Discussion:

Little change in the weather today as compared to Thursday. Moderate overnight humidity recoveries will occur over the mid-slopes and ridges once again. Afternoon humidity values will range from the teens to mid 20s over the valleys and mid 20s to mid 30s over the mid-slopes and ridges. Winds today will go from offshore/northeast early to northwest by early afternoon. By Saturday, the ridge of high pressure will begin to break down as a trough approaches the coast. This will result in more onshore flow which will help hold afternoon humidities up about 10 percent as compared to Friday.

TODAY:

Sky/Weather: Continued mostly sunny and hot.

Max Temperature: Valleys: 90 to 97. Mid-Slopes and Ridges: 73 to 81. Min RH: Valleys: 15 to 25 percent. Mid-Slopes and Ridges: 25 to 35 percent.

20 ft Winds: Lower Valleys: Terrain 3 to 7 mph becoming northwest 4 to 8 mph with gusts to 14 mph.

Mid-slopes and Ridges: North-northeast 8 to 12 mph with gusts to 15 mph becoming west 8 to 12 mph with

gusts to 15 mph after 1400.

Transport Winds: SW 7 mph. Chance of Rain: 0 percent.

Expected Rain Amount: None.

TONIGHT:

Sky/Weather: Mostly clear. Smoke and fog possible in low lying drainages.

Min Temperature: Lower Valleys: 54 to 58. Mid-Slopes and Ridges: 55 to 62.

Max RH: Lower Valleys: 65 to 75 percent. Mid-Slopes and Ridges: 40 to 50 percent.

20 ft Winds: Valleys/Lower Slopes: Terrain/down-valley 4 to 8 mph.

Mid-Slopes and Ridges: Northeast 4 to 8 mph with gusts to 12 mph.

Inversion: 300 ft after 2100.

SATURDAY:

Sky/Weather: Smoke/fog possible in the valleys early. Mostly clear on the ridges. Slightly cooler.

Max Temperature: Valleys: 88 to 94. Mid-Slopes and Ridges: 69 to 75. Min RH: Valleys: 20 to 30 percent. Mid-Slopes and Ridges: 35 to 45 percent.

20 ft Winds: Lower Valleys: Terrain 3 to 7 mph becoming southwest 8 to 12 mph with gusts to 18 mph.

Mid-slopes and Ridges: North-northeast 8 to 12 mph with gusts to 15 mph becoming southwest 8 to 12 mph

with gusts to 17 mph after 1400.

Transport Winds: SW 12 mph.

Chance of Rain: 0 percent.

Expected Rain Amount: None.

OUTLOOK FOR SUNDAY THROUGH TUESDAY: A shift in the weather pattern will continue through the period as the ridge of high pressure breaks down. This will result in better overnight recoveries and moderate afternoon minimum humidity values. Temperatures will continue to trend downward through the period returning to near or below normal by Monday. A storm system will approach the area on Monday bringing the strong likelihood of a wetting rain both Monday and Tuesday.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

- Conditions in the fire environment (▲temperature, ▼humidity, ▼fuel moistures) will continue to become
 increasingly favorable for fire spread.
- Expect additional heat sources in the fire area to become visible.
- Moderate overnight humidity recovery will make fuels available earlier in the day.
- Monitor afternoon winds in your area for alignment with unburned available fuels and slope.

SPECIFIC:

Branch X: Minimal fire activity throughout fire area. Smoke may be visible in Div Y in the upper Monte Creek drainage. Monitor for fire/heat creeping through duff near control features. Keep an eye out for heat holdovers in stump holes, standing trees, or where heat can smolder for a long time without showing much smoke.

Branch XX: Increasing fire activity throughout fire area with new perimeter growth in the eastern portion of the branch.

Div O: Expect continued backing and flanking spread to the SW and NE on Lightning Ridge with possible short uphill runs. If fire is able to get established to the S/SE of Lightning Gulch, expect low to moderate spread rates on the north aspect.

Div R: In the Dillon Mtn area, expect continued perimeter growth in the 14N21 Road area. However, forecasted winds at mid slopes and ridgetops should generally be out of alignment with slope. An exception would be the flank near the 13N47 Rd, where afternoon winds and slope may be in alignment.

AIR OPERATIONS:

Increased smoke production may limit potential air operations in the drainages within Divisions O and R. Sunrise: 7:16am, Sunset: 6:48pm, Daylength: 11 hours, 32 minutes, 7 seconds (-2:40 min)

SAFETY:

Many current operations are taking place on roads. Be heads up for changes in fire behavior that make affect your access and egress from your work area. Identify alternative travel routes.

Redundancy Systems

Can you think of a few simple things in your day-to-day life that are redundant but make things better? How about that spare tire in the trunk of your car? Or the battery in your smoke detectors? These are simple duplication and backups that keep the system running in case of a failure.

In wildland firefighting we use checklists, the IRPG and reassessments as a redundant back up to our training and experience. This can mean duplication of critical evaluations before engaging in a hazardous task. On a long fire like the SRF Lightning Complex, many safety topics have been briefed over the course of your assignment, but as a crew boss it is useful to review previously discussed hazards. Below are some topics already touched upon that you can use in your tailgate briefings to review with your crew members:

- Hazard Tree and Snag Safety.
- Driving and hazardous Road Conditions.
- · Mop up and fire line repair.
- Radio Communications
- Working around heavy equipment
- · Trips and falls working on steep slopes
- · Ash pits and stump holes
- Medical emergencies and preplanning the 206 information.

Safety and redundancy are not the same, but increasing redundancy has the effect of increasing safety in most cases. Even if you think you have already covered these topics enough, review and recap those that most apply to your work area. It never hurts to hear important information more than once.
