

DISCUSSION: High pressure remains over the region today and through the remainder of the week and into the weekend. Warm and dry conditions are expected with east-northeast winds this morning becoming light westerly winds along exposed ridges this afternoon. However, winds will be mostly terrain driven with downslope/downvalley in the morning and becoming upslope/upvalley in the afternoon, with light and variable winds in sheltered drainages and under the forest canopy. A moderate inversion is expected each night this week and it will continue mixing out around noon, but due to the lack of smoke and moisture, there are no visibility restrictions expected that would affect air ops.

WEDNESDAY:

- WEATHER: Sunny
- WIND (20 FT): Ridges and exposed drainages: east-northeast 8-10 in the morning, becoming westerly at 8-10 mph after 1100. Otherwise, terrain driven downslope / downvalley in the morning and upslope / up-valley during the afternoon. Light and variable winds in sheltered drainages (Granite Creek) and under the shelter of the forest canopy.
- MAX TEMPERATURES: 85-90 lower slopes and drainages, 78-83 mid-slope.
- MIN RH: 25% in exposed areas and 35-40% under the canopy.
- MAX RH: 30 35% above the inversion (>3000 feet) and 70-80% below
- INVERSION: Moderate mid-slope...mixing out around 1100.
- Days since wetting rain: 5

THURSDAY:

- WEATHER: Sunny
- WIND (20 FT): Ridges and exposed drainages: westerly at 8-10 mph after 1200. Otherwise, terrain driven downslope / downvalley in the morning and upslope / up-valley during the afternoon. Light and variable winds in sheltered drainages (Granite Creek) and under the shelter of the forest canopy.
- MAX TEMPERATURES: 86-92 lower slopes and drainages, 79-85 mid-slope.
- MIN RH: 23% in exposed areas and 35-40% under the canopy.
- MAX RH: 45-50% above the inversion (>3000 feet) and 75-85% below
- INVERSION: Moderate mid-slope...mixing out around 1100.
- Days since wetting rain: 6

Extended outlook: Friday through Sunday: High pressure will remain overhead on Friday and Saturday with warm and dry conditions continuing. Winds will be mostly orographic with downslope/downvalley at night and in the morning, becoming upslope/upvalley late morning through the afternoon. Ridges and exposed west to east aligned drainages will have west winds at 8 - 10 mph with occasional gusts up to 15 mph. Inversion will set up overnight each night and break around noon, however the impacts will be minimal to aviation due to the lack of smoke and fog. A lot of uncertainty in the forecast to end the weekend. There is potential for increased moisture on Sunday, with a slight chance for light rain or drizzle, however a wetting rain is unlikely.

WEATHER SUMMARY

- Sunny.
- Max temps: 85-90° lower slopes and drainages, 78-83° mid-slope.
- Min RH: 25% in exposed areas and 35-40% under the canopy.
- Winds-slope/valley: East-northeast 8-10 in the morning, becoming westerly at 8-10 mph after 1100. Otherwise, terrain driven downslope / downvalley in the morning and upslope / up-valley.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Fire behavior. Conditions will not support spread until fuels have a chance to dry out. Stay tuned.

Fuels: Live fuel moistures, 1000 hr. and other dead fuels were at or near critical levels before the rain. Currently those indices are well below average, but will recover. Fuels include timber with litter and understory, brush, and some areas of standing snags and blow down.

Topography: The fire is burning in steep, rugged terrain. The fire is burning at elevations between 1600-5500' and slopes between 40-over 100%. All aspects represented in the fire area.

SPECIFIC FIRE BEHAVIOR:

As drying continues you may start to see more smoke from the snags, stump holes, and heavy fuels that will continue to hold heat. Surface fuels will not support spread yet, but will continue to dry out in the coming days. We will continue to monitor conditions and utilize modeling to determine the rate of recovery. Any field observations of changing conditions are appreciated.

DIV A/E/Y: Control lines are secure. No spread or significant activity is expected.

DIV L: The areas of concern here in the coming days are the slop over and the green island near the line. Fuel conditions, and the fact that they are accessible mitigate this concern but it is something to keep in mind.

DIV R: The inaccessible area in Granite Creek will need close monitoring as the fuels continue to dry. However, it is located in a wet drainage with oodles of green riparian vegetation that will take longer to dry out. Sheltering from general winds and decent RH recovery are on our side so these concerns are not immediate.

DIV T&U: The unburned area northeast of 10N23 has some heat signatures showing from NIROPS flights that may become a concern, but the fuels in this pocket will not support spread until indices recover. Roll out of heavy fuels will remain a concern but is not expected to cause any significant spread at this time.

AIR OPERATIONS

No limitations are anticipated.

SAFETY

The fire continues to sleep, and will likely not awaken for a while, but the potential remains. Remain focused on the task at hand to keep the upper hand while it is down. In the long run that will keep everyone safer.


