

WEATHER DISCUSSION: A weather system moving onshore will promote cooler temperatures along with higher relative humidity values. The initial push of moisture across the region may produce a few light showers, however rainfall amounts will be less than 0.10". This weather system will stall across Northern California allowing for additional pockets of moisture to push in across the area. As such additional showers will remain possible into Friday. A more unstable air mass will be present and may allow for a few isolated thunderstorms, mainly along the crests.

FORECAST FOR TODAY: Smoke this morning but an earlier inversion breaking by midday with increasing clouds leading to a slight chance of light rain showers or sprinkles. An overall trend of cooler and higher minimum relative humidity and less gusty northerly winds.

Discussion: Slight cooling trend along with increasing relative humidity values starts Thursday ahead of the next incoming weather system. Winds will remain onshore Thursday which will allow for the marine layer to push inland by the afternoon and evening. This marine layer push may also result in light showers, mainly Thursday afternoon with a few hundredths of an inch of rainfall possible. Minimum relative values will drop to near 80% lower elevations and 60% ridges.

OUTLOOK FOR FRIDAY: Similar temperatures to Thursday with slightly higher relative humidity values are expected for Friday as a weather system stalls across northern California. The location of this weather system will allow for better chances of light rain showers across the area. Preliminary rainfall amounts could be around a tenth of an inch. A more unstable air mass also means there's a slight chance for an isolated thunderstorm, mainly to the east across the higher terrain. Winds will remain onshore allowing for the marine layer to push inland by the afternoon and evening. Minimum relative values will drop to near 80%.

Extended Forecast: Weather conditions will remain nearly similar for the first half of the weekend as the weather system remains stalled across the area. This weather system starts to move eastward by the second half of the weekend with temperatures gradually moderating and a very gradual drying trend.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Cooler and more moist conditions will moderate the fire behavior for the next several days. The fire activity will be dependent on how much smoke shading the fires get from Smith and Happy Complexes. Primary fire spread will be active backing and flanking surface fire. Roll out will also contribute to fire spread. Rapid upslope runs are possible when fire reaches drainage bottoms and reverses slope. Spotting from torching trees will be in the range of 100 feet. With the large amount of snags, surface fire will be resistant to control. With the steep multiple intersecting drainages, active fire has a high probability of generating fire whirls.

Probability of ignition 40%

If any resources are dispatched to assist with IA expect slow to moderate rates of spread with mainly surface fire and some torching in the denser tree stands.

SPECIFIC:

Branch V: No forward fire progression is expected fire behavior will be smoldering and creeping.

Branch X: Expect active backing and flanking fire spread. Keep a heads up for fire spread or rollout that could lead to slope reversals. Fire established on an aligned slope will have rapid rates of spread and the potential for short crown runs. With the heavy dead down component, fires will be resistant to control. Conditions will remain favorable to continue the burning operation on DIV J.

Branch XX: Expect active surface fire with single tree torching. With the fires located on exposed ridges, keep a heads up for spot fires from the torching trees. All of the fires are in a backing alignment.

Redwood Fires: Lost Fire: Expect mainly backing fire with smoldering and creeping. Minimal to no forward fire progression is expected. Bridge: Minimal to no forward fire progression is expected. Winds will continue to enhance the probability that fire weakened trees will continue coming down. Redwoods are starting to shed their needles, this needle cast will carry fire and could compromise existing lines.

Night Shift: With the RH recovery, minimal forward fire progression is expected on any of the fires after about 0200hrs.

AIR OPERATIONS: Expect the smoke to limit air operations until the inversion mixes out, potentially as late as 1530.

SAFETY

- Make sure Lookouts are posted in places where they can see potential spotting.
- Fire weakened timber poses a threat to personnel working in timber areas.

Back to the Basics

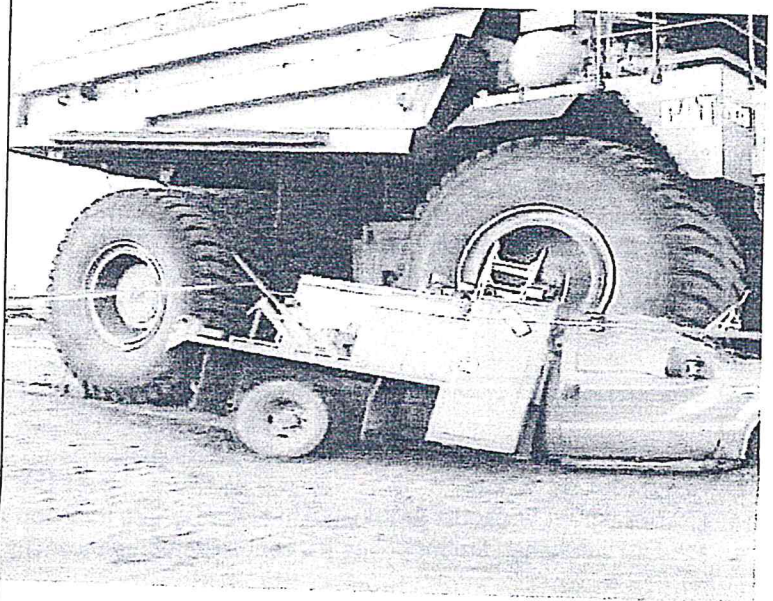
When working with and around Heavy Equipment

- Use 3-Points of contact when climbing out of apparatus and truck beds.
- Take your time and use handrails when stepping out of trailers or down ramps.
- Never assume that the operator can see you, especially at night.
- Ensure that communications are established with the operator.
- Maintain a 50' to 100' exclusion area around equipment. Beware of flying objects!
- Maintain safe following distances when traveling in group formation. Allow for braking time.
- Chipper operators feed wood & brush material and crews bring wood & brush material to chipper. Review Chipper JHA daily.

Watch Out Situation #12

- Cannot see main fire; not in contact with someone who can.
- Ensure the correct communication channel and communications is effective. **Especially in Branch XX, DIVS O**
- Ensure Lookout is communicating updates of weather and fire behavior on a continuing basis.
- Secure escape routes and safety zones.
