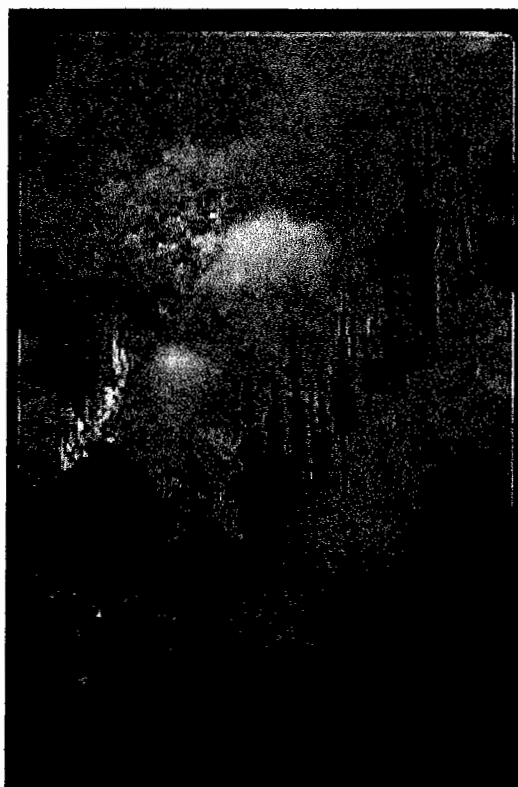



WEATHER DISCUSSION: High pressure will begin building over the area today bringing the start of a significant warming trend. After a rather cool and moist start to the day, afternoon conditions will be warmer and drier than yesterday. Winds along the coast will continue to be out of the northwest while the interior branches will see more of a southwest wind. The morning fog layer over the coastal areas should pull back earlier than yesterday with clear skies expected by late morning. Overnight humidity recoveries tonight will be good, however they will be getting progressively worse the next few nights as the hotter and drier airmass moves in. Hot and dry conditions will affect the complex area for most of next week.

OUTLOOK FOR SUNDAY: Sunny and warmer. Morning fog near the coast. Ridgetop winds West 5-8 mph with gusts to 16 mph. Slope/Valley winds: West 3-6 mph with gusts to 12 mph. Maximum temperatures 82-87 and 94-99 inland. Minimum humidity 30-35% and 16-21% inland and on coastal ridges.

EXTENDED OUTLOOK for Monday through Wednesday: Hot and dry, poor overnight RH recovery. Max temps 87-92 and 99-104 inland. Min humidity 22-27% and 10-15% inland. Light and slope-dominated winds.

FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

Saturday starts the gradual steady trend over the next 3 to 4 days of hotter and drier conditions and overall fire activity will increase each day during the week as a result. The air mass in general will be stable, and the fire will remain fuels/topography driven on Saturday.

Coastal areas on Saturday will have fog until 10 am, and minimum RH's in canyon bottoms will range 35-45%. RH's on ridge tops will be in the 30% range. Temperatures will range from 75 on the coast to 80 at Booneville. Winds will be 6-9 MPH gusts to 18 MPH out of the NW on the coast and W on ridges near Low Gap. Expect dry air aloft to drop down to 2000 feet early Sunday morning.

The temperatures east of Highway 101 will range from 88 to 92, and RH's will range from 25 to 30%. Winds (6-9 MPH, gusts to 18) will be NW in the Red Mtn. area and SW in Branch I. RH recovery at night will be good in the valley bottoms and poor on ridges throughout the complex.

Interior islands of unburnt fuel will start to burn more freely as the 1 HR & 10 HR fuels continue to dry out over the next couple days. Fires will remain active on ridges during the night due to poor RH recovery. Probability of ignition in the coastal areas will be 60% and east of HWY 101 will be 75%. These estimates indicate spotting will be a significant concern throughout the complex. Spotting distance of 0.2 miles is possible, especially when trees are torching. Uphill runs will increase in probability as fuels dry out in wind-exposed areas, but should transition to a slow backing fire after cresting the ridge top. Max. Rates of Spread (10 MPH eye level wind): timber 0.1 MPH; brush 3.0 MPH; oak/brush 1.0 MPH. Flame Lengths (10 MPH eye level wind): timber 5' (with some torching); brush 30'; oak-brush 10'. Rolling burning material on steep slopes continues to be a problem.

