<u>WEATHER DISCUSSION</u>: Another round of precipitation is expected on Tuesday with showers off and on through much of the day. Light precipitation lingers into early Wednesday before ending. No precipitation is expected Thursday but the weather pattern will support additional precipitation over the weekend. Below normal temperatures are expected Wednesday with a return to near normal temperatures Thursday and Friday.

OUTPUTS

GENERAL:

Overall, fire behavior will be minimal. Heavy fuels like snags, logs, heavy duff, stumps, and roots will harbor heat until successive waves of precipitation occur and extinguish it. By Friday, several days after precipitation, fuels may be dry enough for heat holding over in heavy fuels to begin spreading again. However, alignment of wind and slope will be required for significant perimeter growth. There is a chance for another round of precipitation late in the week, which may preclude any additional fire spread. SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR: Tuesday — Saturday, October 10° — 14°, 2023

Pearch: Anticipate minimal fire activity for several days. Expect some heat to hold over in heavy fuels in the upper portions of the Monte Creek drainage. Even without perimeter growth, heavy fuels may continue to burn out, which may cause debris to roll down steep slopes. Rollout of debris could continue to affect Hwy 96. By Friday, small-scale perimeter growth might occur in upper Monte Creek.

Mosquito: Anticipate minimal fire activity for several days. Expect some heat to hold over (smoldering in heavy fuels and possibly cresping in sheltered fuels) in the in the areas that showed activity most recently: on Dillon Mountain, near the 14N21 Rd, and in the Lightning Ridge area. By Friday, a small amount of perimeter growth may be possible in these areas. Expect primarily lowintensity, creeping fire behavior if surface spread initiates within the 5-day timeframe. An interior pocket of heat just north of the East Fork of Bluff Creek may also begin to spread within the forecast period.

All Other Fires: Expect minimal to no fire activity through the forecast period.

AIR OPERATIONS

Smoke is not expected to limit air operations in the next 5 days. However, low clouds or high winds may affect operations.

SAFETY

As fire activity winds down, do not let your guard down. Make sure your work area is assessed for fire-weakened trees and potential rolling hazards (such as rocks & logs) when doing repair work and patrolling.

Transition Day: Go Slow to Go Fast

Regardless of fire behavior or activities, transition is a likely time for things to slip through the cracks! Know who you are working for and establish good communication with them for accountability. If you don't know something, **ASK**. If you have helpful information pass it on. Remember that an obvious hazard to you may be unknown to others, unless YOU communicate it!!!

- There are new division supervisors, do you know who you are working for?
- Do you have an updated map?
- · Do you know what command and tactical channels you are using?
- Do you know what to do in case of a medical emergency? (See the ICS 206)

Snags:

- There are dead and fire weakened trees throughout the burn area. Maintain strong situational awareness for snag issues in your work area at all times. Ensure a good size up of the area and only mop-up to the extent needed to secure the line. Look up, look down, and around.
- · Perform a risk assessment before working in snags and evaluate the risk vs. benefit.

Suppression Repair:

- If you are working near heavy equipment, stay at least 100 feet in front and 50 feet behind all equipment. In timber, distances should be increased to 2.5 times the canopy height.
- Have good communication with operator.

Driving:

 Highways are narrow and winding with steep drop offs. Dirt roads are slick with the current rain. They are steep with soft shoulders. The rain has caused rolling rocks to come onto the roadbed


