

SAFETY MESSAGE

LESS FIRE TO FIGHT MEANS: MORE TIME TO FOCUS ON SAFETY!!!

- · There's no glory in getting hurt during mop up, keep your safety and the safety of your crews as a top priority.
- · Be careful around the incident base! Drive SLOW! Drive with CARE!
- Beware of stump-holes, steep slopes, trip hazards, and loose footing.
- Watch out for power lines, burned electrical poles & snags.
- · Ensure radios are properly programmed and that crews are trained in communications procedures for the incident.
- Remain mindful of what is going on around you! LCES!
- · Even though the incident is now small keep safety a BIG priority all the time.
- · Exercise caution while driving on the incident. Observe the speed limit and stay on the roads!!! Drive with headlights on.
- · CAUTION: Areas of potential illegal activity may exist on the incident. Be aware of your surroundings. Make notification of suspicious items or activities through your supervisor.

IF THERE'S TIME TO THINK, THERE'S TIME TO DRINK!!!!

- Brief your crews on all components of the IAP.
- Continually monitor your crews for sign & symptoms of heat illness.
- Insure your crews are well hydrated and are provide rest breaks.
- · Personal Monitoring:
 - o Keep track of your urine output.
 - o Monitor your core temperature and pulse rate.
 - o Drink 8 ounces of water every 15 minutes.
