GENERAL INFORMATION:

Name of the incident: Angora Incident

What agency is managing the incident? U. S. Forest Service, the City of South Lake Tahoe and the Lake Valley Fire Protection District

Name of the Incident Commander: Kent Swartzlander, NorCal IMT 1

Size of the incident at this point in time: 2500 Acres (6/25/2007 @ 1000

Description of where the perimeter is: The fire extends North to the area of Gardner Mountain, West to Angora Ridge Road, South to North Upper Truckee Road and East to Lake Tahoe Blvd.

Weather prognosis: Lighter winds from the Northeast shifting to Northwest in the afternoon along warmer temperatures with slightly higher relative humidity for 6/25 & 26. Increasing winds and lower humidity expected by mid-week

Fuels in front of the fire (potential fire behavior): Timber. Fire will be carried by the large amount of down and dead fuels

Potential lines of defense: Incident objectives are to keep the fire West of Lake Tahoe Blvd. South of Hwy 89, East of Fallen leaf Road and Wilderness and North of Echo Peak and Hwy 50

Probability of control Very Good

TRIGGER MECHANISM (what event, or events, will initiate an evacuation?)

Strong South winds with a developed smoke column that bends over the Gardner Mt. area

WHO INITIATES THE EVACUATION (who actually pushes the "do it" button, IC, Sheriff, or who?)

The Team IC or Operations will initiate the evacuation by contacting the El Dorado EOC at the South Lake Tahoe airport. El Dorado County Sheriff's Department will implement.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Management Team: Provide for Firefighter and Public Safety, Protect Structures and develop overall strategy and tactics.

Local law enforcement (normally responsible for residential evacuation): Initiate evacuations, maintain security of evacuated areas

CONTACTS: (phone numbers - office and home)

Sheriff (or Chief of Police): SO, City Police, CHP and County Joint EOC located at South Lake Tahoe Airport. 530 542-6507 or 530 542-6506 are both landlines that ring into the EOC

Management Team: Angora Communications on Command Frequency via Fire Radio

Highway Patrol: Through County EOC

WHAT WILL BE THE METHOD OF NOTIFYING THE RESIDENTS TO EVACUATE?

Phone, local radio stations, personnel contact, or what? Angora IC/Operations will contact the County EOC to initiate any additional evacuations. County EOC will contact their Deputies and Search & Rescue members.
