**SLOPE/VALLEY -** Southwest 6 to 12 mph and gusty Klamath Canyon and favorable southwest to northeast oriented drainages this evening...otherwise winds upvalley 2 to 6 mph becoming downslope/downvalley 0-4 mph after 9 pm.

HAINES INDEX: 4

**STABILITY/INVERSION:** Inversion forming after 10 pm and deepening to 3500 feet overnight.

<u>OUTLOOK FOR NEXT SHIFT:</u> Considerable high cloudiness. Highs in the upper 70s to lower 80s. South to southwest ridge winds surfacing in the Klamath Canyon afternoon hours. Winds gusty afternoon hours unsheltered areas.

**EXTENDED FORECAST:** Morning clouds then mostly sunny Saturday with highs in the mid to upper 80s. Partly cloudy Sunday with highs in the mid 80s to near 90. Warmer and drier Monday through Wednesday with highs in the 90s.

**WEATHER SUMMARY:** Smoke settling in with an inversion, temps in the 50s, RHs in the upper 60 to 90% range, and winds downslope. See attached fire weather forecast issued 7/19/07 at 1100 hours.

#### FIRE BEHAVIOR GENERAL:

Expect minimal fire activity tonight. Spread will be dictated by topography. Humidity will be high, favorable for holding and mop-up. Remain alert for rolling material and fire weakened snags and trees. The topography is very complex, steep, and rugged. Fuels are primarily brush and timber, with some rocky areas supporting sparse vegetation.

**Local Thresholds:** These factors in combination with a high ERC may greatly increase fire behavior: 20' wind speed over 7 mph; RH less than 25%; temperature over 81°; ERC over 46. Average BI for mid-July: 62. None of these thresholds should be a factor this evening.

### **SPECIFIC:**

<u>All Branches:</u> Most fire activity will be limited to the 1000-hour fuels, especially from roll out into fuel jackpots. Large fuels continue to burn out. Patrol and preparation operations should have good success, where the terrain is workable. Fine fuels will not sustain combustion well. Active spotting should not be a factor.

**AVIATION OPERATIONS**: Air operations should be available until night cutoff.

**SAFETY:** Hazard trees – know your enemy! **Review Page 80 of the Incident Response Pocket Guide** (**IRPG**). Night operations, many days of burning snags, steep slopes contribute to the hazard. Identify and avoid your high risk areas.

# "Maintain Situational Awareness!"

Incident: Elk Complex Date: 07/19/2007 Night Shift

Major Hazards and Risks:

**NIGHT OPERATIONS**: Maintain situational awareness

**DRIVING**: Adjust speed to conditions **HYDRATION**: Push water consumption

FATIGUE: Pace yourself, and get quality day rest.

**NIGHT OPERATIONS:** Sometimes we tend to let our guard down working on the night shift. The same hazards exist at night and may be harder to see. Example: terrain, snags and traffic. Check your communications before starting your work assignment. Situational awareness must be maintained throughout the night to work safely.

**DRIVING**: Driving, especially at night, continues to be one of the greatest hazards on this fire. Keep your speeds down and drive defensively. Road hazards of rolling material are common on roads in the fire area. Watch out for crews working on or near the roads. Park your vehicle wisely keeping roads clear and escape routes open.

**HYDRATION**: We may tend to drink less at night. Stay well hydrated and check the welfare of your assigned people.

**FATIGUE:** Pace yourself. Think about what you are going to do before you do it. Ensure that **ALL** your assigned personnel have quality day sleeping arrangements. Check the health and welfare of your people often. Make sure they get plenty of rest, and ensure their aches and pains are taken care of. Preventative maintenance does prevent injuries.
