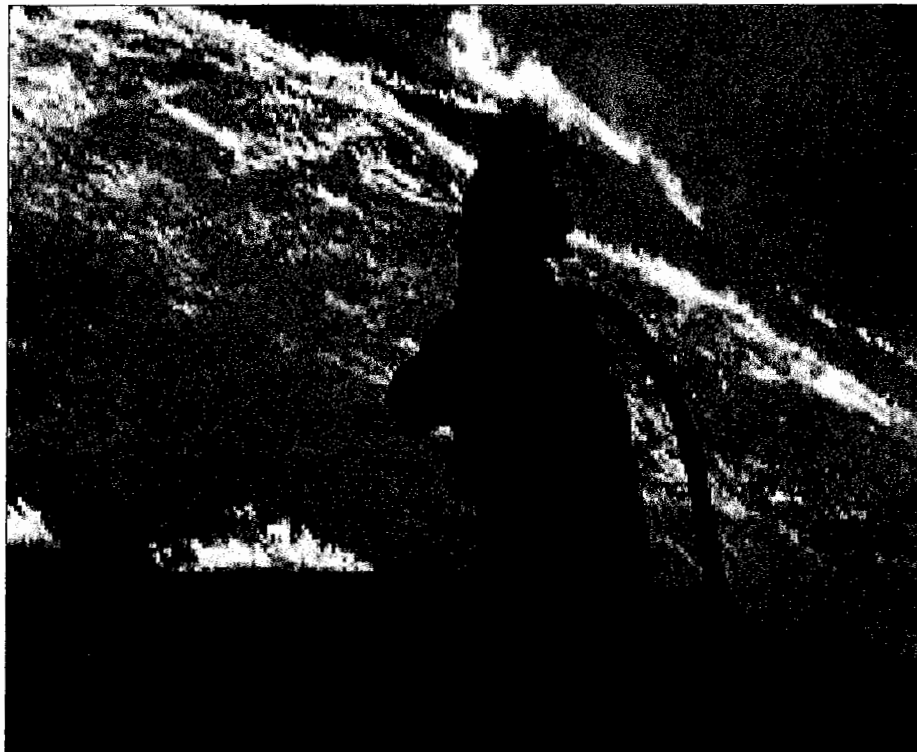





\*\*\*RED FLAG WARNING FOR MEU COMPLEX EXTENDED THROUGH 2200 FRIDAY\*\*\*

**WEATHER DISCUSSION:** Today will likely be the final day of soaring high temperatures. Although only subtle cooling is expected on Friday it will mark the beginning of a cooling trend. RH levels will remain critically low today and Friday thus another extension to the current Red Flag Warning may be warranted. A return of offshore flow is anticipated tonight and early Friday limiting rh recovery again. Winds will continue to be mainly light and slope-dominated with less afternoon west and northwest winds expected through the valleys. A more significant cooling trend is still on tap for Sunday and Monday.

**INVERSION:** Moderate-heavy smoke will settle into valleys and lower drainages between 2100-1100.

**OUTLOOK FOR FRIDAY:** Hazy but slightly cooler. Poor morning RH recovery. Ridgetop winds East 4-8 mph with gusts to 14 mph in the morning. Slope/Valley winds: West or Upslope 3-5 mph with gusts to 10 mph. Maximum temperatures 71-76 near coast and 97-106 inland. Minimum humidity 22-27% near coast and 9-14% inland.

**EXTENDED OUTLOOK** for Saturday and Sunday: Sunny...continued dry but cooler.. Max temps 68-74 near coast...93-99 inland. Min humidity 27-33% near coast and 11-19% inland. Light and slope-dominated winds.

**WEATHER SUMMARY: RED FLAG WARNING for low relative humidity.** Sunny and smoky,  
Coast: Day - 102°F, 13% RH, Ridge winds NW 5-8 Gusts 12, Slopes – upslope 2-5 mph;  
Night – 54-65°F, 25% RH, Ridge Winds NE 3-6, down slope 3-6 MPH.  
Interior: Day - 111°F, 7% RH, Ridge winds NE, becoming NW 3-6 Gusts 12; Upslope/canyon 4-8 MPH.  
Night – 59-70°F, 30% RH, Winds: Ridges NE 2-4, Valleys down slope 1-3 MPH.  
See detailed weather forecast issued 7/09/08 at 1900 hours.

### FIRE BEHAVIOR GENERAL:

Fuels driven fire behavior with hot temperatures, low RHs, and poor evening humidity recovery. Spread is by active ground fire, rolling material, uphill runs, torching, and spotting. The greatest control problems are where topography is very steep with poor access. Fuels are primarily timber and brush, both fuel types with a high resistance to control. Dead fuel moistures are lower than average for this time of year in the 100-hr and 1000-hr classes. Expect active fire behavior when RH < 30% or eye-level winds > 7 mph. Expect the active burning period from 1400 – 1900, and may extend into the late evening in the thermal belt.

### SPECIFIC:

West of US 101 – Interior islands will burn aggressively as fuels continue to dry. Many areas burned incompletely and can produce short runs with torching. Spotting potential remains high. The upper third of the slopes will actively burn well into early morning with poor RH recovery. Firing operations can begin late as humidity improves and go through 0400 hours before the burn window begins to close. Conditions for operations on ridgelines will be adverse, favorable along wide canyon bottoms during peak burning.

East of US 101 – Fine fuel moisture will be down to 2%. There is high potential for short and medium range spotting in the afternoon. Large fuels continue to burn out. Interior islands will burn aggressively, producing strong runs where winds and slope align. Conditions will be neutral to adverse for operations on ridges during the peak burning period. The burn window for firing will not close, except in the lowest valleys.

**AVIATION OPERATIONS:** Aircraft support will be limited until the smoke starts to clear. By 1400 – 1500 hours, aircraft may be available to some areas of the complex.

**SAFETY:** Persistent Red Flag weather conditions are increasing the drying of both live and large dead fuels. Material that would not carry fire three days ago may now be available for burning. Where the burn was incomplete and mop up remains to be done, expect some active fire behavior. Red Flag Warning conditions often produce extreme fire behavior.

**The Human Factor**

There are two key decision making errors that lead to Tragedies

1. Under estimating the hazards, using inadequate safety measures
2. Failing to notice changing conditions and adjusting tactics accordingly

*Don't neglect your feet!  
Keep them dry.  
Make 'em last!*

Why do these errors continue to occur? What Human factors are in play causing us not to recognize them, especially when the warnings seem so loud they should have been seen by any thinking person?

The Answer "BARRIERS"

**The Seven Barriers**

1. Inexperience: You don't have a lot of mental slides of the situation or maybe don't know what to focus your attention on and what to filter out. Not having the experience to recognize the severity of the warning signs.
2. Getting too comfortable: Complacency, False Sense of Security or Autopilot
3. Distraction for Primary Duties: You can only focus on one thing and juggle about five.
4. Priorities out of Order: **Safety of your personnel is Number 1 Priority!**
5. Social Influences:  
"Group think" in this situation the group mind locks onto a slide, and the group members stop Thinking for themselves. Peer Pressure and Political Pressure are examples of this.
6. Stress Reactions: When you "lock up, you block out" or your lock into trained behaviors.
7. Physical Impairments – Interfere with your ability to perceive, think and respond  
Examples: Fatigue, CO poisoning, heat stress and dehydration
