WEATHER DISCUSSION:

High impact - long duration heat wave continues thru at least the middle of next-week. Little change in min/max temperatures today from yesterday with continued drying and lowering RH. Some gradual cooling is expected starting on Monday as high pressure moves slightly east. Winds remain generally light southwesterly in the afternoons with gusty diurnal overnight slope winds out of the northeast. Cumulative heat stress and elevated fire weather are the ongoing forecast concerns.

GENERAL

A Fuels and Fire Behavior Advisory has been issued for California grass and herbaceous-dominated ecosystems due to above-average fuel loading.

The fire area contains grass, mixed oak, and brush, with grass being the main contributor to the fire spread. The grass is especially dense due to two good winters, making it hard to control as retardant and water cannot penetrate to the ground. It's important to note that the fire may still spread through the dense grass even if it appears controlled. If the fire spots across Dinkey Creek and onto the west aspect within the grass component, it could rapidly spread and transition into areas with a large amount of heavy fuels.

Specific areas of concern:

Division A - The fire's spread has been successfully contained within established lines. However, we must be mindful of unburned fuel patches within the containment lines. As surface and live fuels become more susceptible to ignition, there's always a potential threat of spotting that could impact the containment lines.

Division D – The containment line in this area is effectively holding due to the application of retardant, aerial resources and boots on the ground. It is important to note that the swirling winds around the bend of the creek may potentially transport smoke and embers to the east side, where there is a high fire risk due to the continuous grass fuel load.

Division M - This division is in good shape, however there are areas of unburnt fuel within the perimeter that could produce enough ember cast causing spotting concerns if enough wind impacts these areas.

Division U&Z- This division is looking very well. Roll-out could still cause some issues on the east end but that threat is diminishing as the heavier fuels consume.

Night - Downhill or down-canyon wind is expected during the night. The most significant impact from winds is expected in Divisions A and D, however, no significant spread is expected.

Air Operations: No anticipated limitations.





In person check-out is being utilized on this incident. Monitor the IAP for the tentative DEMOB list. If there is an error on the dates, please communicate through your division or section to the check-in desk. They can then get the information verified and if needed, corrected.

Check out sheets will be available late afternoon on your last work day. Stop in at the DEMOB trailer to pick up your copy. Only get signatures from those sections that are highlighted.

- 1. All non-local resources will have at least 8 hours of rest prior to being released from the incident.
- 2. All resources will meet any agency-specific requirements on hours of travel per day or other travel restrictions.
- 3. Any heavy equipment operators or owners must have appropriate permits and follow any limitation on the movement of their equipment on public highways.
