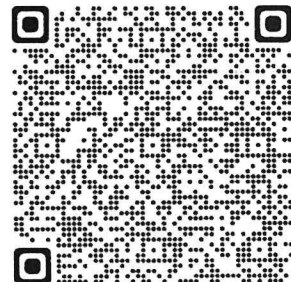



WEATHER DISCUSSION: The remnants of tropical storm Hilary will move out of the area today however clouds and a few showers will linger in the morning. Breezy northeast winds will diminish through the day then become northwesterly. Clouds and lingering moisture will keep humidity levels higher and daytime temperatures lower. Overnight recoveries will be high.

FORECAST FOR TODAY: Mostly cloudy (50-75%) partially clearing in the afternoon. 20% chance for light rain in the morning, especially in Branch X. NE winds become NW in the afternoon. Breezy winds along the ridges. **CWR(>0.1"):** 10%

OUTLOOK FOR TUESDAY: Complicated pattern as the area is caught between two areas of low pressure. Increasing probability of breezy northwest winds, especially along Holter Ridge. Temperatures will see minimal change with highs in the mid 70s to low 80s, and lows in the 60s. Strong overnight recoveries with humidity near 90% in Branch XL and V, and in the upper 70s in Branch X.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The majority of all of the fires in the complex are presently in a backing alignment. Primary fire spread will be active backing surface fire. Roll out will also contribute to fire spread. Rapid upslope runs are possible from the rollout but the fire will burn back into itself. Any other spotting will be short range less than 100 feet. With the large amount of snags expect some single tree torching. The cloud cover and smoke will moderate fire behavior. However, if the smoke and clouds clear, expect a dramatic increase in fire behavior. With the steep multiple intersecting drainages, active fire has a high probability of generating fire whirls.

If any resources are called to assist with IA expect minimal rates of spread with mainly surface fire and some torching in the denser tree stands.

SPECIFIC:

Lone Pine: Minimal forward fire progression is expected. Containment lines will continued to be challenged from rollout and falling snags.

Pearch Fire: Expect active backing and flanking fire spread. Keep a heads up for fire spread or rollout that could lead to slope reversals. Fire established on a aligned slope will have rapid rates of spread and the potential for short crown runs. All other fires to the north including;

Mosquito Fire: Minimal forward progression expected for the next 24 hours.

Redwood Fires: Lost Fire: Expect backing fire with minimal flame lengths. Some single and group tree torching is probable with short range spotting. Keep a heads up for fire movement south across Lost Man Creek which will lead to a slope reversal up Holter Ridge. Devil and Glen Fires: Continued smoldering with no new forward fire movement expected.

Night Shift: With the RH recovery minimal forward fire progression is expected on any of the fires.

AIR OPERATIONS: With the smoke and cloud cover opportunities for air support are minimal.

SAFETY

- Make sure Lookouts are posted in places where they can see potential spotting.
- Fire weakened timber poses a threat to personnel working in timber areas.
- Unburned fuel between you and the fire.

PLANNING FOR MEDICAL EMERGENCIES

Prior to each operational period, all wildland firefighters need to ask and be able to answer the following questions:

- 1. What are we going to do if someone gets hurt?**
- 2. How will we get them out of here?**
- 3. How long will it take to get them to them to the hospital?**

All operational activities should be based on answers to these questions. If the answers are insufficient, stop, reassess, and consider alternative strategies and tactics.

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DRIVING

Go slower than you normally would.

Giving yourself an additional 1/2 second to a few seconds of reaction time can mean the difference between life and death.

Go slower through town. People that live here are not used to the amount of traffic there is now. Going slower will add additional reaction time.

Avoid Distractions. Don't talk on the cell phone, grab a map or your lunch while driving. Pull over if you need to do something other than drive.

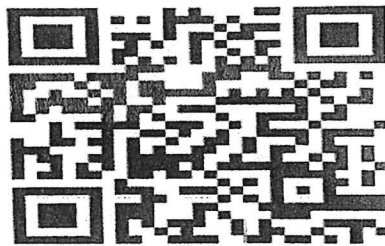
