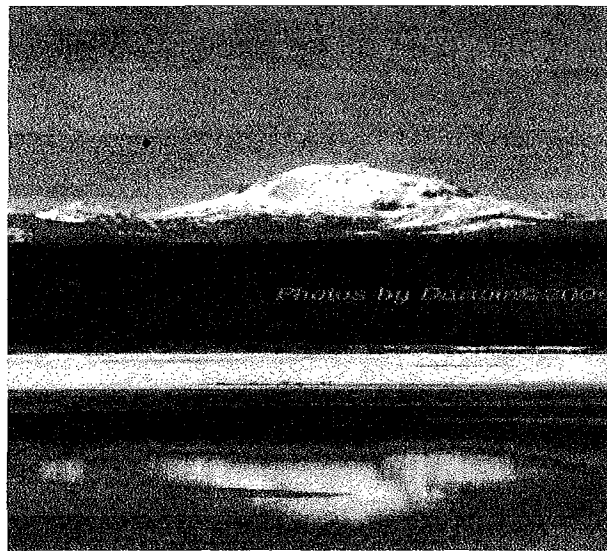





Communications: Be sure that you have communications with your Supervisor.

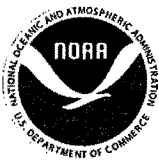

FORECAST ISSUED: July 27, 2010 2000 hrs

WEATHER DISCUSSION: The upper low off the coast will finally pull off to the northeast today with fewer clouds. This will bring a return to the normal daytime winds for the area, which will be a little stronger than yesterday. Winds will be strongest in the Dixie Valley and slopes adjacent to it which will be aligned with the general wind. Temperatures will be slightly cooler, but humidity will drop with it. Temperatures will cool tonight with a stronger thermal belt condition tonight than we have seen the previous 2-3 nights. This pattern will continue into Thursday.

WEATHER FORECAST:

WEATHER: Partly cloudy through 1100 then mostly sunny.

TEMPERATURES: MAX 82-88.

HUMIDITY: MIN 11-16%

Partly Cloudy with inversion lifting by noon, then mostly sunny

Temp: Max 82-88 R.H. 11-16%

GENERAL:

Forecast represents fire potential for initial attack. Fuels are primarily Ponderosa pine, manzanita, juniper, sage and light grass. Topography is mid-slope, mild to 40% slope. Ground coverage has a major component of small rock. Seasonal rainfall for this area is below normal, but spring rains are keeping live fuel moistures up.

There is still the potential for lightning holdovers, be aggressive with IA.

Head Fire (optimal alignment) Wind and Slope

Grass (FM2) (ROS) 31 ch/h (FL) 3 - 5 -- Brush (FM6) (ROS) 31 ch/h (FL) 5-7 – Timber (FM10) (ROS) 5 ch/h (FL)2-4
Prob. Of Ignition 65% Spotting .6 mile (maximum spotting distance)

SPECIFIC:

Russell: Down fuels continue to smolder, if unburned fuel near control lines becomes active direct attack may require engine support. Large amounts of down heavy fuels continue to hold heat.

AIR OPERATIONS:

No limitation on air operations expected.

SAFETY

This area has significant fire history, be aware of your surroundings. Most of the fuels remain unburned in the black, choose escape routes and safety zones appropriately.

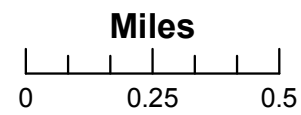

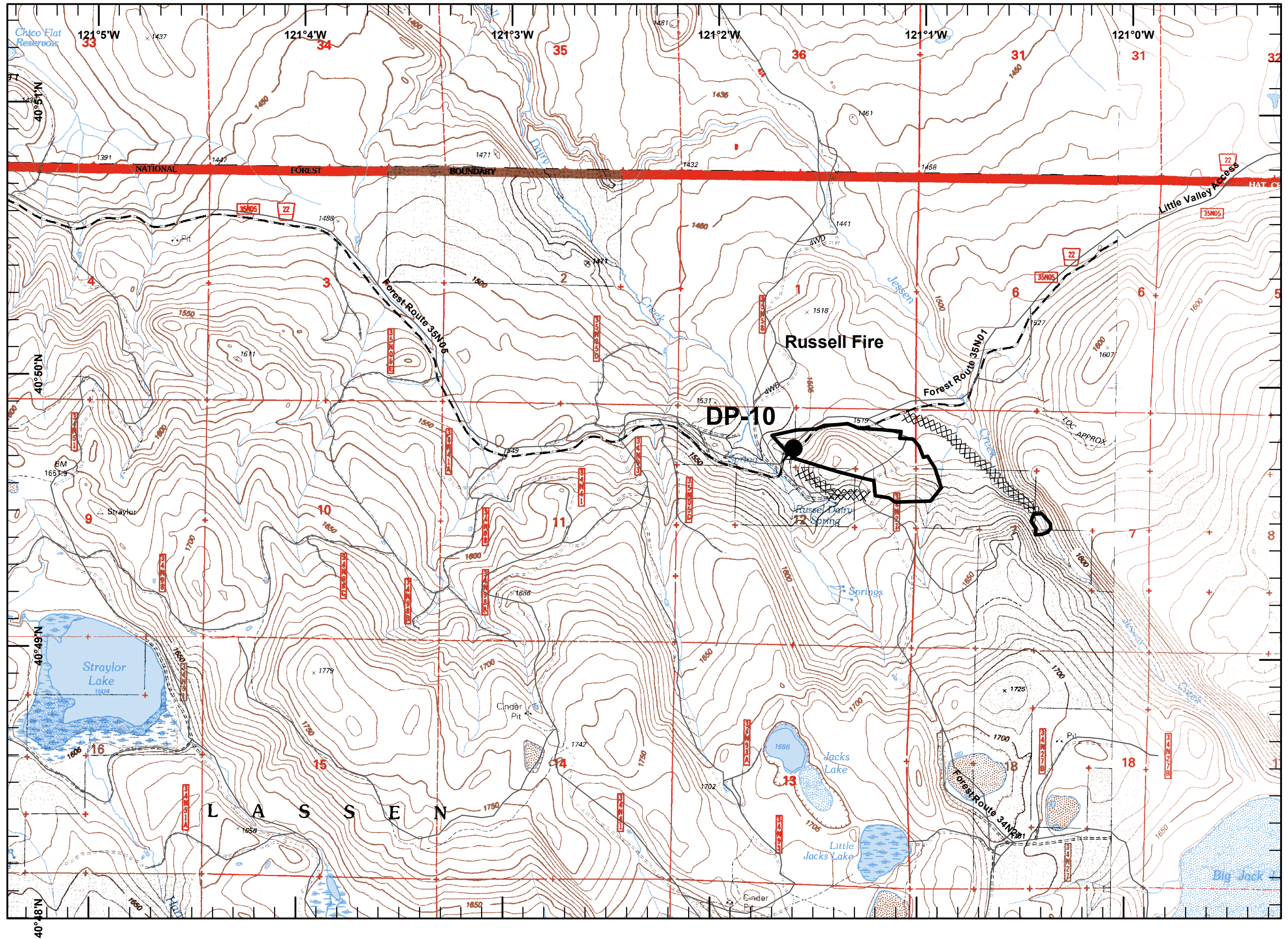
