3. Objective(s):

Strategic Direction:

- The Garnet Fire is being managed with a full suppression strategy. Personnel on the incident will implement risk-based decision-making in all situations. Firefighting operations will utilize tactics that achieve objectives while protecting values at risk and preventing unnecessary suppression related damage.

Leader's Intent

- All resources assigned to the incident will work together to provide a high level of service, safety, and protection. All resources will ensure transparent, timely and accurate communication at all levels while strengthening relationships with each other and with cooperators. All incident personnel shall take appropriate actions regarding safety, including the identification and mitigation of hazards through thoughtful risk-based decision making. Personnel shall manage fatigue by maintaining work/rest cycles. TCIMT expects professional behavior, conduct, and effective communications from all assigned personnel.

Management Objectives

- Prior to engagement, stop and discuss strategies and tactics to ensure sound risk management principles are in place to provide for firefighter and public safety.
- Minimize impacts on communities, critical energy and communications infrastructure, and cultural, natural, and recreational values.
- Continue to maintain and develop relationships and partnerships with stakeholders, cooperators, community leaders/members, and local agencies by coordinating incident management efforts through timely and accurate information sharing.
- Effectively manage costs by selecting and implementing strategies and tactics that have a high probability of success in meeting incident objectives.
- Implement fire suppression repair activities in accordance with the Incident Fire Suppression Damage Repair Plan, with guidance for Incident Resource and Cultural Advisors.

Control Objectives

- Protect private structures and values at risk with the forest closure.
- Maintain fire within current fire perimeter.

General Situational Awareness

- Steep and rugged terrain, critically dry and receptive fuel beds, active area for fire history and drought stressed trees.
- Enhanced hygiene (especially handwashing), PPE & monitoring practices help limit the infection rate of first responders.

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

WEATHER DISCUSSION

Day over day changes remain subtle as high pressure will weaken with a slight cooling trend and uptick in humidity compared to the last few days. Thermal belts will still be present this morning with dry air between 3500-5000 feet. Afternoon humidity will lower to 25-35% with highs mainly in the 70s except some lower 80s lowest portions of the fire. General winds remain light from the southwest with afternoon ridgetop gusts 15 mph. Fine fuels have dried over the last three days of dry weather so continue to use caution with ignition sources. Clear and mild tonight with better humidity recovery. A more noted cooling trend starts Friday and lasts through the weekend with cooler daytime highs and higher humidity, especially at night. An early season storm may bring rain and mountain snow by Monday night and Tuesday.





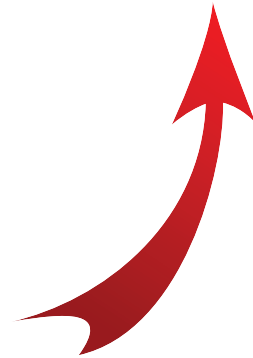

Suppression Repair

Below is a summary of the key points in the suppression repair plan (SRP). See the full SRP for more detail.

Goal and Scope of Repair: To minimize the landscape impacts of suppression activities. Repair or restore, to the extent possible, areas of wildfire suppression damage (natural and cultural) to a state similar to their pre-suppression condition.

Goals:

Protect areas from further damage; prevent the spread of weeds; prevent unauthorized OHV and Camping.

Stabilize dozer lines, hand lines, safety zones, parking areas, and other suppression-related disturbances.

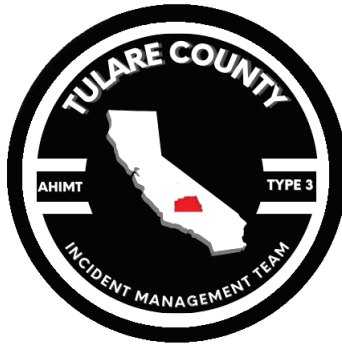
Repair roads, trails, and other infrastructure damaged by fire suppression to pre-existing conditions.

Repair Guidelines:

- **Fireline:**
 - Pull back soil berms, spread soil back, roughen the surface, restore ground cover.
 - Block Access.
 - Chip, pile, strip mulch, or haul vegetation from suppression activities.
- **Shaded Fuel Breaks:**
 - Water bar where necessary,
 - pull back soil berms,
 - chip or slash, block access
- **Trails:**
 - Return to pre-suppression width, slope, and condition as much as possible.
 - Low stump within 25 ft. of trail.
- **Roads:**
 - Clear debris from road ditches and culverts,
 - Report road prism damage to the READs. They will be assessed by a roads expert for site specific repairs.
- **Cultural Sites:** Work with the ARCHs on site-specific prescriptions. Avoid further damage.

A Note on Water Bars:

Repair specialists are moving away from using water bars. With a few exceptions, on this fire, water bars are not our primary treatment for fire lines. This may be a change for many of you. In this area, it is often a more effective repair approach to knock down the soil berms, roughen the surface (where appropriate), and restore ground cover. Talk to your READs about your questions, that's what we're here for.