SPECIFIC:

Coastal Fires West of HWY 101: Fire activity will increase in unburnt islands of fuel, and fires will remain active at night on ridges. Potential fire movement will trend in the direction of wind/canyon alignment due to spotting. Short uphill runs will be more likely during the afternoon as fuels dry out in wind exposed areas. Watch for spots anytime trees are torching. The fog will return to the coastal drainages after sun down.

Fires East of HWY 101: Expect a steady incremental increase in fire activity in the afternoon as fuels dry out. Unburnt islands of fuel will be the greatest challenge where they are in close proximity to control lines, especially where there is topographic alignment with slope and general winds. The winds will be strongest in the areas of canyon alignment with the Eel River drainage. Fuels will be drying out starting mid morning, and most active fire during the day will be on SW aspects during the afternoon. Fire activity will remain active on ridge tops during the night.

AIR OPERATIONS: The fog will cover the coastal drainages until 10 am. Residual smoke will hang in valleys and canyon bottoms near areas with burn out operations which were conducted on Friday. Remaining areas should have clear skies. Fog will start pushing inland after sun down in the coastal drainages.

SAFETY

The trend is hotter and drier weather. Fires that seemed dead only a few days ago have the potential to show activity again. Reassess the reburn potential of any fuels within the burn you are working, as well as take the time to locate unburned pockets of fuel where they are in close proximity to control lines. The buildup of fire activity is expected to gradually increase during the day. Don't get so focused on extinguishing one portion of the fire, and fail to notice what is happening around you on a larger scale. All of the fires in this complex are going to be tested over the next of days as humidity's eventually drop into the single digits in some areas of Mendocino County. Maintaining situational awareness is the responsibility of everyone. LCES. Have a safe day.

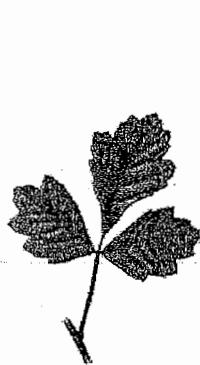

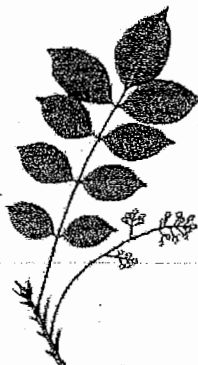

- Of these three, Poison Oak is the one most commonly found in California.
- The oil found in the stem and leaves of these plants is known as urushiol (you-roo-shee-ol).
- It triggers an allergic reaction within five minutes to two hours after exposure.
- During this reaction, the body's immune system attacks the skin containing the urushiol, resulting in like rashes, blisters, itching and swelling. These symptoms are the body's way of telling you that you are having an allergic reaction.

What do do if you have been exposed:

- Cleanse the area with soap and water if possible.
- Apply a topical treatment like Tecnu or Zanfeld.
- Don't scratch! Scratching may cause infection by allowing bacteria to enter the skin.
- If symptoms are severe, Prednisone treatment is available from the Disaster Medical Assistance Team (DMAT), located at Boonville Camp.

Archaeological and Historical Sites:

Fireline Guidance for the MEU LIGHTNING COMPLEX

Do not compromise safety for the protection and preservation of archaeological and historical sites. When possible and prudent:

