- MOSQUITO
Keep the fire within the Six Rivers National Forest.

Maintain fires within their current perimeters.

General Situational Awareness:

Steep and rugged terrain, active area for fire history and drought stressed trees.

Discussion:

Warm and dry conditions will continue across the fire area today and Sunday with only slight increases in humidity. Temperatures will be a few degrees cooler each day as winds become onshore during the afternoon/evening hours. Offshore flow will continue overnight with smoke and fog impacted low lying areas. Visibility could be significantly reduced tonight into Sunday morning.

TODAY:

Sky/Weather: Smoke/fog possible in the valleys through 1100. Mostly clear after that. Slightly cooler.
Max Temperature: Valleys: 88 to 94. **Mid-Slopes and Ridges:** 69 to 75.
Min RH: Valleys: 20 to 30 percent. **Mid-Slopes and Ridges:** 30 to 40 percent.
20 ft Winds: Lower Valleys: Terrain 3 to 7 mph becoming southwest 8 to 12 mph with gusts to 18 mph.
Mid-slopes and Ridges: North-northeast 8 to 12 mph with gusts to 15 mph becoming southwest 8 to 12 mph with gusts to 17 mph after 1400.
Transport Winds: SW 13 mph.
Chance of Rain: 0 percent. **Expected Rain Amount:** None.

TONIGHT:

Sky/Weather: Increasing clouds overnight with smoke and fog in low lying drainages.
Min Temperature: Lower Valleys: 54 to 58. **Mid-Slopes and Ridges:** 55 to 62.
Max RH: Lower Valleys: 65 to 75 percent. **Mid-Slopes and Ridges:** 40 to 50 percent.
20 ft Winds: Valleys/Lower Slopes: Terrain/down-valley 4 to 8 mph.
Mid-Slopes and Ridges: Northeast 4 to 8 mph with gusts to 12 mph.
Inversion: 300 ft after 2100.

SUNDAY:

Sky/Weather: Smoke/fog possible in the valleys early. Partly to mostly cloudy otherwise. Slightly cooler once again..
Max Temperature: Valleys: 85 to 90. **Mid-Slopes and Ridges:** 69 to 75.
Min RH: Valleys: 20 to 30 percent. **Mid-Slopes and Ridges:** 30 to 45 percent.
20 ft Winds: Lower Valleys: Terrain 3 to 7 mph becoming southwest 8 to 12 mph with gusts to 20 mph.
Mid-slopes and Ridges: North-northeast 8 to 12 mph becoming southwest 10 to 14 mph with gusts to 20 mph after 1400.
Transport Winds: SW 17 mph.
Chance of Rain: 0 percent. **Expected Rain Amount:** None.

OUTLOOK FOR MONDAY THROUGH WEDNESDAY: A storm system will impact the area beginning Monday bringing wetting rains to most locations along with much cooler weather. Precipitation will continue off and on through early Wednesday with 0.75-1.50" of precipitation expected. Along with the precipitation, temperatures Monday and Tuesday will be much cooler. Mid-slopes and ridges will likely remain in the upper 40s to lower 50s for highs. Valleys will see readings generally in the 60s. Temperatures will rebound slightly on Wednesday as the storm exits and the cloud cover becomes more scattered.

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FIRE BEHAVIOR

- GENERAL:**
- Some conditions in the fire environment begin to moderate (▼temperature and ▲humidity) in the coming days, but there will be a day or two of lag in fuel moisture response.
 - Expect additional heat sources in the fire area to become visible.
 - Moderate overnight humidity recovery will continue through Sunday AM.
 - Monitor afternoon SW winds in your area for alignment with unburned available fuels and slope.

SPECIFIC:

Branch X: Minimal fire activity throughout fire area. Smoke may be visible in Div Y in the upper Monte Creek drainage. Interior smokes will be visible in the high-elevation interior portions of Div J. Monitor for fire/heat creeping through duff near control features. Keep an eye out for heat holdovers in stump holes, standing trees, or where heat can smolder for a long time without showing much smoke. Expect rollout to continue on steeper slopes.

Branch XX: Increasing fire activity throughout fire area with new perimeter growth in the eastern portion of the branch.

Div O: Expect continued backing and flanking spread to the SW and NE on Lightning Ridge with possible short uphill runs toward the ridgetop. Fire is projected to remain on the north side of the Lightning Gulch drainage.

Div R: There are several areas within the division where fire below the 14N21 Road will see wind and slope alignment when the wind turns to SW in the afternoon. This includes the area fired on 8/6, where today's wind is forecast to be adverse in the afternoon. Areas of new growth south of Dillon Mountain will likely spread uphill toward the 14N21. Fire established above the 14N21, on the south aspect of Dillon Mtn is expected to continue spreading upslope and flanking to the NE.

All other Divisions: Expect additional interior areas of heat and areas of interior perimeter growth to become visible and produce smoke.

AIR OPERATIONS: Smoke may limit potential air operations in the drainages within Divisions O and R.
 Sunrise: 7:17am, Sunset: 6:46pm, Day length: 11 hours, 29 minutes, 26 seconds (-2:40 min)

SAFETY: As the fire footprint expands, be heads-up for new fire-weakened trees in your work areas and travel routes. With a transition to SW winds, trees will be tested by a new wind direction.



