WEATHER DISCUSSION: The upper low off the coast will finally pull off to the northeast today with fewer clouds. This will bring a return to the normal daytime winds for the area, which will be a little stronger than yesterday. Winds will be strongest in the Dixie Valley and slopes adjacent to it which will be aligned with the general wind. Temperatures will be slightly cooler, but humidity will drop with it. 




