to ensure all time is properly accounted for and recorded each shift. The records are to be reviewed and signed by the next level supervisor. A finance “Rules of Engagement” document will be provided in the IAP explaining further requirements.

### **Social Media**

It is your responsibility to know and understand guidelines for firefighter photography, video and social media use. California Interagency Incident Management Team 4 goal is simple: to participate online in a respectful, relevant way that protects our incident’s professional reputation, does not confuse the public about the incident and follows the letter and spirit of the law. Be mindful that social media postings can be viewed as unprofessional, damage careers and lead to disciplinary actions. For further information, contact the Public Information Officer.

**Here are some helpful tips:**

**Fire Information is Everyone’s Job**

Notify chain of command and incident Public Information/Affairs Officer (PIO/PAO) if media arrives unescorted. Provide for their safety until an escort arrives.

**Media Interviews:**

- Develop and deliver key factual messages; anticipate tough questions.
- Give simple answers (10-20 sec.) and avoid using jargon or acronyms.
- Stick to *your* knowledge and avoid speaking for other incident personnel.
- Never speak off the record, exaggerate, or try to be cute or funny.
- Keep quiet in between questions; if you misspeak, ask to start again.
- Be personable, professional, and presentable (remove sunglasses and hat).
- Conclude with a safety or wildfire prevention message.

**Social Media – PAUSE Before Posting:**

- **P**ERCEPTION – You are representing the jurisdictional agency and your home unit.
- **A**UTHORITY – Be aware of federal and host agency social media policies.
- **U**NDERSTANDING – Know the incident objectives. Never post negative, controversial, or unsafe messages to personal accounts. Ask a PIO/PAO or supervisor for clarification.
- **S**AFETY – Do not compromise your safety while taking photos and always wear proper PPE. Never post photos of children, inmates, investigations, or cultural sites; be sensitive to burned structures and private information.
- **E**XPECTATION – Share relevant content or photos with PIOs/PAOs to help tell the incident story.

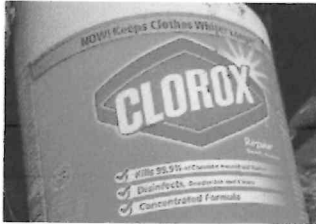

### Port Orford Cedar root disease

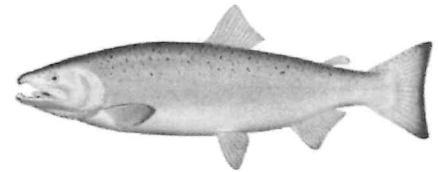