1. Be on the lookout for prehistoric and historic sites. Prehistoric archaeological sites include temporary camps containing scatters of obsidian and/or other projectile points/arrowheads as well as flakes [scatters of obsidian flakes often look like broken glass] and village sites containing dark brown-black soils (midden), artifact scatters and/or scatters of brown ceramic fragments and flat rock outcrops with polished milling surfaces, mortars and/or ovals. These typically occur on flats near sources of water, along ridgetops and saddles, and other such places suitable for camping. Historic sites in much of the complex include rock walls, mining remains (e.g., shafts, adits and tailings piles), old wooden buildings, structures, old logging equipment, trash dumps with old cans and bottles as well as scatters of old cans, bottles and other refuse.
2. Some of the known sites are marked with red flagging. Many other sites have not yet been flagged. If you observe artifacts, features, or sites, avoid dozing or driving through and/or parking on these sites, when possible, especially with heavy equipment.
3. If you can't avoid them, attempt to minimize disturbance as much as possible, only clearing the surface to as minimal a depth and width as necessary.
4. Leave all artifacts in place. Some artifacts may have been intentionally placed by Native Americans in the distant and/or recent past for religious or ceremonial reasons.
5. If new sites are discovered, flag them for visibility and report the location to the Division Supervisor. If possible, note locations of discovered resources on a map. Better yet, take a GPS reading. Leave information with the Plans Unit so that the sites can be relocated and protected during both the suppression and fire suppression repair phases of the Incident.
6. If you encounter a burial or other human remains, cease work in that area immediately and contact CAL FIRE Archaeologist Chuck Whatford at (707) 529-2989 (cell phone). State law requires that CAL FIRE then contact the County Coroner, who will then determine if the remains are part of a crime scene. If the Coroner determines that the remains are Native American, State law requires the Coroner to contact the Native American Heritage Commission in Sacramento.

EMERGENCY WATERSHED PROTECTION GUIDELINES FOR GENERAL FIRELINE SUPPRESSION REPAIR

Dozer Lines

1. Install waterbars; spacing not to exceed 100 feet on any dozer line. All areas should be considered to have high erosion potential.

Guideline for spacing of waterbars and rolling dips:

Road or Fire Line Gradient	Spacing
30% or Less	100 feet
30% to 50%	75 feet
50% or Greater	50 feet

2. Waterbars should be deep enough to significantly reduce the chance of being damaged and should be constructed at an angle of approximately 45 degrees to the fire line.
3. Where dozer lines cannot be drained by installation of waterbars (due to steepness or dozer lines within swales), the equipment operator will tractor pack a sufficient amount of woody vegetation into the surface to prevent erosion.
4. For dozer lines located along long ridgelines, alternate the direction of the waterbars (in a herring bone configuration), if the situation dictates.
5. Waterbars should be located to discharge into natural vegetation where possible; where waterbars are within 75 feet of a watercourse, install sufficient size rocks, other durable organic material and/or pack outlets with slash.
6. Remove berms created during dozer line construction.
7. Scatter organic debris over dozer line surface near areas where dozer lines intersect roads.
8. Reshape cross-slope control lines to as natural a contour as possible and remove lower berm.
9. Break apart dozer piles and spread out along dozer line.

Handlines

1. Install waterbars at the following spacing:

Fire Line Gradient	Spacing
30% or Less	100 feet
30% to 50%	75 feet
50% or Greater	50 feet

2. Fill in all under-slung trenches along cross slopes using material from the lower berm. Remove berms to allow flow of water across outsloped fireline.
3. Lop and scatter slash along the fire line near road intersections and within 75 feet from a watercourse.
4. Where handlines cannot be drained by installation of waterbars (due to steepness or handlines within swales), scatter slash along that portion of the handline to prevent erosion.

Watercourse Crossings

1. Remove all displaced soil and debris from the stream channel.
2. The excavated channel should be wider than the natural channel.
3. Slope back the approaches to prevent future stream bank failure.
4. As needed, scatter sufficient quantities of slash to stabilize exposed soil down to the edge of the active channel.
5. Clean out culvert inlets and outlets as needed.

General Cleanup

1. Collect all fire suppression-generated trash such as plastic water bottles, cardboard, plastic flagging, foodstuffs, wrappers, blown hose and plastic bags and pack it out.

If an entry of "Poor" or "No Reuse" is recommended, the signature of the Logistics Section Chief MUST be included along with his or her comment in this block, also.
17. Enter contractor/vendor representative name and title.
18. Enter government representative name and position.
19. Signature block for contractor/vendor representative.
20. Enter date contractor/vendor representative signed the evaluation.
21. Signature block for government representative.
22. Enter date government representative signed the evaluation.