Human Resource Message

Staying Connected While on Assignment

Being away from home for long periods takes its toll, no matter your experience level. Whether this is your first assignment or have been doing fire for many years, the separation from your normal routine, family, and support systems can add to the pressures of the job. It's important to understand its effects and find healthy ways to navigate them while staying focused on the work at hand.

For some, being freshly out of high school brings the challenge of reassuring loved ones who worry about your safety. For others, it may be the weight of simply missing your family, or missing significant events like birthdays, anniversaries, etc. These personal concerns are real and can add layers of stress on top of your daily fireline duties. Recognizing this is the first step in managing it.

Make it a priority to check in with those back home whenever you can. A simple text message, a post card we will provide, or a call can mean a lot, both for them and for you. Take a moment to acknowledge their efforts and the stress that is created to keep things running at home, just as they recognize the challenging work you contribute to the fire-effort.

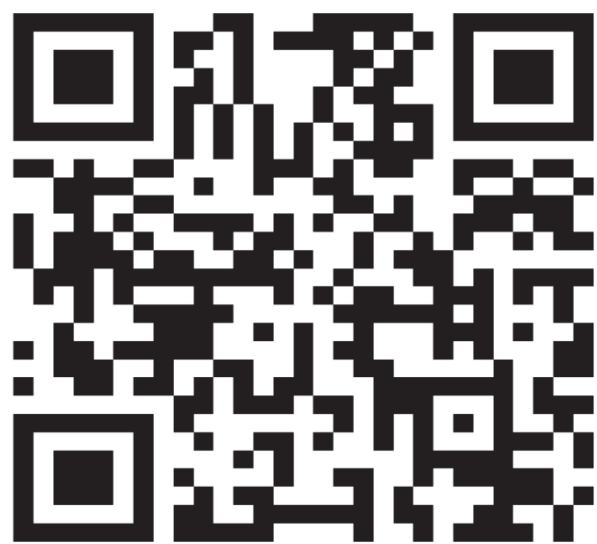

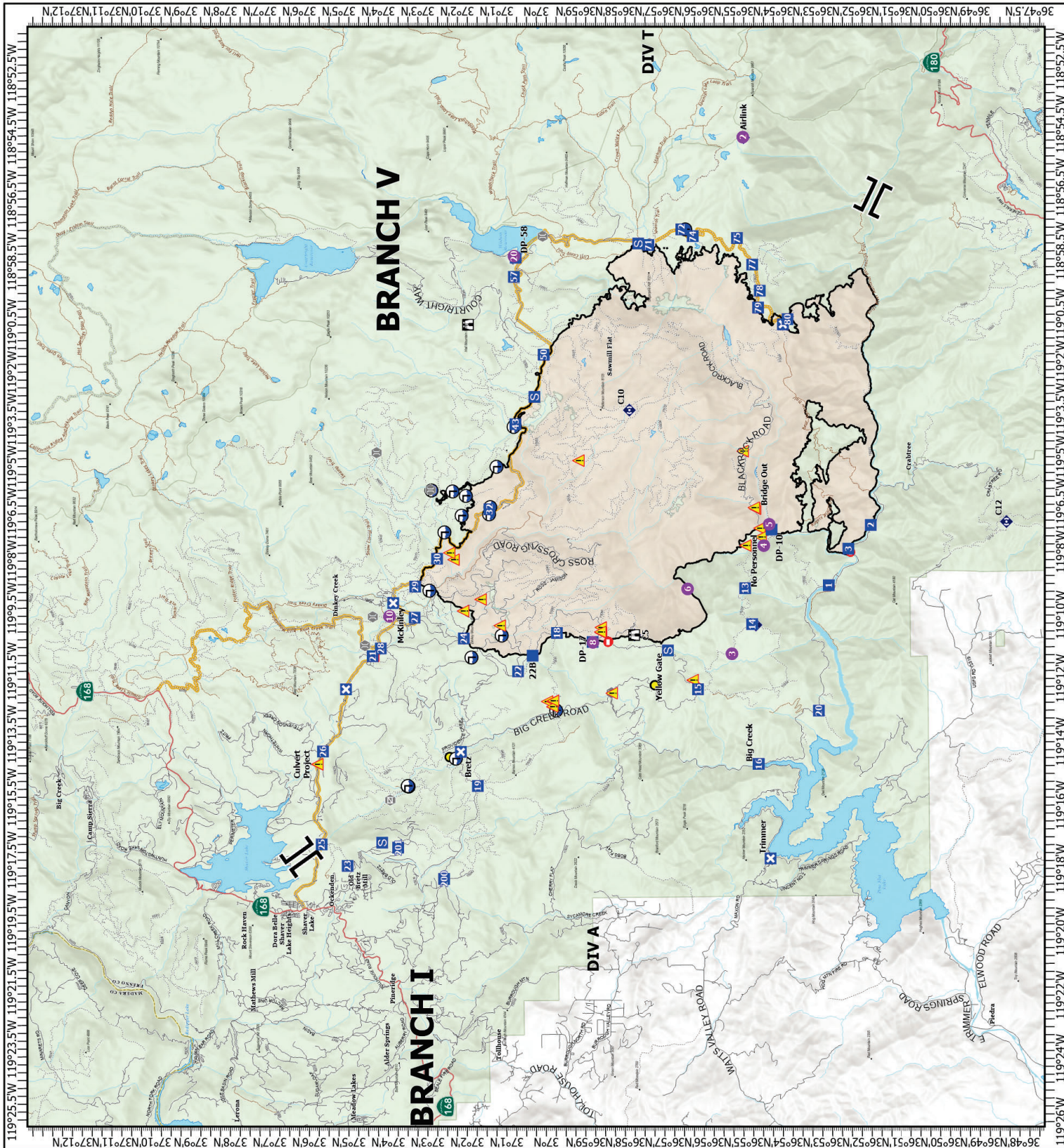

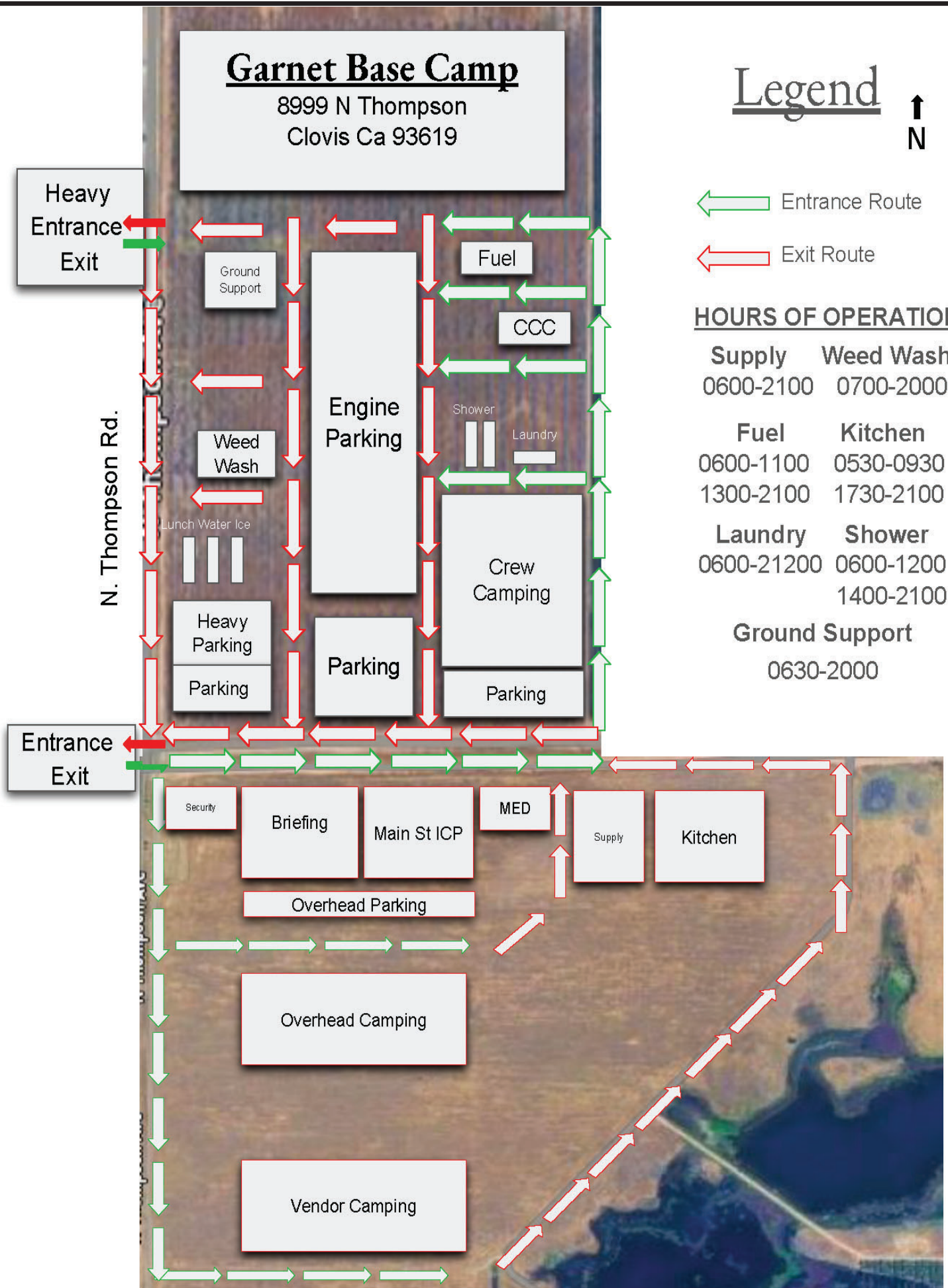