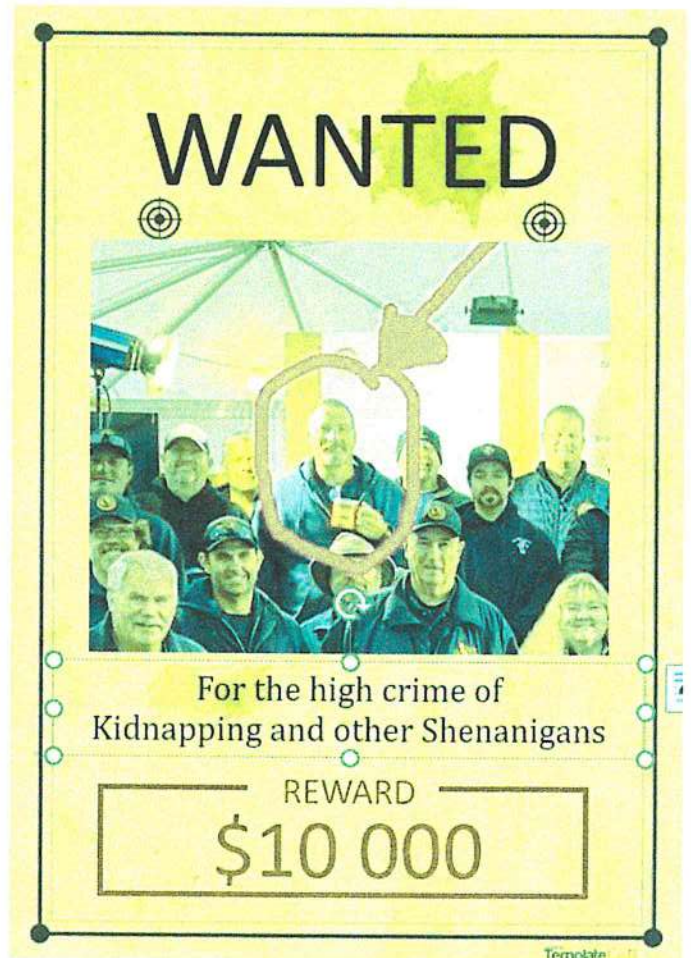

If someone on your crew is sick go see medical for meds and use disinfecting wipes and/or disinfecting sprays on equipment and vehicles. Do not share food or liquids. Try not to spread infectious disease and/or colds. Get your crews well rested after each shift.

CAMP SAFETY- Make sure you're in a designated Sleeping Area, no sleeping around vehicles. If you see a hazard, make it known and stop the hazard.

BRUSH CHIPPER: Make sure all personnel working with Brush Chippers review the Job Hazard Analysis (JHA) and conduct Tail Gate Safety Sessions before operations of chipping begin. Make sure all personnel are properly trained in the use of Brush Chippers before work begins.

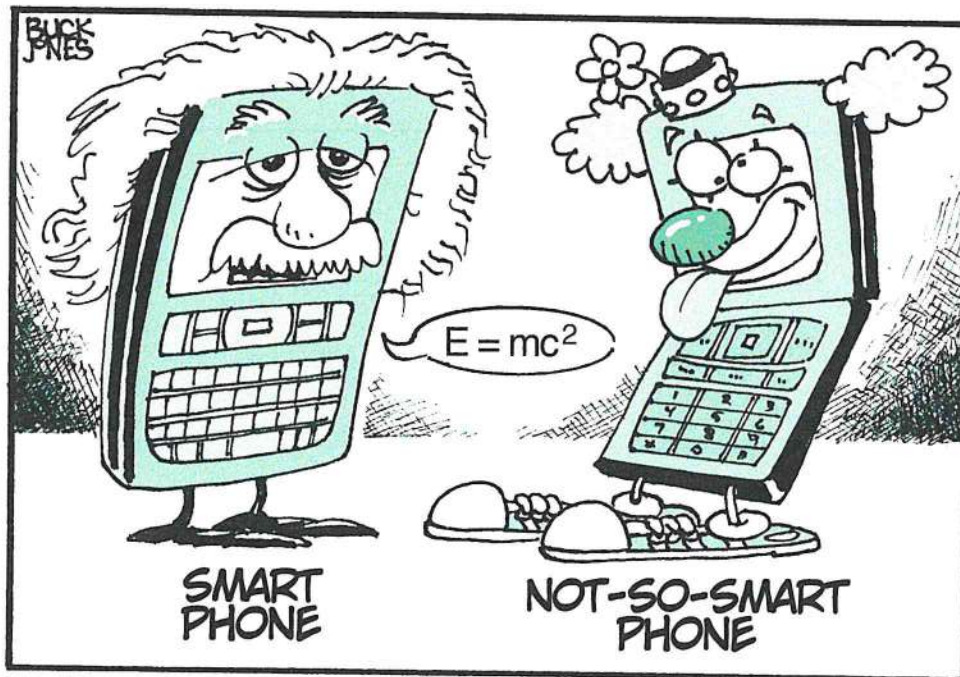


