FIRE BEHAVIOR

GENERAL:

The overall fire behavior has lessened as mop-up operations continue. Containment objectives are being hampered due to dirty burns and inability to access hot spots near control lines. Within these areas there is still potential for flare ups, tree torching and spotting. While the fire behavior is expecting to be lower, any fire activity in drainages, previously burned area or in optimal alignment with wind and slope should be treated as a high probability for extreme fire behavior.

SPECIFIC:

All Areas

Steep terrain and heavy unburned fuel loads in all areas is limiting access for crews and making direct attack labor intensive. Simply finding the smokes will be half the battle. As temperatures begin to rise, not only will the opportunity for fires increase so will the opportunity for heat related injuries. Snags, rolling material and burnt out root cavities will continue to surface

Branch III:

This area continues to respond well to building weather pattern. There is still concern due to unburned fuels directly inline with the SSW wind pattern. The predicted wind and slope alignment will want to push an active fire upslope towards control lines. If the fire crosses control lines, the Fire Behavior for Wind Alignment, (brush fwd ROS 18-35 ft/min, FL 9-12 ft)(timber fwd ROS 4-9 ft/min, FL 5-8 ft).

AIR OPERATIONS:

After the morning inversion lifts there are no expected weather limitations.

SAFETY

Extremely steep terrain, watch for roll out. Snags and root cavity burn out will be surfacing, Look Up Down and Around. Terrain and fuels make escape to safety zones difficult.




